Catawba Presbytery Called Meeting Union Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church Richburg, South Carolina December 13, 2004

Catawba Presbytery met for a called meeting at 7:00 p.m. on December 13, 2004 at the Union Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, Richburg, South Carolina. The Moderator, W. T. Clary, called the meeting to order and began with prayer.

The Stated Clerk, Guy H. Smith, constituted the roll from the enrollment cards. [Appendix A] A quorum was present. Visitors were welcomed.

The Reading Clerk, Mark E. Ross, read the purpose of the meeting as follows:

- To approve a call from the Clover Church for an associate pastor and any other matters relating to that call.
- To examine a candidate for the Hope Church, and if the way is clear, receive him into the Presbytery, approve his call from the Hope Church and any other matters relating to that call.

The report of the Commission on the Minister and His Work was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

REPORT OF THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK COMMISSION December 13, 2004

Since the last meeting of Presbytery the Commission met on November 18, 2004, in order to discuss several items of business.

Items:

- **A.** The Commission examined a Call from the Clover A.R.P. Church to Mr. Evan English as an Associate Pastor. The Call was found to be in order, and the Commission authorized the search committee to request the Session to call a Congregational Meeting. Mr. English was elected as Pastor at a Congregational Meeting on November 28, 2004.
- **B.** The Commission examined a Call from the Hope Presbyterian Church to Rev. John Uhl as Pastor. The Call was found to be in order. The Commission met with Mr. Uhl, and examined him for transfer from the E.P.C. Mr. Uhl's examination was approved, and the search committee was authorized to request the Session to call a Congregational Meeting. Mr. Uhl was elected as Pastor at a Congregational Meeting on November 28, 2004.

Recommendations

- 1. That the Call from the Clover A.R.P. Church to Mr. Evan English as an Associate Pastor be read, and if approved, that the date and time of a Called Meeting of Presbytery be set to conduct an Ordination and Installation Service at the Clover Church, and that the Call be presented to Mr. English at this Service.
- 2. That Rev. John Uhl be examined and approved for transfer from the E.P.C., and that the Call be presented to him, and that his name be entered on the roll of Presbytery upon receipt of his transfer, and that a service of installation be conducted at the Hope Presbyterian Church, with the approval of the Commission Chairman.

The call from the Clover Church for Mr. Evan English as Associate Pastor was read and approved with the following terms:

- 1. Total compensation of \$33,800 that includes:
 - a. Base Salary \$24,200
 - b. Housing allowance \$ 6,000 \$ 3,600
 - Travel allowance c.
 - Pay your moving expenses.

- 3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod.
- 4. Pay 100% of Synod's life, and health, and dental insurance package for the pastor and his family.
- 5. One week to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings.
- 6. One week and expenses for continuing education.
- 7. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the congregation shall provide cost of living adjustments based on the amount provided by Synod's Director of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Center..
- 8. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.
- 9. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
- 10. Cell Phone provided.
- 11. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
 - To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting а commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
- In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise: 12.
 - To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and а group insurance for a minimum of three months.

The call will be presented to Mr. English at the time of his ordination.

The Commission presented Mr. John Wilder Uhl, a member of the Central South Presbytery, EPC, as a candidate for the Hope Church in Opelousas, Louisiana. William R. Roberts, Chairman of the Commission, conducted the examination of Mr. Uhl. The examination was sustained and Mr. Uhl was enrolled pending receipt of his transfer from Central South Presbytery, EPC.

The call from the Hope Church for Mr. Uhl was read and approved with the following terms:

When a manse is provided:

a. Base Salary

- \$33,000
- Provide you with free use of the manse with utilities and insurance coverage, b commonly called tenant homeowners, in an amount of not less than \$40,000 or an amount equal to the actual replacement value of the minister's owned contents. \$ 2,000
- Travel allowance C.
- 2. Pay your moving expenses.
- 3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod.
- 4 Pay 100% of Synod's life and health for the pastor and his family. The pastor waives dental coverage under Synod's group policy. Dental coverage for the pastor and family will be provided by Dr. Al Huguet.
- One week to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings. 5.
- One week and expenses for continuing education. 6.
- Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the 7. congregation shall provide cost of living adjustments based on the amount provided by Synod's Director of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Center.
- 8. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.

