Fathers and Brothers,

Presently, the Catawba Presbytery Middle and High School Retreats charge \$70/person for the retreat weekends. Bonclarken has recently raised their fee to \$72.50/person for the 2014 Spring retreats. In order to meet the rising costs of retreat expenses, our committee has approved a recommendation to raise our rate to \$80/person beginning in the Fall of 2014 for both the Middle and High School retreats. This, by the way, will be the same fee that First and Second Presbyteries currently charge their members.

The report of the Committee on Church Extension and Supplemental Report were presented as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION

Since the spring presbytery meeting, our committee has met twice. Both of these meetings have focused on a potential church planting work in Mt. Pleasant, SC. At our first meeting, we met with Ben Carver and Charlie Phillips and discussed their proposal for Shem Creek Presbyterian Church (ARP) in Mt. Pleasant. The meeting was fruitful and encouraging. We followed up that meeting with a conference call in which we discussed the possible work in greater detail. After these two meetings, our Committee decided that Ben and Charlie have a vision worth supporting. Our desire is to work with Outreach North America to put them on the field in Mt. Pleasant for yearlong internship. We believe this is the best option for the Presbytery and for Ben and Charlie as we move forward with the work.

Our Committee also received communication from the Arsenal Hill Session about the possibility of us helping them with a work of renewal and mobilization. The chairman has met with their Session and discussions about how our Committee can assist them will continue.

In addition, our Committee received a request from River Crossings Church (ARP) regarding approval for an ONA student internship for Zach Simmons.

Our Committee will have another meeting prior to Presbytery's stated summer meeting during which we will finalize our plans regarding the three ONA internship requests. We will have a supplemental report to distribute after our next meeting.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION

The Committee on Church Extension met on Tuesday, May 20 at Centennial ARP Church at 6:30 PM with a two-fold purpose. First, the Committee received statistical information from the Presbytery's three mission congregations – Hill City Church, Rock Hill, SC; River Crossing Church, Fort Mill, SC; and King's Parish Church, Dallas, TX. This statistical information is as follows.

The Committee's second purpose was to receive and discuss (in great detail) three requests for church planting apprenticeships, which the Presbytery would approve and support along with Outreach North America (ONA). The first request was a \$15,600 ONA part-time student internship from River Crossing Church for Zach Simmons, who is a current student at RTS-Charlotte and a student under care of Catawba Presbytery. The committee approved the request with the following funding breakdown (in dollars):

The other two requests, which the Committee approved, were from Ben Carver and Charlie Phillips for one-year apprenticeships in Mt. Pleasant, SC. The purposes of these apprenticeships is for the Presbytery to do exploratory church planting work in Mt. Pleasant and to give Ben and Charlie church planting experience with an opportunity to build relationships within the Presbytery. Given that this is a new church planting paradigm for Catawba Presbytery, the Committee believes a brief explanation of the apprenticeship is in order.

Background Narrative

In January, Ben approached the Committee about the possibility of planting Shem Creek Presbyterian Church (ARP). At that time he had already begun gathering a core group of people for vision casting and bible study on Sunday evenings. The committee's chairman encouraged Ben to put together a proposal, along with Charlie, for Shem Creek Presbyterian (ARP) and to present that proposal to the committee at the March 2014 meeting of Presbytery. And, he did it. The committee was encouraged with Ben and Charlie's proposal for a new mission work in Mt. Pleasant, SC. But, the committee desired more time to pray over and discuss the possible work among itself and with Ben and Charlie. Ben and Charlie agreed to a follow-up conference call with the committee in early April.

After a lengthy discussion with both Ben and Charlie in April, the committee requested that they embark upon a yearlong church planting apprenticeship in order to give them an opportunity to gain much needed pastoral oversight experience. They both have good ministry experiences, but neither has any senior pastoral experience. The committee also thought that it needed more time to get to know Ben and Charlie and to evaluate them in the church planting ministry context prior to making a three-year commitment to Shem Creek Presbyterian (ARP).

The committee desires for Shem Creek Presbyterian (ARP) to become a reality and is encouraged by Ben's and Charlie's enthusiasm, diligence, and dedication to the call they have received from the Lord. The committee is convinced that the apprenticeship will enhance their opportunity to be successful in their endeavor.

