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CATAWBA PRESBYTERY CALLED MEETING Union ARP Church, Richburg, SC April 13, 2015 7:00 P.M.

Catawba Presbytery met for a called meeting at the Union Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, Richburg, SC at 7:00 p.m. on April 13, 2015. Mr. Daniel K. Felker, Moderator, called the meeting to order and opened with prayer.

Guy Smith, Stated Clerk, constituted the roll. {APPENDIX A} A quorum was present.

The stated purpose of the meeting was as follows:

- > To hear the Middler Sermon of Watson Gunderson
- > To hear the Report of the Commission on the Minister and His Work:
 - To examine a candidate for transfer into the Presbytery and if the way is clear to act on a call and any other matters connect with that call
 - To receive a Student of Theology and if the way is clear for the Moderator to conduct the Service of Recognition for a Student of Theology
 - To receive a report and possible recommendations concerning students of theology
 - To approve moderators of the Sessions
 - To consider possible supply arrangements
 - To consider laboring outside the bounds report
- To hear a report of the Ad Hoc Committee on Memorials and consider any recommendations that may be made.

Kyle Sims, member of the Commission, introduced Watson Gunderson who preached his Middler sermon using as his scripture selected verse from I Corinthians 6. The Moderator thanked him for his message.

The Commission on the Minister and His Work presented several recommendations as follows:

- 1. That R. Garison Taylor be examined for transfer from Second Presbytery to Catawba Presbytery and if the way be clear that he be a member of Catawba Presbytery effective April 13 and that the call from Tirzah ARP Church as Associate Pastor of Christian Education and Youth Ministries that be read for approval.
- 2. That Jordan Bernard be presented as a student of theology and if the way be clear that a Service of Recognition be officiated by the Moderator and his name be added to the roll of the Students of Theology
- 3. That the names of Scott Hulstrand, Patrick Ward and Jamie Dagenhart be removed from the roll of Students of Theology effective April 13, 2015.
- 4. That Neely Gaston be the moderator of Union ARP Church effective April 13, 2015
- 5. That the student supply agreement of Union ARP Church with Watson Gunderson be approved through March 30, 2016.
- 6. That the revised interim supply agreement of Union ARP Church and Neely Gaston be approved through March 30, 2016.
- 7. That the interim supply agreement of Faith ARP Church and Scott Moore be approved through March 30, 2016.
- 8. That Scott Moore be the moderator of Faith ARP Church (Sumter) effective April 13, 2015.

9. That Andy Stager be granted permission to labor outside the bounds as a teacher and chaplain to the faculty of the Yongsan International School of Seoul (South Korea) through March 30, 2016. [Note: Yongsan is a member of the Network of International Christian Schools.]

Recommendation 1 was ADOPTED.

John Rogers, Chairman of the Commission, examined Mr. Taylor for transfer from Second Presbytery. After an opportunity for questions, a motion was made and ADOPTED Garison R. Taylor be received from Second Presbytery effective April 13, 2015.

The call for Mr. Taylor from the Tirzah Church as Associate for Christian Education and Youth was read and ADOPTED with the following terms to begin May 1, 2015:

 When a housing allowance is provided it may be divided to the best interest of the minister. Total Compensation: \$53,000 Base Salary \$28,400
 Housing Allowance \$21,000

Housing Allowance \$21,600 Travel Allowance \$3,000

- 2. Pay your moving expenses
- 3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod.
- 4. Provide Synod's life and health and dental insurance package for the pastor and his family.
- 5. The Church provides the cost of Life, Long Term Disability and Accidental Death Coverage as provided by and required by the General Synod.
- 6. One week to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings.
- 7. One week and expenses ror continuing education
- 8. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the congregation shall be encouraged to consider an increase to the previous year's base compensation.
- 9. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.
- 10. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
- 11. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
 - a. To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
- 12 In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise:
 - a. To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for a minimum of three months.

The Moderator presented the Call to Mr. Taylor and it was accepted.

