Catawba Presbytery met at First Presbyterian ARP Church in Columbia, SC at 10:00 a.m. on October 8, 2013. Moderator J. Barry Dagenhart called the meeting to order. After the singing of "The Lord's My Shepherd, I'll Not Want" from The Trinity Hymnal, Mr. Dagenhart constituted the meeting with prayer.

Mr. Kyle Sims, a member of the Commission, introduced Mr. Thomas L. Wilson, Jr. to preach his Middler sermon. Mr. Wilson used as his scripture John 3:9-17. The Moderator thanked him for his message.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper was conducted by the host pastor Derek W. H. Thomas assisted by members of the Session from First Columbia.

Elder David Van De Water from First Columbia welcomed the members of Presbytery and gave instructions for the day.

Stated Clerk Guy H. Smith, Jr. moved the adoption of the Minutes from the May 19, 2013 Called meeting and the June 11, 2013 Stated meeting of the Presbytery. The motion was ADOPTED.

The Stated Clerk constituted the roll from the enrollment cards. A quorum was declared present.

The Moderator welcomed visitors to the meeting. Several were introduced. Dr. James Meeks, new dean of Erskine Seminary was introduced and spoke briefly.

Matters of unfinished business were considered.

REPORT OF THE AD HOC COMMITTEE ON PLEASANT HILL

The Committee is pleased to report that we have an offer pending on the Pleasant Hill property. It is our hope to have more detail available at the meeting of Presbytery.

Mr. Maloney gave a further explanation stating that a number have expressed interest in the property but the problem is that banks require 50% down and many are having trouble meeting that down payment. He reported that the Committee will continue to market the property.

The Call for William J. Larkin as approved by the Commission was read as follows for information:

Erskine Theological Seminary does promise and obligate ourselves beginning July 1, 2013 to:

1. A basic compensation total of \$52,000 issued on a monthly basis, which includes the following:
 - a. A housing allowance.
 - b. A monthly amount for FICA.
 - c. A monthly contribution toward TIAA/CREF retirement and benefits program, **or equivalent**, subject to eligibility requirements.
2. A monthly contribution toward the cost of insurance benefit programs (life insurance,

- health insurance, dental insurance, disability insurance), subject to eligibility requirements. Coverage and premiums are reviewed on a regular basis and may be subject to change.
3. Review with you annually the terms of this call.

The Call from First Columbia for Derek W. H. Thomas as approved by the Commission was read for information as follows:

That you may devote yourself **wholly** to the Ministry of the Word as you begin your ministry on the 11th day of August, 2013, we promise and obligate ourselves to:

1. Basic compensation
 - a. Base Salary and Housing Allowance \$181,000
 - b. Travel Allowance \$ 5,000
2. Pay your moving expenses.
3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan Fund as prescribed by the General Synod.
4. Provide Synod's life, and health, and dental, insurance package for you and your family.
5. The Church provides the cost of Life, Long Term Disability and Accidental Death coverage provided by and as required by the General Synod.
6. One week[s] to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings.
7. One week and expenses for continuing education
8. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the congregation shall be encouraged to consider an increase to the previous year's base compensation.
9. Grant you an annual vacation of six weeks.
10. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
11. Other [List each item]
 - a. Study and Writing leave of 2 weeks.
12. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise to continue **for a minimum of three months** the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
13. In the event you should die during the terms of this call, we promise to continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for your immediate family **for a minimum of three months.**

At the last meeting of Presbytery two provisional elders were appointed to work with the one remaining elder at New Hope. Clint Davis, Moderator of the Session at New Hope gave an update on the situation at New Hope. Mr. Davis said plans were underway to involve the Committee on the State of the Church.

The Moderator introduced Mr. Steve Nichols, Director of the ARP Foundation. Mr. Nichols spoke briefly of the work of the Foundation and encouraged members of Presbytery to contact him to see how he might assist local churches.

The order of the day prevailed. Mr. Kyle Sims, a member of the Commission, introduced Mr. Dariusz Brycko to preach his Middler sermon. Mr. Brycko used as his scripture Numbers 20:1-18. The Moderator thanked him for this message.

New business was considered.