Oversight and Employment

Given that *Presbytery's Rules of Procedure* and the current *ARP FOG* do not have a provision for apprenticeships, Ben and Charlie will officially be employees of ONA under the direction of Presbytery's Committee on Church Extension. Presbytery will send its portion of Ben's and Charlie's financial support to ONA who will then distribute the funds to Ben and Charlie. Additionally, all contributions to the work in Mt. Pleasant will be collected and distributed by ONA until Shem Creek Presbyterian (ARP) is transferred to mission status should Presbytery decide such a transfer is prudent.

In addition to reporting directly to the Committee both Ben and Charlie will have a mentor within the Presbytery. Jan Sattlem will serve as Ben's mentor and Andy Stager will be Charlie's. Also, the committee believes that it will be prudent to assign Ben and Charlie a provisional session to provide them much needed counsel and encouragement as they seek to form their core group into a solid base for Shem Creek Presbyterian (ARP). It is the committee's desire to appoint this provisional session within the first 6 months of the apprenticeship and for this provisional session to prayerfully assist them into transitioning into a mission from an exploratory work.

Ben and Charlie have entered into a "Church Planting Agreement" that spells out the criteria on which they will be evaluated by the committee throughout the year. The agreement is attached as an appendix of this report.

Funding

The funding for the apprenticeship is as follows:

It should be additionally noted that Ben and Charlie have committed to raising an additional \$20,000 to cover their ministry expenses and health insurance costs, which they will have access to through the Synod's Health Insurance plan as employees of ONA. Also, in a conference call of the Executive Committee of the ONA Board on May 22, 2014, ONA approved its portion of the funding and accepted its role as employer for Ben and Charlie.

Finally, the Committee received a report from the chairman regarding his meeting the Arsenal Hill Session. The chairman reported that he had met with the Session on Tuesday, May 6, 2014 at 2:30 pm. The meeting was primarily an informational meeting in which the Session asked a number of questions regarding the Committee's involvement with Arsenal Hill's process of church renewal and shared with the chairman a number of its concerns regarding the congregation's present financial, demographic, and membership situation. The chairman informed the Session that there are no Presbytery funds available for the renewal of small and declining congregations without a current plan for a shift in philosophy of ministry. He did offer the Session the opportunity to apply for the "Church Mobilization Funds" through ONA and encouraged it to consider rethinking its philosophy of ministry. The chairman offered the Committee's assistance in any way possible to assist the congregation. The Committee has yet to receive further communication from the Session.

Recommendations:

1. That the report be received as information.
2. That the River Crossing student apprenticeship request for Zach Simmons be approved.
3. That the Church Planting Apprenticeships for Ben Carver and Charlie Phillips be approved.

4. That the Presbytery pause for prayer on behalf of the current mission congregations and on behalf of the exploratory work in Mt. Pleasant, SC.

**Catawba Presbytery
Church Planting Apprenticeship Agreement**

1. Personal Faith
 - a. Is there evidence of your personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ and your call to a ministry of church planting?
 - b. Do you expect God to do something great in your life and ministry?
 - c. Do you have a regular devotional and prayer life? What does it look like?
 - d. Does your trust in a sovereign God inform and play out in your personal and ministry decisions? Can you demonstrate it?
 - e. Have you demonstrated a commitment to excellence in life and ministry?
 - f. Have you demonstrated an entrepreneurial willingness to take initiative and to build a community of faith from the ground up?
 - g. Have you demonstrated persistence and resilience in your life and ministry?
2. Discipleship
 - a. Have you developed a group of people with whom you engage in personal discipleship?
 - b. Have you begun to reproduce disciples of the Lord Jesus as you invest your life in the lives of others?
 - c. Do people feel comfortable with you as one who serves as a “discipler” of their lives?
 - i. Have your people given you their trust and a license to speak into their lives?
 - d. Are those whom you are discipling growing in their desire and competence to make disciples of other people?
3. Community Life (including Worship)
 - a. Have you demonstrated an ability to gather a group of people around you and your God-given vision?
 - i. Have you demonstrated an ability to set a benchmark regarding the number of people necessary to indicate the potential for sustainable fruitfulness? Have you reached that benchmark?¹
 - ii. Have you demonstrated an ability to assemble, maintain, and train a core group of people who are following you and your vision?
 - b. How well have you trained other people to take leadership roles within your core group?
 - c. How have you enabled the people of your core group to take personal responsibility for ministry success?
 - d. Have you been able to create core group unity and identity around your vision and mission? How?
 - e. Does your preaching, teaching, and ministry communication engage the core group where they are in their lives and ministry?