- 9. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
- 10. Cell Phone provided.
- 11. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
 - b. If you are residing in the manse, and during the month following the terms outlined above, to assist you in relocating and to contribute a minimum of up to one month's base salary toward your relocation expenses.
- 12. In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise:
 - b. If you are residing in the manse, and during the month following the terms outlined above, to assist your family in relocating and/or contribute a minimum of up to one month's base salary toward your relocation expenses

The call was presented to Mr. Uhl. He will be installed following receipt of his transfer.

Following announcements, the Moderator led the Presbytery in prayer.

The Presbytery adjourned after the benediction pronounced by David H. Lauten .

FROM THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND CHURCH EXTENSION

1. The Committee recommends that the following Vision Statement be adopted by Catawba Presbyterv

THE VISION OF CATAWBA PRESBYTERY

FOR THE EXTENSION OF GOD'S KINGDOM

THROUGH THE WORK OF CHURCH EXTENSION

For the glory of God, Catawba Presbytery seeks to advance His kingdom by planting churches within the bounds of our Presbytery. That a conservative, reformed witness to the gospel be heard throughout our bounds, that sinners come to faith, and become disciples of Jesus Christ, that His church be extended and God's praise declared, our Presbytery endeavors to be faithful to this great work.

To this end, the Church Extension Committee of Catawba Presbytery is entrusted with the responsibility of:

- Identifying suitable fields for new church development .
- Seeking men called to the work of church planting •
- Presenting for Presbytery approval a plan for each mission site

- Providing oversight for our mission works
- Reporting at stated meetings of Presbytery the status and progress of each work
- Raising funds for the planting and maintaining of mission churches
- 2. The committee recommends that the Church Extension Committee be instructed to make appropriate modifications in the section of the RULES OF PROCEDURE which deal with the work of Church Extension to assure so that there will be conformity to the Vision Statement. Any modifications shall be presented to the Presbytery for approval through the normal processes.

ACTION OF PRESBYTERY ON REFERRAL

An amendment was made to recommendation 1 to substitute the word "faithful" for the word "conservative."

A motion was made and ADOPTED to postpone items 1 & 2 and amendment to the Spring Meeting.

The Chairman of Church Extension, R. E. Patrick, reported that the Committee is continuing to work on the revisions to the Rules.

 Report from the Special Moderator's Committee on Internal Affairs. The Committee was charged with the following task: Scope: Examines the committees on Christian Education, Theological & Judicial Affairs, Senior Adult Ministry

There was no report from the Special Committee.

3. Report from the Long Creek Church on the bridge loan

Mr. Pepin reported that plans are continuing and that they will need to be out of the current facility in December.

4. Vote on the Overtures from Synod referred from the October meeting:

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO BOOK OF DISCIPLINE

Shall the *Book of Discipline*, Chapter III.6 and Chapter VII.5. be revised to read (changes are in bold face type):

"III.6: Jurisdiction over members ceases upon their expulsion. Original jurisdiction by the presbytery over ministers ceases upon their deposition and dismissal to a particular congregation."

"VII. 5: Deposition: the censure of deposition is to be announced in the Church by a member of the court. The censure of deposition passed on a pastor shall be publicly read to his congregation by a representative of the presbytery, who shall then declare the pulpit vacant. Only in rare cases of gross offense, the good of the offender and/or the Church may require that the offender, even though he confesses his sin and manifests repentance, be deposed from office. Except in such cases, deposition is to be preceded by suspension to give time for careful consideration before deposition is imposed. In the case of a pastor who confesses his sin and manifests repentance, and yet the presbytery moves to depose him, upon deposition his name shall be removed from the role of the presbytery and the presbytery shall dismiss him to a particular Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church or other Christian Church that will agree to receive him as a member and offer him spiritual care and pastoral oversight. The presbytery may recommend that the deposed minister, if he be under suspension from the Lord's Table, be received as a member by

the particular church under the censure of suspension (BOD V.A.8) until he gives such evidence of repentance as may warrant its repeal."