Recommendation 2 was ADOPTED. Mr. Jordan Bernard was introduced to the Presbytery. After giving a brief description of his faith journey, the Moderator conducted the Service of Recognition and instructed that Mr. Bernard's name be added to the roll of Students of Theology. Mr. Felker offered prayer for Mr. Bernard.

Recommendations 3-9 were ADOPTED.

The Ad Hoc Committee on Memorials appointed at the March meeting made their report as follows:

REPORT OF THE AD HOC COMMITTEE ON MEMORIALS

The Ad Hoc Committee on Memorials has reviewed the memorials presented to the presbytery on March 10, 2015. The Committee is bringing forward two of the original memorials that have been clarified and improved.

MEMORIAL 1

That Catawba Presbytery adopt a memorial to the General Synod that in in the new Form of Government section 12.10 following the first sentence, delete the present wording and substitute for it, "The meeting shall be initiated in the following manner: At the official request of a majority of the Presbyteries the Moderator, or in his failure to act the Principal Clerk, shall issue an announcement for the called meeting. The Moderator or Principal Clerk may call a meeting of the General Synod with the official concurrence of a majority of the Presbyteries."

MEMORIAL 2

That Catawba Presbytery adopt a memorial to the General Synod that in the new Form of Government section 14.4, delete the word, "decision".

Memorial 1 was ADOPTED. Memorial 2 was ADOPTED.

John Rogers, Commission Chairman, informed the Presbytery of the new guideline from the Affordable Care Act that basically rules out any type of re-imbursement for medical insurance. He pointed out that those churches in our Presbytery that now give re-imbursement for insurance will have to issue a new call by June 1, 2015 in order to comply. The Commission will continue to work with those churches involved.

Announcements were made.

A motion to adjourn was ADOPTED. The closing prayer and benediction was given by H. Neely Gaston.

The report of the Stated Clerk/Administrator was presented and ADOPTED as follows; REPORT OF THE STATED CLERK/ADMINISTRATOR

Information:

- As a result of the Affordable Health Care Act guidelines our Rules of Procedure will need to be amended to remove from the Rules any reference to re-imbursement of insurance. Since these Rules are posted on the web, it seems prudent to set aside the Rules and consider approval of the changes.
- Another change that needs to be made as a result of the ACA is to add the following statement to F, Appendix E, Sections 1, 3-5: If the supply pastor works 30 or more hours, the church must offer them Synod's medical and dental insurance. If the pastor waives Synod's medical and dental insurance, he must have a waiver on file at the ARP Center in Greenville, SC and at the church he is supplying. If the supply pastor works 30 or more hours, he must be enrolled in Synod's Life and LTD insurance programs, and the church pays for that premium.
- When the last revision of Rules was made in October a motion adopted by Presbytery earlier should have been included. The Guidelines for a New Mission should have included in Section G, 3, f the statement that each mission when it seeks approval of the name as required by the FOG include in the official name Associate Reformed Presbyterian, such as _____ Associate Reformed Presbyterian Mission or

_____Presbyterian Mission, Associate Reformed Synod .This will be editorially included in the next revision.

At the direction of the Chairman of the Commission a transfer for Seth Yi was sent to Second Presbytery to be effective June 1, 2015.

The report of the Committee on Church Extension was presented and ADOPTED as follows: **REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION**

The Committee on Church Extension met on May 4, 2015 at Centennial ARP Church for the purpose of reviewing and praying for Presbytery's work of church extension. During the meeting, the Committee received updated statistical information about Presbytery's mission congregations and took action regarding a proposal from Ben Carver and Charlie Phillips, church planting apprentices in Mt. Pleasant, SC.

Statistical Information

The Committee thinks it is important to keep Presbytery up-to-date with the latest statistical information regarding her mission congregations. This information is reflected in the table below.

Proposal for Shem Creek Presbyterian Mission

The Committee received a proposal (which is attached) from Ben Carver and Charlie Phillips regarding Shem Creek Presbyterian Mission in Mt. Pleasant, SC. For the last year, Ben and Charlie have been doing an exploratory work for Presbytery as church planter apprentices. The Lord has blessed their work and has led them to the point of forming their core group into a formal mission. Their proposal calls for the following three-year funding plan from four different sources.