¹ You will be responsible for setting the benchmark for group size and ministry sustainability by the end of the first year. You know your context better than the committee.

- f. Have you demonstrated an ability to encourage and use the giftedness of others?
- 4. Outreach and Evangelism
 - a. Have you sunk down roots in a neighborhood/community and begun to identify “persons of influence” and begun to build relationships with them so as to increase your sphere of influence?
 - b. How many people have you come to know, like, and trust, and do they know, like, and trust you?
 - c. Can you distinguish between people who are “warm” to the gospel and those who are “cold” to it?
 - d. Have you demonstrated the ability to initiate relationships with non-believers and make them feel comfortable with you?
 - e. Have you demonstrated the fruit of evangelism?
 - i. How many people have come to Christ as a result of your ministry?
 - f. Have you identified your community’s needs?
 - i. How have you prioritized those needs?
 - ii. Have you identified your target demographic?
 - iii. Have you adapted your philosophy of ministry to the character of your community?
 - iv. Do you understand the dominant culture of your community and that of your target demographic?
 - g. Have you identified an Evangelical, Reformed congregation that is currently engaged in evangelistic outreach and has seen the fruit of their labors with souls coming to Christ? And, have you developed a gospel partnership with that congregation?
- 5. Additional Expectations
 - a. Meet at least monthly with a church planting coach/mentor.
 - b. Meet at least monthly with church extension committee chairman or another appointed member of the committee via teleconference.
 - c. Attend a church planting training program.
 - d. Raise additional financial support from core group and other outside donors (if necessary).

Clint Davis offered prayer for the ministries of Church Extension in our Presbytery.

The report and supplemental report of the Commission on the Minister and His Work were presented as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK

The Commission met on April 22, 2014 at Centennial ARP Church in Columbia, S.C. at 6 p.m. The Commission heard a report concerning New Hope ARP Church and a meeting with ruling elder Allan Lewis of New Hope on March 31, 2014.

The Commission also considered the matter concerning assigned to it by the Presbytery at its Stated Meeting of March 11, 2014.

[“Clint Davis offered a motion that the Commission on the Minister and His Work be granted Commission status to act in behalf of Presbytery until the matter referred to by Mr. Rogers is completed. The motion was ADOPTED.” (Minutes of Catawba Presbytery, March 11, 2014, Vol. II, p. 24)]

A recap of the timeline and communications sent and received from Second Presbytery’s Minister and His Work Committee and its Executive Committee was given. The request by the Commission to meet with the Minister and His Work Committee was denied by the Executive Committee of Second Presbytery (see attached letter). In light of this refusal, the Commission considered what the next step would be in trying to resolve our original concern

pursuant to the motion made at the March 11, 2014 meeting of presbytery (see above). The course of action was to file a complaint with the next highest court listing the basis from Scripture and the Standards (see attached). A copy of the complaint was sent to the Principal Clerk of the General Synod, Mr. Ron Beard and to the ARP Center to be put in the Synod packets.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK

The Catawba Presbytery Minister and His Work Commission met on Monday, June 2, 2014 at the Bethel ARP Church in Winnsboro, SC at 6 p.m. The Commission met with the Session of the New Hope ARP Church over matters relating the establishment of a church cemetery association, Sessional records, possible student supply and restarting worship services at New Hope on a monthly basis.

The Commission met with and examined Chaplain Peter E. Johnson (LTC, US Army) for a transfer from San Gabriel Presbytery (PCUSA) to Catawba Presbytery (ARPC). The Commission examined Josh Squires for licensure and ordination.