5. Report from Mark E. Ross on his meeting with Student Joseph Moore Mr. Ross reported that he had met with Mr. Moore. Mr. Ross is continuing to meet with Mr. Moore.

The report of the Stated Clerk/Administrator was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

REPORT OF THE STATED CLERK/ADMINISTRATOR

Information:

1. The Rules of Procedure [Article V, Section 3,e,8]states "Normally the Presbytery will provide a copy of the minutes to each minister, each clerk of session and each church." No mention is made of the method to provide the Rules. The Presbytery at the last meeting adopted a motion that the Clerk, at his discretion, may use email for minutes, notices and other correspondence. I have studied what it will mean to the Presbytery to use this method. The cost to the Presbytery for the last mailing was over \$650.00 of which \$477.234 was to mail the Minutes and Maze and the agenda cost was about \$180.00. Mailings at that cost for the three meetings become expensive, not considering future postage increases.

A questionnaire was sent to members of Presbytery to determine their feelings concerning a change to email correspondence. An overwhelming majority of those who responded felt that email we should use email where possible because of convenience, the cost involved, receiving information quickly and because of allowing the documents to be stored on a disc.

Those who do not have email would still receive the necessary information by mail. This would reduce the mailings to less that 20 people and churches. It is my plan to begin using the email as much as possible in order to create savings for the Presbytery and provide information quickly to those with email.

I want to express my thanks to those who responded to the email questionnaire and to Leland Beaudrot, our Communication Clerk, for his work in setting up the necessary programs to distribute the information to the Presbytery.

2. The transfer was received for Rev. John Uhl from Central South Presbytery, PCA on February 3, 2005. John was officially enrolled as a member of our Presbytery on that date.

3. Work is continuing among several committees to revise the Rules of Procedure. It is my hope that the process will be completed soon and a new addition can be printed.

4. Many of the yearly reports are in. A compilation of the information will be distributed at the Presbytery meeting so that the information can be forwarded to General Synod.

Recommendation:

- 1. That the report be received as information and printed in the Minutes.
- 2. That the Rules of Procedure be set aside for today's meeting to consider revisions to the Rules.
- 3. That the information compiled in the yearly reports from the Churches be approved and forwarded to General Synod. [APPENDIX C]

The report of the Committee on Church Extension was presented and RECEIVED AS INFORMATION as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION

The Church Extension Committee would like to thank the churches of Catawba Presbytery for participating in the Carpenter's Fellowship Campaign. The establishment of new churches within our bounds is one of the primary means whereby our Presbytery engages in the work of advancing the gospel. The offerings received from this Campaign go directly to our missions, and so are vital for the work of church planting. The Committee would especially like to thank Dr. Jim Barker for his enthusiastic leadership of this campaign. In a time when we desperately needed help, he was more than willing to put in long hours and see that our area dinners were well planned and well promoted. Thank you, Jim!

Your Committee has had a number of meetings since the last meeting of Presbytery, including an eight-hour meeting on a Saturday in February. Several issues have required much attention. Five of the seven missions of our Presbytery receive a financial supplement from ONA, and four of those five have fairly drastic scheduled reductions in that support level this year. The ONA support for three of those four actually ends at some point in 2005. Several of these missions have not seen the necessary increase of offerings within the mission to offset the loss of ONA funds. Seeing that all missions are adequately funded so that all financial obligations, including terms of call for ministers, are met is a challenge. Thankfully, the funds in the 2005 budget that were originally designated for the support of a full time Director are now available for use directly in the missions. It is our prayerful expectation that these funds, along with a strong Carpenter's Fellowship offering, will be sufficient to meet the needs for 2005.

Our financial situation has led your Committee to spend considerable time discussing evaluation of missions. A process for regular evaluation that will encourage and help our mission developers, and, where necessary, determine the viability of missions, is being developed. The committee feels that such evaluation is required if we are to be faithful stewards of the resources given for the work of Church Extension.