The report of the Stated Clerk/Administrator was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

REPORT OF THE STATED CLERK/ADMINISTRATOR

Items:

1. At the direction of the Chairman of the Commission a transfer was issued to Virginia Presbytery for Rev. Stephen Laughridge effective July 1, 2013.
2. Acting on the authority granted by Presbytery at its June 11, 2013 meeting, the Commission reported they had officially received William J. Larkin by transfer from Palmetto Presbytery on July 1, 2013 and approved his call as Visiting Professor of New Testament and Missions at Erskine Seminary.
3. Rev. James C. Barker died July 27, 2013 in Columbia, SC. A tribute was prepared by Rev. J. Allen Derrick and will be forwarded to the General Synod. {APPENDIX B}.
4. Members of the Presbytery are reminded to study the Book of Discipline as distributed at the meeting of the General Synod and to send any responses by October 31, 2013 to revisebod@arpsynod.org.
5. In accord with the Rules of Procedure, the Executive Committee is permitted to act in behalf of Presbytery in situations where it is not expedient to wait until the next stated meeting. The Committee voted unanimously to approve the recommendation of the Committee on Church Extension to permit the Good Shepherd Church to borrow funds from Synod's Revolving Loan Fund to purchase their first Church building. The loan document was signed by the Stated Clerk/Administrator in behalf of Presbytery.
6. It is noted that the Treasurer of Presbytery is not a member of the Executive Committee of Presbytery which is perhaps an oversight. There are often occasions when it would be good to have the Treasurer as a member of the Executive Committee especially since he is a Trustee of Presbytery and an officer of the Presbytery.
7. Derek W. N. Thomas was installed as pastor of First Columbia by an Installation Commission from the Presbytery as approved by the Chairman of the Commission on the Minister and His Work. The Commission consisted of Teaching Elders David Lauten, Chairman, Neal Mathias and Brandon Barrett along with Ruling Elders John Tyler from Grace, William R. Folks, Jr., and Robert A. Woodard, III from First Columbia. The installation was held September 8th at First Columbia. {APPENDIX C}
8. At the March meeting, a motion was made and approved to permit the Executive Committee to act on matters relating to the New Hope Church and Cemetery. To date no request has been received from the New Hope Session.

Recommendations:

1. That the actions of the Executive Committee be sustained.
2. That the Rules of Procedure Article 5, Section 9, a, page 12 be amended to add the Treasurer of Presbytery as a member of the Executive Committee.
3. That the remainder of the report be received as information and printed in the Minutes.

A motion was made and ADOPED to refer the names of the 3 churches who have not paid the Presbytery assessment to the State of the Church Committee for follow up and a report to the March meeting.

The report of the Committee on Commitment and Finance was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON COMMITMENT AND FINANCE

The Commitment and Finance Committee met on August 27, 2013 for the purpose of preparing a proposed budget for fiscal year 2014 and to finalize its response to an assignment from the Summer meeting relative to the question of incorporation of the Presbytery.

The proposed budget for 2014 is based on income being received from the latest number of active members within the Presbytery of 7,437 persons with \$30,120 being proposed for Presbytery expenses and \$81,435 for Church Extension work.

The Committee is thankful to our congregations for submitting their annual commitments of \$15 per active member in a timely fashion, which affords our being able to financially support the work of Presbytery. We are also thankful to God that we have several church extension works in place and that funds are available to support these efforts.

Our thanks are also extended to Mr. Lever for the fine work he has done and is doing as Treasurer of Catawba Presbytery.

During the process of obtaining a liability insurance policy for Presbytery, a meeting was held with Mr. Mark Henderson of Church Mutual Insurance Company. Mr. Henderson, early on, inquired if our Presbytery is incorporated. On learning that we are not, he stated that his company works with many church entities that are incorporated and highly suggested that we look into incorporation for Catawba Presbytery for the provisions of limited liability for our members.

In keeping with Mr. Henderson's suggestion, a recommendation was included in the Report of the Stated Clerk for the June Meeting and adopted that this committee study the incorporation of Presbytery and report back to the October, 2013 meeting.

During the course of study, it was found that all PCUSA Presbyteries are incorporated while some OPC and PCA Presbyteries are and some are not and that the EPC suggests that all of their Presbyteries be incorporated. Records indicate too that Catawba's Committee on Church Extension was incorporated as "Catawba Presbytery Church Extension Committee, Inc." on November 13, 1965. (Note: If our recommendation is adopted for Presbytery incorporation, it is anticipated that the Church Extension incorporation will cease to exist and all committees/commissions will come under the provisions of the Presbytery incorporation.) Canadian Presbytery of the ARPC is incorporated as a corporate entity under Canadian law.

