# Catawba Presbytery Stated Meeting Unity Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church Lancaster, SC October 14, 2008 10:00 a.m.

Catawba Presbytery met on October 14, 2008 at the Unity Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, Lancaster, SC. The Moderator, David H. Mitchell, Jr., called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. Following the singing of "Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God, Almighty!" Mr. Mitchell constituted the meeting with prayer.

David H. Lauten, Chairman of the Commission, introduced Christopher M. Parnell, a graduate of Erskine Theological Seminary. Mr. Parnell preaching his senior sermon for licensure and ordination using as his scripture Romans 3:21-31. The Moderator thanked him for his message.

L. Charles Hammond, pastor of the Unity Church, conducted the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. He was assisted by elders from Unity,

Guy H. Smith, Stated Clerk, constituted the roll from the enrollment cards. A quorum was declared present. Visitors were encouraged to register on the appropriate card.

Visitors were introduced and welcomed to the meeting.

The Moderator introduced the Moderator of General Synod, Gordon Query. Mr. Query brought greetings from Synod and spoke to the Presbytery concerning his theme "The Indispensible Word" and its importance to our churches and our lives. He also challenged the Presbytery and individuals to be readers of God's Word daily.

Mr. David Galletta, missionary with World Witness, spoke to the Presbytery. Mr. Galletta spoke about the work of the Mobile Theological Training Team and how they attempt to train nationals in their own countries.

Unfinished business was considered. Guy H. Smith, Stated Clerk, stated that the matters of unfinished business would be reported in the various reports to the Presbytery.

The Report of the Committee on Church Extension was presented early because some members of the Committee had to leave the meeting.

The report and the supplemental report of the Committee on Church Extension was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

#### REPORT OF THE CHURCH EXTENSION COMMITTEE

The Church Extension Committee met in July and August. The Committee heard reports on the progress of the Indian Land and Mt. Pleasant works, as well as discussing plans for future missions.

The Indian Land exploratory work is going well. Rev. Gary Stiltner has organized two Bible studies, one for seekers and one for discipleship. He is developing a mission plan to be presented later.

The Mt. Pleasant mission is looking forward to organizing by the end of this year. They are in elder training, and will shortly be petitioning Presbytery for organization.

The Committee is also pleased to report that there have been two churches that have indicated their willingness to daughter missions, one in the Columbia area and one in the Rock Hill area.

The Committee also received a request from Jan Sattem and Bill Fitzhenry to use Dr. Fitzhenry as a liaison in Texas with groups or individuals interested in beginning new A. R. P. works in the Texas and Louisiana area. The presbytery committee will reimburse Dr. Fitzhenry up to the sum of one thousand dollars. It is hoped that this may expedite the planting of new churches and expedite the formation of a Louisiana-Texas Presbytery. The Committee approved this request.

The Committee also discussed the matter of the renewal of struggling churches. The Committee believes that churches should avail themselves of denominational opportunities for renewal, such as the "Turn Out" seminars offered by Rev. Ken Priddy.

The Committee makes the following recommendations:

- 1. That all motions of the Church Extension Committee be sustained.
- 2. That churches be encouraged to participate in renewal events of the denomination.
- 3. That larger churches prayerfully consider in their long-range plans the planting of one or more daughter churches in nearby areas.

Alan Avera, Director of Outreach North America, was introduced and spoke briefly about the Parenting Conference for Churches to be held in Rock Hill on October 30. Members of Presbytery were encouraged to attend.

The supplemental Report of the Committee on Church Extension was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

#### SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT OF THE CHURCH EXTENSION COMMITTEE

The Committee on Church Extension met on September 22, 2008 and in conference call on October 2, 2008, to consider the following items:

- 1. Rev. Gary Stiltner gave a preliminary report on the Indian Land project. Rev. Stiltner is involved in two Bible studies in the area and has begun to attract core members to the church. While the plan for the Indian Land mission is still in formation, Rev. Stiltner presented the Committee a draft as a work in progress. The vision statement and the financial statement are included for information.
- 2. The Committee is recommending to Synod's Board of Outreach North America to extend for one more year the request made from the Living Waters Church for money from the

- revolving loan fund of \$35,000 for property. This money was set aside last year, but has not yet been needed by the Church, so we are requesting it be set aside one more year.
- 3. The Committee heard a report from the Providence Mission recommending the organization of the Providence Church.