The Committee continues consideration of the mission statement and resulting changes to the Rules of Procedure received by referral from the Presbytery last year. Concern for the responsibilities entrusted to the Committee beyond church planting, such as evangelism and church renewal, has led to a slow and careful approach to study of the statement and Rules. The recent financial concerns within several missions have taken time from this important project. Another all day Saturday meeting is being planned to take care of this and other matters.

The Committee greatly appreciates the patience of the Presbytery as it seeks to bring a new sense of order and priority to the work of Church Extension. At times it seems progress has been made. Other times the evidence of how much is yet to be done is overwhelming. Please pray for our missions, mission developers, and the Committee on Church Extension.

Mr. Martin Taylor, Chairman of Commitment and Finance, spoke about Denominational Ministry.

Mr. Taylor moved to commend the Treasurer of Presbytery, Mr. T. C. S. Lever, for his dedicated work in behalf of the Presbytery. The motion was ADOPTED by a rising vote of thanks to Mr. Lever.

The report of the Commission on the Minister and His Work was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

#### **REPORT OF THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK COMMISSION**

The Commission met on February 3, 2005, at Centennial A.R.P. to discuss several items of business. **Items:** 

- **A.** The Commission met with representatives from the Session of Columbia First, in order to discuss their request to have Dr. John deWitt continue to serve as Senior Pastor, until a new Senior Pastor is found, elected by the congregation, and installed. At that time Dr. deWitt would submit his resignation and retire.
- **B.** The Commission examined and approved the Occasional Supply arrangements for Pleasant Hill, New Hope, First Lancaster, Faith, Carolina Covenant, Scots Kirk, and Unity.
- C. The Commission examined and approved the Stated Supply arrangements for First Hardeeville.
- **D.** The Commission examined the Laboring Out of Bounds Reports for 2004 for Jerry Berry, Frank Kik, Andrew Basham, James Aubey, and Michael Lashley and their request to continue to Labor Outside the Bounds of Presbytery for another year.
- **E.** The Commission discussed Matthew Eusey's request that his name be removed from the Rolls of Catawba Presbytery as a Student of Theology.
- F. The Commission discussed the report from the A.R.P. Center concerning churches that are delinquent in payments for the Insurance and Retirement Plans. The report indicates the following deficits: Rogers Memorial - Retirement Plan - 12/31/04 - \$4,822.30 - No contributions made during 2004. Good Shepherd - Retirement Plan - 12/31/2004 - \$5,306.12 Good Shepherd - Insurance Plan - 12/31/2004 - \$8,529.01 - Credit of \$2,399.42 for Hope Dutch Fork - Retirement Plan - 12/31/2004 - \$1,453.49 - Credit of \$414.81
  I.B.L. - Retirement Plan - 12/31/2004 - \$1,200.72 - Last payment in March 2004 Oak Ridge - Retirement Plan - 12/31/2004 - \$1202.18 Providence - Retirement Plan - 12/31/2004 - \$580.00
- G. The Commission discussed appointing mentors for Evan English, John Uhl, David Arthur, and Craig Wilkes.

- **H.** The Commission examined Joseph (Mack) Baroody, a member of the Mayesville Presbyterian Church, to come under care of Presbytery as a Student of Theology. He is presently a Middler at Erskine Seminary.
- I. The Commission has been made aware by the Synod office, that the Call to Rev. Doug Culver from Church Extension to be the Mission Developer at Hambersham, does not meet the requirements of our Retirement Plan. The Commission chairman has been in discussion with the Chairman of Church Extension concerning this legal problem. O.N.A. has informed the Church Extension Chairman that they will continue to fund the work at Hambersham if Rev. Culver became their Stated Supply.
- J. The Rev. Frank Van Dalen has requested that his Associate Pastoral relationship with the Long Creek Presbyterian Church be dissolved. At a Congregational Meeting on March 6, the congregation of Long Creek concurred in his request.
- **K.** The Commission approved the Occasional Supply arrangement between Lemira A.R.P. and Dan Rowton.
- L. Rev. Stephane Cobbert has requested, with Church Extension approval, that he and his family be allowed to opt out of Synod's Health Insurance Program, in order to be covered by his wife's group policy.
- M. Rev. Evan English and the Clover Session are requesting that his Call be amended in order to move money from his base salary into his housing allowance. The new terms would be: Base salary \$16,200; Housing Allowance \$14,000; Travel allowance \$3,600. All other aspects of the Call would remain the same.
- N. The Commission examined the Salary & Benefit Review for 2004, and found that 6 churches did not meet the Presbytery Minimum Salary Increase of 3% for their pastors or associate pastors. [APPENDIX D]
- **O.** The Commission discussed Rev. Richard Brown's Call not being fully met since August 2004. Rev. Brown has only been receiving _ of his salary since last August as well as the Mission being behind with his retirement payments. The Commission is aware that the Church Extension Committee is presently working on the situation.