It was also learned that a study was reported in the 2013 Report to General Synod by the Executive Board that called for a review of Synod's non-incorporated entities for information to evaluate the legal structure and assess potential liabilities. We found that the scope of the

study did not include Presbyteries but that, at least, one of the Board members suggested that Presbyteries should consider incorporation.

We further note that local congregations have historically been encouraged to incorporate for limited liability protection of its members; it thus appears logical that Presbytery would also seek to provide this level of protection as well.

Recommendations:

1. That Catawba Presbytery become incorporated and that the Stated Clerk/Administrator, along with Attorney Tom Roper, accomplish incorporation.
2. After hearing input from legal counsel, we encourage all congregations of Catawba Presbytery to become incorporated.
3. That the Presbytery Liability Policy with Church Mutual Insurance Company be increased via an Umbrella Liability Policy that will provide an additional \$1,000,000 dollars coverage for an annual premium of \$350.
4. That the Committee on Church Extension be encouraged to amend the Rules of Procedure by establishing a time-line for monetary support of mission churches by Presbytery and consider an annual decreasing scale for such support funds.
5. It is strongly recommended that each congregation of Presbytery have an annual audit conducted for at least Income and Expenses by a competent accountant.
6. That the proposed budget for 2014 be approved.
7. That any surplus funds in the 2013 budget be used for the Old Brick Church up to \$2,500.

The report of the Committee on Christian Education was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

The Catawba Presbytery Christian Education Committee met on Monday, August 26th, at Unity ARP Church in Lancaster. The following is a **summary** of that meeting.

Reports from past events:

- **Spring High School Retreat** – The retreat was held at Bonclarken on March 1-3, 2013. 24 churches from 1st, 2nd and Catawba Presbyteries participated (12 churches from Catawba) with a total of 229 participants. Phillip Bunch was the speaker and the *Erskine Barn* led in worship.
- **Spring Middle School Retreat** – The retreat was held at Bonclarken on March 22-24, 2013. 13 churches participated with a total of 190 participants. James McManus was the speaker and *Meager Fare* led in worship.
- **Children’s Retreat** – The retreat was held at Tirzah ARP Church on April 6, 2013. 6 churches participated in the retreat with a total attendance of 30 children. Joy Feemster was the teaching leader and Donna Thomas led in music. Many volunteers from Tirzah helped with the retreat.
- **Adult Retreat** – The retreat was held at Ebenezer ARP Church on May, 2013. The theme for the retreat was “On a Biblical View of Human Life.” Dr. Bob Cara was the primary speaker, and 5 electives were offered after lunch. There were 67 adults registered for the event. The volunteers at Ebenezer helped make this event possible.

Reports for planned events:

- **Fall High School Retreat** – The retreat will be held at Bonclarken on September 20-22, 2013. The speaker will be Dr. Mark McDowell and the music will be performed by the *Gene Francis Band*. The theme for the weekend will be “Gospel-life: Being doers of the Word”
- **Spring High School Retreat (2014)** – The Spring Retreat will be held at Bonclarken on March 7-9, 2014. The speaker will be Matt Joldersma and the music will be performed by *Meager Fare*. The theme has yet to be determined.
- **Fall Middle School Retreat** – The retreat will be held at Bonclarken on November 8-10, 2013. The speaker will be Fred Hope and the music will be performed by *Meager Fare*.

The report and supplemental report of the Committee on Church Extension were presented and ADOPTED as follows:

REPORT FROM THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION

The Committee is encouraged by the work of church extension in the Presbytery. Currently, there are three active church planting works in our Presbytery – Hill City Church, Rock Hill, SC, Kings Parish, Dallas, TX, and River Crossings, Fort Mill, SC. Each of these works is actively involved in the advancement of Christ’s kingdom. Please see our supplemental report (to be distributed at Presbytery) for a more detailed report on each of these works.