The Commission received correspondence from Ebenezer ARP Church concerning the request of R. Boyce Wilson to retire effective October 31, 2014. Both the Session and congregation concurred with this request. The Commission also received correspondence from Clover ARP Church with the request from associate pastor Jonatan Simons to dissolve the pastoral relationship in order to pursue advanced theological studies. Both the Session and the congregation concurred with this request. The Commission also received correspondence from York ARP Church concerning the request of Tony Grant to retire effective July 1, 2014. Both the Session and congregation concurred with this request. The Commission also considered an interim supply request from the York ARPC Session. The Commission also approved interim moderators for Edwards Memorial ARP Church and York ARP Church.

Recommendations:

1. That Clyde McCants be the interim moderator of the New Hope ARP session.
2. That Chaplain Peter E. Johnson (LTC, US Army) be examined for transfer from the San Gabriel Presbytery (PCUSA) to Catawba Presbytery and if the way be clear that he be enrolled as a member of Catawba Presbytery pending reception of his transfer.
3. That Josh Squires be presented to the Presbytery for examination for licensure and ordination and that if his exam is sustained that he be asked the questions for licensure and if the way be clear he be presented a certificate of licensure and his name be added as a licentiate of Presbytery.
4. That the pastoral relationship between R. Boyce Wilson and Ebenezer ARP Church be dissolved effective October 31, 2014 and that he be honorably retired effective October 31, 2014.
5. That the pastoral relationship of Jonatan Simons as Associate Pastor of Clover ARP Church be dissolved effective July 31, 2014 so that he may so that he may pursue advanced theological studies.
6. That the pastoral relationship between Tony Grant and York ARP Church be dissolved effective July 1, 2014 and that he be honorably retired effective July 1, 2014.
7. That the interim supply arrangement between York ARP Church and Barry Eller be approved.
8. That Philip Bunch be the interim moderator of the York ARP Church session.
9. That Greg Slater be the interim moderator of the Edwards Memorial ARP Church session.
10. That churches with cemeteries look into having them as a separate legal entity under the authority of the church.

11. That Calvin W. Todd be examined for transfer from Tennessee Alabama to Catawba Presbytery and if the way be clear that he be enrolled as a member of Catawba Presbytery effective today.
12. That Jose Portillo Gemaro be presented as a student of theology and if the way be clear that a Service of Recognition be officiated by the Moderator and his name be added to the roll of Students of Theology.
13. That the report be received as information.

Recommendations 4-10 were adopted.

Recommendation 11 was adopted. Mr. Rogers examined Mr. Todd for transfer from Tennessee-Alabama Presbytery. The examination was sustained and Mr. Todd was received effective today as a retired minister.

Recommendation 12 was adopted. Mr. Rogers introduced Jose Portillo Gemaro who gave a brief explanation of his faith journey. The Moderator conducted the Service of Recognition for Mr. Gemaro and instructed that his name be added to the roll of Students of Theology. His pastor Robert Ferguson offered prayer for him.

Recommendation 13 was adopted.

Dear Mr. Smith:

We have received your letter of March 28, 2014, with its report on allegations presented by the Rev. John Rogers regarding "the derogatory manner in which some members of our Presbytery have been and are being referred to in *ARP Talk*." In addition, we note that the Minister and His Work Commission of Catawba Presbytery was "granted Commission status to act in behalf of Presbytery until the matter referred to by Mr. Rogers is completed."

On the basis of this communication from the Clerk of Catawba Presbytery, the Executive Committee of Second Presbytery has determined that this matter must now be deemed a discipline case and that allegations of personal offense by a member of Second Presbytery were publicly aired in Catawba Presbytery at its Spring meeting. The Executive Committee of Second Presbytery also recognizes that representatives of Second Presbytery must carefully follow the requirements of the *Book of Discipline* in order that the interests of all parties are protected and the work of the church is done decently and in order.