#### **Information**

At the present time we have nine vacant churches, with four of the number actively searching for a new pastor. The vacant churches and their moderators are: Pleasant Hill, Rev. Dwight Pearson - moderator; First Hardeeville, Rev. Marion Canfield -moderator; Carolina Covenant, Rev. Jan Senneker - moderator; New Hope, Rev. Clyde McCants - moderator; First Lancaster, Rev. David Lauten - moderator; Faith, Rev. Neal Mathias - moderator; Unity, Rev. Dwight Pearson - moderator; Scots Kirk, Rev. John Rogers - moderator; Lemira, Rev. Brian Peake - moderator.

We presently have Michael J. Basie, Matthew S. Eusey, Brian Lewis Howard, Joseph S. Moore, Michael Stewart Moore, Christopher M. Parnell, Benjamin D. Smith and Steven V. Isbell. Joseph Moore and Brian Howard have both been examined, licensed, and are awaiting a Call. Stuart Moore has been called to active service by the military and is presently stationed in Columbia.

Three members of Presbytery - Lawrence E. Hamrick, Michael Yarman, and Michael A. Kelly - are presently serving as Chaplains in the military.

Rev. Scott Moore is presently serving as a Missionary with World Witness in Mexico.

At the present time we have Jerry Berry, Frank Kik, Andrew Basham, James Aubey, and Michael Lashley who are Laboring Outside the Bounds of Presbytery.

- **8.** That Presbytery's treasurer be instructed to pay to Synod , from Church Extension funds, \$1,200.72 for the back payments owed by I.B.L. and \$1,038.68 for back payments owed by Dutch Fork for Synod's Retirement Plan.
- **9.** That Oak Ridge and Providence be directed to pay to Synod the back payments they owe for Insurance and the Retirement plan by the June 7th meeting of Presbytery, or give Presbytery an explanation as to why it has not been done.
- **10.** That Joseph Baroody be received under the care of Presbytery as a Student of Theology, and that an appropriate service of reception be conducted.
- 11. That the Pastoral relationship between Rev. Doug Culver and the Hambersham Mission be dissolved.
- **12.** That the Associate Pastoral relationship between Rev. Frank Van Dalen and the Long Creek Presbyterian Church, be dissolved effective May 31, 2005.
- **13.** That the Working Agreement between Rev. Frank Van Dalen and the Board of World Witness with a beginning date of June 1, 2005, be read and approved, and that it be presented to him in place of an official Call.
- 14. That Rev. Stephane Cobbert and his family be allowed to opt out of Synod's Health Insurance Plan, in order to be covered by his wife's group plan.
- **15.** That the Call of Rev. Evan English be amended in order for him to move money from his Base Salary to his Housing Allowance.
- **16.** That Presbytery require Bethany, I.B.L., Long Creek, Providence, and Sharon to immediately bring their pastor's pay increase up to the 3% required presbytery minimum, or provide a written explanation as to why they have not, to Presbytery by the June 7 meeting.
- **17.** That Presbytery instruct the Church Extension Committee to immediately bring Rev. Richard Brown's Call into compliance by paying his missing salary from August 2004 through March 2005.