The Committee therefore recommends the following:

The Providence mission be organized as a particular church in early 2009, after completion of officer training and when suitable arrangements can be made.

An amendment was made and ADOPTED to empower the Committee on Nominations to fill the Assistant Director of Children's Ministries vacancy.

The report and the supplemental report of the Committee on Outreach were presented as follows:

#### REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON OUTREACH

This is the first report from Catawba Presbytery's newest committee. The Committee on Nominations secured members of presbytery who were willing to serve on this committee. I am sure the report from the Committee on Nominations will include these committee members.

We were not able to have our first meeting until August 26, 2008. We surveyed the many matters that flood to the forefront in a startup such as this. In a time such as this there are mixed emotions: "Why me Lord?" and "What an incredible opportunity!" I am pleased with the make up of the committee and from our first meeting I know the latter emotion prevails overwhelmingly!

In the recommendations below, our objective is to establish basic legal matters to affect an efficient transfer of IBL from one jurisdiction (Committee on Church Extension) to the jurisdiction of the Committee on Outreach with the least amount of disruption of this ministry.

Other matters relating to this ministry will be dealt with diligently and efficiently as quickly as possible and brought before Catawba Presbytery for the necessary action.

The matter of a contract for Rev. Diaz is being drawn up by this Committee with the help of Mr. Ken Wingate, attorney. We will give a report on this matter at the October 14 meeting.

The task before us is more than from the "minds of men". We believe without reservation that God will walk before us and lead us (both as Committee and as a Presbytery) to use a "work He started" to even more glorious ministry for His own glory and for the salvation of His chosen people!

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- 1. As pertains to IBL, that the following actions be approved:
  - a. Dissolve IBL as a mission effective October 14, 2008.
  - b. That the Committee on Outreach assume oversight of IBL effective October 14, 2008.
  - c. Continue the salary and benefits of Rev. J. J. Diaz through December 31, 2008, and since this committee will have little opportunity to have in place a financing program by January 1, 2009, that this same level of support be **available** from the Committee on Church Extension or Presbytery through June 30, 2009.
- 2. That the Gregg Street property be placed under the oversight of the Outreach Committee. (This committee will then have the authority to begin the implementation of item number 5 (amendment presented by the Stated Clerk, on page 10, Catawba Presbytery Minutes, 2007-08, Volume 3.)
- 3. That the requirement of item number 4 (on page 10, Catawba Presbytery Minutes, 2007-08, Volume 3.) be waived at this meeting. (This item will be addressed and reported to presbytery as each of these matters is studied and fleshed out for approval.)
- 4. That this committee be given permission to present additional items, if available, at the October 14 Presbytery meeting.

#### REVISED REPORT FROM THE COMMITTEE ON OUTREACH

Pursuant to the recommendations of the Committee on Nominations, those members selected to serve on the Committee on Outreach have met in an effort to expedite the progress of this new committee.

You will receive our first report resulting from our first meeting on August 26, 2008. At our second meeting on October 2, 2008 we carefully reviewed that first report and determined several changes should be made.

#### **RECOMMENDATIONS:**

- 1. That 1. a. and b. in the original report be approved.
- 2. That recommendation 1. c. in the original report be revised to read as follows: "That the support for IBL continue at \$40,000.00 for 2009".
- 3. (For the understanding of those who were not present at the last meeting of Presbytery, the motion adopted that pertains to the Gregg Street property is as follows:

"That Committee On Outreach give prayerful consideration to the current building on Gregg Street and if the Committee determines it is in the best interest of the ministry to sell the building, and if the Presbytery approves, that the Trustees, according to the Rules of Procedure, be authorized to sell the building with the funds to be used toward the ministry of IBL.")

#### That recommendation 2 in our original report be adopted.

4. (For the understanding of those who were not present at the last meeting of Presbytery, the motion adopted that pertains to the Gregg Street property is as follows:

"That the Committee on Outreach present to the Presbytery at the Fall 2008 meeting a list of the Committee responsibilities, plans for financing this ministry at this time and future plans for the IBL ministry including any future financial responsibility that the Committee envisions the Presbytery may have.)

That recommendation 3 in our original report be replaced with the following:

"That the reporting date of 2008 be changed to 2009".

(Note: the committee has committed to meet at least monthly, including meetings with IBL, to achieve this goal.)

5. That recommendation 4 in the original report be adopted.

The recommendation was ADOPTED.

The Committee recommends that the Gregg Street property be placed under the oversight of the Outreach Committee. The recommendation was ADOPTED.