The Committee did meet via conference call to approve a loan request from Good Shepherd Church in Houston, TX for \$125,000 from the Outreach North America (ONA) Revolving Loan Fund. Good Shepherd will need the funds to purchase and renovate their first building. The committee also approved a one time matching grant request of \$35,000 from ONA's Matching Grant Fund. The Committee asked Presbytery's Executive Committee to approve this action on behalf of Presbytery given the time constraints regarding Good Shepherd's need. We celebrate this opportunity for a permanent home with the Good Shepherd congregation.

The Committee also received correspondence from a potential church planter in San Antonio, TX. We have committed to pray about the possibility of beginning a work in that city.

To accomplish this purpose, the committee met with Rev. David Stover of River Crossings Church and Rev. Andy Stager and Mr. Daniel Wells of Hill City Church. In addition, the committee received a report from Rev. Neal Mathias, the moderator of IBL's Session. Also, the committee's chairman received a verbal report from Rev. David Winburne of Kings Parish ARP Church in Dallas, TX. Below you will find a statistical report of the mission works in the Presbytery.

The Committee also discussed possible locations of future mission works in San Antonio, TX and Bluffton, SC. The Committee received communication from Rev. Brett Beker regarding a possible mission work in San Antonio, the nation's 8th largest city. Rev. Beker is currently a teaching elder in the Presbyterian Church in America. The Committee decided to take the necessary steps to pursue the development of a mission in San Antonio.

The Committee also discussed IBL's status as a mission congregation. Presbytery's Committee on Outreach is responsible for IBL's funding, and IBL continues to relate to the Committee on Outreach. IBL is also required to report to the Committee on Church Extension because of its mission status. The responsibility to report to two standing committees of Presbytery puts IBL in a tenuous position. Therefore, it is the Committee's opinion that IBL should report solely to the Committee on Outreach given the Committee's purpose according to Presbytery's Rules of Procedure.

APPENDIX B

JAMES CLYDE BARKER May 15-1931 – July 27, 2013

James Clyde Barker was born May 15, 1931, a son of Clyde E. Barker and Margaret Blanche Crocker Barker. He graduated from Gastonia High School in 1949. After receiving an A.A. degree from Brevard College, he served in the U. S. Air Force until 1955. He attended Belmont Abbey College, and then Erskine College. He received his B.A. degree in 1962 from Erskine College and then his B.D. from Erskine Seminary in 1963. He also received the Doctor of Ministry from Erskine Seminary in 1987.

He served the Cannon's Creek and Prosperity {SC} Churches while in Seminary. He was licensed and ordained by First Presbytery at the Tabernacle Church, Charlotte, NC on March 19, 1963. His first pastorate was the Union-Edgemoor-Oak Grove Churches in Chester County, SC beginning in June of 1963. He served First Presbyterian Church of Greenville, Texas for a year and a half. He accepted a call to Centennial Church, Columbia, SC where he served as pastor until 1991. He then became the Director of Church Extension for Catawba Presbytery until his retirement, December 31, 1998.

Jim Barker served as Stated Clerk of Catawba Presbytery, as Moderator of Presbytery and on many of the Presbytery Committees. He served the denomination on the Boards of Erskine College, Christian Education, World Witness, Dunlap and Church Extension. He had a special interest in new churches, and was a strong voice in promoting Church Extension. He was a caring pastor, a compassionate counselor and a dedicated worker for the Lord. Even in his hobbies, he was often involved in reaching out to help others, and to witness to the love of Jesus. Because of his own health issues, he helped to found the Heart-to-Heart Golf Tournament. During 11 years, it raised over \$120,000 for the American Heart Association.

He is survived by his wife of 60 years, Sally Ferguson Barker; his children Dale (Nan), Elizabeth (Earl) Beckham and Lyn (Doug) Schultz; a sister Ann (Pete) Burr, a brother John (Sally), six grandchildren and one great-grandchild.

The funeral service for James C. Barker was held at Centennial Church, Columbia, SC on July 30, 2013, conducted by Rev. David Setzer and Rev. Allen Derrick. Burial was at the Crowders Creek Church Cemetery, Gastonia, NC with the graveside service conducted by Rev. Richard C. Lewis.

Jim Barker was devoted to the Lord, and to His Church. He enjoyed helping people, sharing his faith and in making a difference in the lives of others. In his retirement he spent time on the golf course, at the lake, traveling with friends and working on projects in his shop. But he

did not cease to be a pastor and a servant for the Lord Jesus.