#### William R. Roberts, Chairman

Mr. Basie introduced Mr. Baroody and Mr. Isbell as candidates. Each gave a brief summary of their Christian journey. The Moderator conducted the Service of Recognition for them and instructed the Clerk to enroll them as candidates under care of the Presbytery.

The order of the day was called at 11:45 a.m. Commission member John E. Basie introduced Benjamin Smith, a Middler at Reformed Seminary in Charlotte, to preach his Middler sermon. Mr. Smith used as his scripture Romans 5:1-5. The Moderator thanked him for his message.

A motion was made and ADOPTED to approve the sermons of the students as specimens of their progress.

Mr. Ross spoke on the revisions to the Book of Worship underway at Synod. He explained the manner in which the revisions will be presented.

Mr. Putnam proposed that the Moderator appoint an ad hoc committee to consider the revisions. The motion was ADOPTED.

The Presbytery recessed at 12:15 p. m. for lunch prepared by the Rowan Church. Philip McCoy, pastor of the Rowan Church, gave thanks for the meal.

The Presbytery reconvened at 1:00 p.m.

The report of the State of the Church Committee was presented and amended as follows:

#### **REPORT OF THE STATE OF THE CHURCH COMMITTEE**

The Committee met during the morning session of the 2004 Fall meeting of Catawba Presbytery on October 12 to review Sessional records and then on October 19 and January 11 at Bethel ARP Church. Since this Committee understands itself to be responsible to review Sessional records with a pastoral concern for the health of those congregations as well as the quality of their maintenance of records, we found said review of the minutes of 16 churches took almost 2 hours. At this Spring meeting we may have almost twice that number and will normally have about 24 session books. The Committee takes this part of our responsibility seriously, but since members serve for a 3-year term, that could require the same pastors and sometimes elder-delegates to miss extensive amounts of the deliberations of the presbytery over several vears. In order to resolve this conflict, the Committee has a recommendation to change the Manual of Procedure to allow for copies of the minutes to be submitted for review prior to the stated meetings of presbytery with the originals then to be stamped and signed as is our current procedure. [See Rec. 1.] The Committee has approved 3 proposed changes to the current "Sessional Record Check-list." Once presbytery has considered these proposed changes, the Committee plans to send out a "template" or suggested format for keeping Minutes of Session reflecting the current checklist. While use of that format would be entirely voluntary, it would greatly assist our annual review process. [See Rec. 2-4.] The Committee is currently reviewing the attendance records for recent stated meetings of presbytery to determine whether or not churches are being represented. The Committee plans to work to encourage greater participation where sessions have not had elder representation at least two stated meetings per year. We have no recommendations on this issue at this time.

As part of the Committee's responsibility to "maintain and develop a list of resources ... for the care of pastors and their families" we plan to distribute a survey by email or postal mail to each minister, clerk of session, and diaconate chairman by the middle of February in order to gather input as to needs and potential resources. We will report more on this process at a later date. (As a reminder, please note: A joint ARP/EPC Ministers' Retreat, with Dr. Steve Brown as the speaker, has been planned for September 19-20 at Bonclarken. You would be wise to register early.)

Members of the Committee have been actively seeking to reach out in a pastoral manner to a number of our pastors, and several churches, who are in challenging circumstances. These contacts are for the purpose of spiritual encouragement and maintain appropriate confidentiality, while avoiding issues that come under the oversight of the Commission.

As this report was due for distribution at the same time the annual reports to presbytery and synod were being submitted, our tabulation of that date will be distributed at the Spring meeting of presbytery as a supplemental report.

#### **APPENDIX B**

#### CPU PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO CATAWBA PRESBYTERY MARCH 8, 2005

Greetings from the Catawba Presbyterial Union Women of the Church.

I consider it an honor to be here today, and I am happy to have the opportunity to tell you a little about the work of the Women of the Church.

This report involves two parts:

First, I'll share a few figures with you and mention some things we are now doing, and then I'll talk about some significant changes at the Synodical level.