The Committee unanimously approved the proposal and was encouraged by the evidence of the Lord's hand upon the work in Mt. Pleasant at Shem Creek Presbyterian. In addition to approving the proposal for Shem Creek Presbyterian, the committee also approved a call to Ben Carver as Mission Developer for Shem Creek Presbyterian Mission. The committee has submitted that call to the Commission on Ministers and His Work for their approval. Presbytery should also note that ONA's Board has conditionally approved the Shem Creek Presbyterian Mission provided Presbytery's approval at its June meeting.

Provisional Session Members

The Committee also took action regarding the provisional sessions of River Crossing Mission and Shem Creek Presbyterian Mission. Tim Kiser resigned from River Crossing's Provisional Session due to some conflict with his work schedule. - 3. The exploratory trip to Houston to meet with the Hispanic Leadership Initiative (HLI) has not yet materialized (due to lack of response on their part) but is still being pursued.

The report of the Commission on the Old Brick Church was presented and RECEIVED AS INFORMATION as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION OF OLD BRICK CHURCH (OBC)

The Commission has not met since its last report to Presbytery. Its 24 April 2015 scheduled meeting required postponing because of "last-minute" obligations which would have precluded attendance by four of the seven commissioners. The meeting has been rescheduled for 16 May 2015 in conjunction with a scheduled clean-up of the OBC's grounds. However, activity with the property has progressed since the last meeting of Presbytery.

Items:

Some recent repairs were completed on the church building; foundation vents were recovered with wire screen; a raised dent in the roof was fixed; a hole in the north-facing fascia board was repaired; four new window panes were installed; and an interior door block on the west-end doors was installed.

OBC participated in the "Fairfield Remembers Sherman" historical commemoration held countywide on 21 February 2015, marking the 150th anniversary of Sherman's march through Fairfield County. The Fairfield County Museum, Historical Society, Genealogical Society, and the Towns of Winnsboro and Ridgeway sponsored the event. During the Civil War, Union soldiers removed some of OBC's flooring in order to construct bridging to ford Little River just east of the church. A note of apology, signed by "A Yankee," for defacing the house of worship remains preserved on the interior of the west wall. Approximately 40 persons visited the OBC during the commemoration.

The Chairman received Fletcher Monument's proposal to continue the gravestone stabilization and repair project begun last year. The proposal targets 24 gravestones for attention during this calendar year. Twenty-two of the stones are hazardous due to loose dies on bases and/or tilting; and two of the monuments of the box-tomb variety will have their tops removed, cleaned, and reassembled with the gaps filled. Forty-five hundred dollars (\$4,500) was approved by the Commission at its January 2015 meeting to continue the project. The Commission will review this proposal for decision at its 16 May 2015 meeting.

The Chairman has secured a graveyard plat which the Commission will review at the 16 May meeting. The plat includes identification of both unmarked graves and available burial space. The need to establish a burial policy for the OBC graveyard remains, and the plat will assist that effort.

Coordination has begun with the Fairfield County (FFC) Museum and Historical/Genealogical Society to identify living descendants of the graveyard's internees and former members of the OBC. Some genealogical information obtained by Commissioner McMeekin has been made available to the FFC Museum Director. The Commission desires to establish a support network of these descendants to complement the support which Presbytery graciously provides the OBC.

The Commission will welcome a new Commissioner, Mr. Andy Chandler of First Presbyterian Church, Columbia, at the 16 May 2015 meeting. Andy fills the vacated position precipitated by the loss of former Commissioner Bryan McKown.

At the May meeting the Commission will farewell Commissioner Dan Felker, Moderator of Presbytery, who will rotate off the Commission at the end of June. Dan's wise counsel, keen interest, and active participation strongly contributed to keeping the Commission rightly seeking the Lord's guidance in carrying out its oversight of this house of worship and historical treasure. We thank Dan and will miss his leadership.