Relevant portions of the *Book of Discipline* (hereafter BoD) include:

Offenses are either personal or general, private or public but all offenses, being sins against God, are grounds for discipline. A personal offense is a violation of the law of God in the way of wrong done to some particular person or persons, including one's own self. A general offense is a violation of the law of God not directed against any particular person. Private offenses are those known only to an individual or, at most, to a few persons. Public offenses are those which are generally known. (BoD, II.A.2)

When a personal offense has been committed, whether the offense is public or private in nature, the injured party shall use the means prescribed by our Lord for bringing the offender to a recognition of his wrong and shall exhaust every effort to effect a reconciliation. (BoD, IV.1)

Whenever any charge of offense is referred to a church court for decision, the court shall, before even hearing the charge, determine whether every reasonable and appropriate effort has been made to settle the matter in a more private way. (BoD, IV.A.2)


Prosecution for the alleged offense should begin as soon as possible, but it must begin within one year from the time of the alleged commission of the offense or from the date it is reported to the court of jurisdiction. (BoD, V.A.13)

Preliminary investigation of this matter by the Executive Committee of Second Presbytery suggests that:

1. The steps "prescribed by our Lord" have apparently not been followed by members of Catawba Presbytery, and,
2. The hearing of this matter by Catawba Presbytery has likely involved members of that Presbytery in significant and even actionable irregularity, and finally,
3. Were representatives of Second Presbytery to meet with the Minister and His Work Commission of Catawba Presbytery such action would involve and entangle members of Second Presbytery in Catawba Presbytery's irregularity, and make them potentially liable to discipline as well.

For these reasons, the Executive Committee of Second Presbytery has advised the Minister and His Work Committee of Second Presbytery that a meeting with the Minister and His Work Commission of Catawba Presbytery is not appropriate at this time. Moreover, such a meeting should not take place unless and until the Catawba Commission provides appropriate evidence that its Presbytery has followed the provisions of the *Book of Discipline*, and that the matter would be properly before Second Presbytery.

COMPLAINT

Pursuant to the motion of Catawba Presbytery:

“Clint Davis offered a motion that the Commission on the Minister and His Work be granted Commission status to act in behalf of Presbytery until the matter referred to by Mr. Rogers is completed. The motion was ADOPTED.” (Minutes of Catawba Presbytery, March 11, 2014, Vol. II, p. 24)

The Catawba Presbytery of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church hereby makes the within Complaint against the Second Presbytery of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church on the following basis:

1. Catawba Presbytery sought, through the commissioning of its Minister and Works Commission, to address ongoing concerns about the derogatory manner in which some of its ministers have been, and continue to be, referred to in *ARPTalk*. However, we were refused the opportunity to address these concerns by the action of the Executive Committee of Second Presbytery.
 - b. In the spirit of Matthew 18:15-17, the Commission sought to address our concerns on behalf of the Presbytery to the proper court under whose jurisdiction the editor of *ARPTalk* is a member (BoD III.2)
 - c. In preparing for our meeting with MHWC of Second Presbytery we reviewed the minutes of Second Presbytery.
 - A. We learned that the MHWC and Second Presbytery identified our same concerns in 2009. In response to a complaint filed by Mr. Wilson, the committee found several of Mr. Wilson’s statements were “... potentially misleading and in the opinion of the committee, are vitriolic, ad hominem, and un-Christian in their character. MHWC calls on Mr. Wilson to seek forgiveness for these things and do everything in his power to refrain from repeating them in the future.” (Minutes of Second Presbytery, Spring Meeting 2009)
 - B. The committee went on to find in relation to Mr. Wilson’s writings in *ARPTalk* that “...there are several things in Mr. Wilson’s writings that are contrary to the Larger Catechism, Q. 144”. The Committee also called on Mr. Wilson “... to examine more carefully what he writes in light of Scripture, our confessional standards, and Christian charity and love.” (Minutes of Second Presbytery, Spring Meeting 2009)
 - C. We learned that the MHWC in dealing with complaints concerning Mr. Wilson, due to the actions of the Executive Committee of Second Presbytery, “...is unable to proceed at this time with its work on this matter.” (Minutes of Second Presbytery, Spring Meeting 2013)

Therefore, we request that the General Synod of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church sustain this complaint and assume original Jurisdiction in this matter concerning Mr. Wilson and *ARPTalk* through its Ecclesiastical Commission on Judiciary Affairs. (BoD III.3)