Last September, about 30 churches in Catawba Presbytery submitted end of the year statistical reports relating to the Women of the Church work. Those reports indicated a total active membership of 1210 ladies in our Women of the Church organizations. This number is down a little bit from the previous year. We hope that is because several churches failed to send in reports rather than an actual decrease in numbers.

While we continue to work to grow in numbers, our ladies are also faithfully demonstrating their commitment to service through their financial support. The end of the year financial report showed that our total Presbyterial receipts were just over \$90,000.00 for the 2003-2004 year. Less than \$800.00 of this was used for Presbyterial expenses, and the remainder of those contributions were used to meet financial commitments to denominational agencies and causes.

One of the major projects of our denomination's women is the partial support of two of our lady missionaries. Last year, Catawba Presbyterial contributed \$14,548 to this cause through the Jubilee Birthday offerings. Other areas such as Outreach North America, Bonclarken, Camp Joy, Erskine College, World Witness,

Covenant Discipleship, and the Family Bible Conference also benefit from these funds. Keep in mind that those contributions are in addition to the financial support these same ladies provide through our individual church budgets.

But our Women of the Church organization is certainly not just about money. One of our primary goals is to learn more about God's word through organized Bible Study. Each year the Woman's Synodical Union recommends a specific Bible Study book, and this year Circles and small groups throughout the Presbytery are focusing on Dr. Sinclair Ferguson's book, <u>Let's Study Philippians</u>.

Our theme verse is Philippians 4:8 -

"Finally, brother, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things."

One of our goals is to put those words into action as we respond to needs within our respective congregations. We continue to provide such services as preparing condolence meals and hosting showers for young parents-to-be in our churches as well as showers for Bethany Christian Services, an agency which provides support to unwed mothers and adoptive parents.

We certainly do grow through Christian fellowship with each other, but we also

appreciate the opportunity to serve on committees and to participate in various areas of work in both our local congregations and at the Presbytery level.

Looking to the future, there are some exciting organizational changes under way for the Women of the Church, particularly at the Synodical level. These changes were voted on and approved at the Annual Presbyterial Meetings held last August. Probably the most obvious innovation is a name change. Beginning September 1, 2005, the Woman's Synodical Union will officially become The ARP Women's Ministries.

We believe the new name more accurately reflects what our organization is about. And what we are about is quite aptly described in our new Vision Statement which says, "The ARP Women's Ministries is an organization which encourages and equips the community of ARP women to work together for God's glory and purpose."

Another step in the process of restructuring the umbrella organization of women's work at the denominational level is the creation of a position called Administrator for ARP Women's Ministries. This person would be under the direction of the Women's Ministries Board and would be responsible for training and equipping ARP women at all levels to minister together for God's glory and purpose.

There are other changes related to some of the committees and department chairmen the Woman's Synodical Union has had in to past. Do keep in mind that these changes are at the Synodical level. Presbyterials and local WOC's are not required to change their structure, though some will certainly choose to do so.

Also, none of this, except the name change, will happen immediately. We are now in the middle year of a three year transition period during which some of the details will be worked out. It has been said that the only time we like change is when it is happening to someone else. That may describe the feelings some of us will have as we go through the next two years. Therefore, we earnestly ask for your prayers, patience, and support as we adapt to new ways of doing things.

I think it was Yogi Berra who said, "You can't build a good reputation on what you plan to do in the future." So, before I sit down, let me tell you about a very recent Catawba Presbyterial Union event that turned out quite well. On February 18 & 19, 215 ladies from all over Catawba Presbytery gathered at Bonclarken for a

Women's Retreat. We enjoyed music, fellowship, good food and we listened to Sue Jakes, a noted author and speaker. I believe we came away inspired and energized to serve the Lord more effectively in our homes, our congregations, and our communities.

This is indeed an exciting time to be involved in Women's work in the ARP denomination. I ask for your prayers for our women –

specifically for the Family Bible Conference, which we co-sponsor with Synod. It is scheduled to begin on July 25, 2005 at Bonclarken and for the Catawba Presbyterial Annual Meeting which will convene at Shiloh Church on August 20, 2005

I thank you for supporting our work so faithfully and for giving me the opportunity to speak to you today.