The Committee recommends that the date to report on responsibilities and financial plans be changed to 2009. The recommendation was ADOPTED.

The Committee recommends adoption of recommendation 4 of the original report that gives permission for the Committee to present additional items to the meeting of Presbytery.

The recommendation was ADOPTED.

The Committee on Outreach presented a contract for the services of J. J. Diaz to take effect on January 1, 2009 with the following terms:

### PASTORAL CONTRACT CATAWBA PRESBYTERY COMMITTEE ON OUTREACH

Catawba Presbytery of the General Synod of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, on behalf of the Committee on Outreach, being well satisfied with your ministerial qualifications, and confident that you are led by the Holy Spirit as one whose ministry will be profitable to the spiritual interest and the general welfare of the Hispanic Community in the greater Columbia area, do earnestly contract with you, Jose Juan Diaz to undertake pastoral work at Iglesia Biblica Latinoamericana.

The Committee on Outreach established by Catawba Presbytery will be responsible for the implementation and supervision of this contract.

The period of this contract shall be for two years beginning January 1, 2009. On the acceptance of this contract, we promise you in the discharge of your duty all proper support, encouragement and obedience in the Lord. For these services Catawba Presbytery through its Treasurer will:

- 1. Pay you the sum of \$32,806.00 annually payable in monthly installments.
- 2. Provide one hundred percent of Synod's health insurance, medical, dental, life and disability plan for you and your family. {Either party may opt out of health insurance if coverage is obtained by spouse.}
- 3. Reimburse you for all approved expenses commensurate with the duties of this employment.

Four weeks of vacation will be granted annually. An employment performance review will be held at the end of one year.

In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise to continue to continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this contract awaiting commencement of the benefits from Synod's insurance program.

In the event you should die during the terms of this contract, we promise to continue the provisions of this contract dealing with annual salary and group insurance for your family for a minimum of three months.

This contract is terminable at the will of either party upon a thirty [30] day notice.

The Presbytery and The Committee will offer prayer and all possible assistance in the performance of your duties.

The order of the day prevailed at 11:45 a.m. David H. Lauten, Commission Chairman, introduced Juan Carlos Bonilla, a graduate of Erskine Theological Seminary. Mr. Bonilla preached his sermon for licensure and ordination using as his scripture Matthew 28:16-20. The Moderator thanked him for his message.

The contract from the Presbytery through the Committee on Outreach was presented to J J. Diaz, and was accepted by him.

Presbytery recessed for lunch at 12:15 p.m. The blessing for the meal was given by Jim Mitchell.

Presbytery re-convened at 1:00 p.m. David H. Lauten, Chairman of the Commission, introduced Jonathan R. Williams, a Middler at RTS-Charlotte. Mr. Williams preached his Middler sermon using as his scripture Colossians 1:15-18.

Reports were continued.

The report of the Committee on Christian Education was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

#### REPORT OF THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Catawba Presbytery's Christian Education Committee met at 7:00 pm on September 4, 2008 at Chester ARP Church. Your committee received and examined various reports from the directors of the Presbytery's existing ministries, except the children's retreat. The reports from the spring 2008 children and middle school retreats were deferred to your committee's January meeting. The following statistical data was received as information and passed on to you for the same purpose.

- **High School Super Retreat (First, Second, and Catawba Presbyteries)** 12 churches in participation from Catawba Presbytery with an attendance numbered at 146 persons. The total attendance from all the presbyteries was 329.
- Fundamentals Conference (Education Workshop) 51 participants
- Senior Adult Retreat 13 churches with total attendance numbered at 118 persons.

Your Committee also received and approved the following reports from both the Middle and Senior High Retreat planning teams and pass them on to the Presbytery for approval.

- Middle School Retreat The fall retreat for Middle School students is schedule for November 7-9, 2008 at Bonclarken. Due to an untimely change in leadership, the plans for this retreat were not finalized at the time of your committee's meeting. Please see your committee's supplement report for more information regarding the fall 2008 retreat.
- **High School Retreat** The fall retreat for High School students is scheduled for September 26-28, 2008 at Bonclarken. Like the spring 2008 retreat, this retreat will be a Super Retreat held in conjunction with First and Second Presbyteries. Rev. Steve Snipes, Director of Music at Christ Presbyterian Church (ARP) in Bradenton, FL will speak on the theme of "The Sweet Life." Rev. Snipes' messages will be evangelistically driven. The praise team from Erskine College's Barn Ministry will lead in worship. The cost is \$70 per student.

The report of the Commission on the Old Brick Church was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

#### REPORT OF THE COMMISSION OF THE OLD BRICK CHURCH

The last meeting of the Commission was June 5, 2008. Below is a list of the items discussed and decisions made.

#### Items:

A. It was suggested that meetings be planned and held at the Old Brick Church at least every three years. The Commission encourages the denomination to also promote the use of the church and grounds among affiliated groups for other gatherings and meetings.

- B. The grant for needs assessment and preservation planning from the S.C. Department of Archives and History was approved.
- C. The Commission approved entering into a contract with the Chicora Foundation, Inc. for a penetrometer study and mapping of the graveyard at a cost of \$4900.00.
- D. The Commission discussed meeting with a contractor about repair of the wall around the cemetery and the possible demolition and removal of the old caretaker's cottage that is beyond repair.
- E. Other items of discussion included insurance, security options, grounds maintenance, the possibility of forming a cemetery association, and the property adjacent to the cemetery.

The next meeting of the Commission is scheduled for Thursday, September 11, 2008 at 5:30 PM at the Old Brick Church.

The report of the Committee on the State of the Church was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

#### REPORT OF THE STATE OF THE CHURCH COMMITTEE

The Committee met Thursday evening, August 21, 2008. We studied the general surveys that were given out at the Presbytery meeting in June. Out of approximately 40 that were given out to all congregations, 6 were returned. We thank the clerks of those congregations who took the time to fill the surveys out and return them to us. From this survey, we found that the idea of having a vice-clerk, or one who is as capable of taking minutes and reproducing them in case the clerk isn't available at session meetings, might be beneficial. More importantly, and this should be done by individual congregations, having as many of the responsibilities of the clerk beyond what is expected at session meetings, might be of benefit as well. Clerks are often times called upon to undertake many tasks within the church's life. Many times clerks are not prepared for those tasks. Those seemed to be the main concerns.

We continue to study the idea of a coaching/mentoring /pastoral care program for the Presbytery. The Minister and His Work Commission has given the State of the Church Committee a report handed down by the Synod to explore the idea of aiding newly ordained ministers and ministers new to the presbytery, and of how we might be of benefit to them. There are coaching programs, for instance, that ministers, young and old, could gain feedback that would help them to be more effective pastors, preachers and ministers. To that end, we would look for potential coaches to go through a certification process to implement this program. There will be more on this report in the meetings ahead as we continue to look for ways to make the minister as effective in his job and in his life outside the church as is possible.

We have looked at the 2007 congregational reports and have concluded that we as the Catawba Presbytery need to initiate a communication, either by letter(e-mail where possible), by phone call or both in order to encourage all congregations to have representation at every Presbytery meeting. Understanding that not all congregations have full time pastors, it would be important to not only mail a note to each clerk, but then perhaps having a network of volunteers to call each clerk of session, one to two weeks before each Presbytery meeting, reminding them of the meeting. Obviously, this would pertain to congregations whose representation at meetings in the recent past has been sporadic. We would suggest that after missing two meetings, they be put on this call list. If their absence continues, it would perhaps be advisable to have a representative from the Minister and His Work Commission to contact the congregation. If it is necessary, a call or visit from the Presbytery moderator might be in order. As in church discipline, we want to encourage not discourage. We want to unite, not separate.

We as a committee continue to pray for congregations, pastors and the families, and students of theology who need our prayers. Please make us aware of anyone you may know that needs our attention. Recommendations:

- 1. That the Presbytery give consideration to implementing this program of communications for congregations that are not being represented at regularly scheduled Presbytery meetings.
- 2. That the State of the Church Committee be allowed to further investigate the possible need for the creation of a coaching/mentoring/pastoral care program for future consideration by the Presbytery.
- 3. That we as a Committee and in turn, as the Catawba Presbytery, encourage each session to create a guide to assist clerks in further understanding their responsibilities.

The report of the Committee on Commitment and Finance was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

#### REPORT OF COMMITMENT AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

The Commitment and Finance Committee met on August 26, 2008 in order to prepare a proposed budget for Catawba Presbytery for 2009. The proposed budget was prepared based upon the latest number available for active members within the Presbytery – 7,697 members.

This budget was also prepared while IBL was still a ministry of Church Extension. Should Presbytery make some change in the status of IBL, the budget can be amended to reflect that change, if needed.

Presbytery should also note that while the Commission of the Old Brick Church has made a significant budget request, a major portion of their request involves a Historic Preservation Grant. As previously reported in the October 9, 2007 Minutes of the Fall Stated Meeting, \$5,000 was set aside for acquiring a matching \$5,000 grant. Since this is a one-time expense, your Committee felt this was a legitimate request, and would aid the commission with their work.

**Recommendation:** That the proposed budget for 2009 be approved.

#### SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT OF THE COMMISSION OF THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK

The Commission met with Andrew Shoger who is a member of the First Rock Hill ARP Church and approved by the Session to come under Care as a Student of Theology and a Candidate for the Ministry.

The Commission met with representatives of the Sharon Session who presented a Stated Supply arrangement to Rev. James D. McLurkin, currently a member of First Presbytery who resides in Sharon. Mr. McLurkin also requests to transfer into Catawba Presbytery. The Commission examined Rev. McLurkin who takes no exception to the Standards of the ARP Church.

The Commission met with representatives of World Witness who presented a call to Juan Carlos Bonilla to serve as the Short-Term Mission Coordinator of World Witness. The Commission also met with Juan Carlos who accepted the terms of the call which meet the minimum requirements of the Presbytery.

#### Additional Recommendations:

- 4. That Mr. Andrew Shoger be presented to the Presbytery as a prospective Student of Theology.
- 5. That Mr. Shoger be received as a Student of Theology and that the Moderator of Presbytery oversee the reception of Mr. Shoger.
- 6. That. Rev. James D. McLurkin be examined for transfer into Catawba Presbytery and that if the way be clear his name be enrolled as a member of Catawba Presbytery on receipt of his transfer.
- 7. That Rev. McLurkin be approved to serve as Stated Supply of the Sharon ARP Church and Moderator of the Sharon Session.
- 8. That the call to Juan Carols Bonilla as Short-Term Missions Coordinator of World Witness be read and approved, that plans for his ordination to the gospel ministry be arranged with the chairman of the Commission of the Minister and His Work and that his call be presented to him at the time of his ordination.

Mr. Lauten, Chairman of the Commission, examined Christopher Parnell and Juan Carlos Bonilla before the Presbytery. After an opportunity for questions from the Presbytery, the examination was APPROVED.

The call for Mr. Bonilla was read and APPROVED with the following terms:

- 2. Pay your moving expenses.
- 3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod.
- 4. Pay 100% of Synod's life, and health, and dental insurance package for the pastor and his family.
- 5. Two weeks to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings.
- 6. One week and expenses for continuing education.
- 7. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the congregation shall provide cost of living adjustments based on the amount provided by Synod's Director of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Center..
- 8. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.
- 9. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.

- 10. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
  - a. To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
- 11. In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise:
  - a. To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for a minimum of three months.

The call will be presented to Mr. Bonilla at the time of his ordination.

The Moderator conducted the Service of Recognition for Mr. Andrew F. Shoger who has been approved as a candidate. A prayer was offered by his pastor, J. Barry Dagenhart.

Mr. James D. McLurkin, who was ordained by our Presbytery, was examined for reception by letter of transfer from First Presbytery. The examination was APPROVED and Mr. McLurkin was welcomed into membership of the Presbytery.

The supplemental report of the Committee on the State of the Church was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

#### SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT OF THE STATE OF THE CHURCH COMMITTEE

Your Committee received 25 session record books for review, including 4 not on hand at the spring meeting.

[Rules of Procedure, pp. 38-39]; and WHEREAS this rule as the actual or potential effect of adverse effect of adverse impact on the financial affairs of churches within Presbytery; THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Catawba Presbytery does hereby amend the Rules of Presbytery [Article IX, F, Appendix A, sec 2, h (7)] to delete the text: "As part of the annual review the congregation shall provide a cost of living adjustment to the previous year's base salary. The cost of living adjustment provided by the Director of Synod's Office will be the standard measure. If for any reason the congregation thinks it cannot, or should not, meet this minimum requirement, then the Session will consult with the Commission on the Minister and His Work to determine available alternatives for courses of action to be taken. The Commission shall report its decision to the Presbytery."

Adopted by the Session 24 August 2008.

A motion was made and ADOPTED that the Memorial from the Centennial Session be referred to the Commission on the Minister and His Work to their study and recommendations.
