Catawba Presbytery Stated Meeting March 8, 2016 Effingham Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church Effingham, SC 10:00 A.M.

Catawba Presbytery met for a Stated Meeting at the Effingham Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, Effingham, SC on March 8, 2016 at 10:00 a.m. Moderator Alan A. Morrow called the meeting to order. After the singing of "A Mighty Fortress" the meeting was constituted with prayer by the Moderator.

John Rogers, Chairman of the Commission, introduced James C. Robbins to preach his Middler Sermon. Mr. Robbins used as his scripture I Timothy 2. The Moderator thanked him for his message.

Elder Rob Meggs of the Effingham Church welcome the Presbytery and gave instructions for the day.

R. Boyce Wilson offered prayer for the Erskine Seminary Board who has a special meeting today with the Association of Theological Schools.

Stated Clerk Guy H. Smith constituted the official roll from the enrollment cards. {APPENDIX A} A quorum was declared present. The Moderator welcomed visitors who were encouraged to register.

Mrs. Katey Powell, President of Catawba Women's Ministries, gave her annual report to Presbytery. A motion was made and ADOPTED that her remarks be included in the Minutes. {APPENDIX B}

Mr. Alex Pettett, Director of World Witness, spoke to the Presbytery on the work of World Witness with particular emphasis on the work among refugees.

Matters of unfinished business will be included in the committee reports.

New business was considered.

The report of the Stated Clerk/Administrator was presented and ADOPTED as follows: **REVISED REPORT OF THE STATED CLERK/ADMINISTRATOR**

Information:

- Acting on a request of the Commission on the Minister and His Work relative to the closing of the Providence Church, the Executive Committee voted unanimously that it was an "urgent matter" in accord with the Rules of Procedure. As a result of the request of the Providence Session and the Commission, the Executive Committee acted in behalf of Presbytery and closed the Providence Church effective November 13, 2015.
- Acting on the request of the Clover Session relative to the purchase of property, the Executive Committee voted unanimously that it was an "urgent matter" in accord with the Rules of Procedure. The request was to get Presbytery's endorsement for the purpose of purchasing property adjacent to the Clover Church to use for parking and additional educational facilities. The Executive Committee voted to act in behalf of Presbytery and gave endorsement to the Clover Church to purchase property adjoining the present property of the Clover Church.
- The Commission approved a transition package for Rev. Richard Brown of salary and benefits through February 2016. The remaining funds were transferred to the Presbytery Treasurer and the requests of the Providence Session were honored that the

funds be disbursed to the missionaries presently supported by the Providence Church as funds are available, possibly through June.

- The Session Records of the Providence Church are now in the hands of the Stated Clerk and will be sent to the ARP Archives at Erskine College following the meeting of the Presbytery.
- Dr. Charles MacDonald Coffey, long-time member of Presbytery, died on November 11, 2015. A letter of sympathy was sent to the family on behalf of the Presbytery. Dr. Ray A. King prepared the tribute for Dr. Coffey that will be sent to the General Synod. {APPENDIX C}.
- Eric S. Wenger, a student under care of the Presbytery, died on December 17, 2015. A letter of sympathy was sent to his wife on behalf of the Presbytery. The General Synod was also notified.
- The Committee on Commitment and Finance decided that it was time to review the books of the Treasurer of Catawba Presbytery. A letter has been received from James R. Robinson, EA from RB Tax LLC, stating that he had completed the review and determined the following: "Upon review, I did not find any inconsistencies with Mr. Lever's records. I found the records to be very organized and in great detail". A copy of the letter will be included in the Minutes of Presbytery. [APPENDIX E]

The report of the Committee on Christian Education including the information about Reformed University Fellowship was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEEE ON CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

The Catawba Presbytery Christian Education Committee met on Monday, January 25th, at 1st ARPC in Rock Hill, SC. The following is a **summary** of that meeting.

Reports of past events:

- 2015 Fall High School Retreat The retreat was held at Bonclarken on September 25-17, 2015. The theme was *The Things You Can Be Sure Of*. Mark Miller of New Albany was the keynote speaker and music was led by Andrew Di Lulio of 1st Columbia. First and Second Presbyteries participated in the conference. 359 attendees participated along with 15 staff members.
- **2015 Fall Middle School Retreat** The Fall Middle School Retreat took place on November 6-8 at Bonclarken. The theme was "I Am..." based upon various scriptures and led by the keynote speaker, Matt Mantooth. Music was led by a praise band from Perimeter PCA of Atlanta, GA. 11 churches participated including 11 staff and 250 chaperones and youth.
- 2015 Children's Retreat The retreat was held at Tirzah ARP Church on November 14, 2015. Its theme was "The Armor of God" based upon Ephesians 6:11. Joy Feemster (Neely's Creek) was the speaker, Jamie Dagenhart (1st Rock Hill) led in worship, and Judy Herron (Tirzah) led crafts. We had 44 children with 11 chaperones participate from 8 congregations.
- **2015 Spiritual Life Conference** The conference was held on September 20th, 2015 at 1st ARP in Rock Hill. Hank Hanegraaf, president of the *Christian Research Institute* and host of the radio program *The Bible Answer Man*, was the speaker for the evening who spoke on the history and beliefs of Islam, coupled with an apologetic/evangelism emphasis. The main session was followed by a dinner (McAllister's) which was followed-up with a Q&A session with Hanegraaf. Judi Hodges (CEM), along with representatives from the Christian Research Institute were on hand to offer a number of books and multimedia items for sale. We had 82 persons in attendance.

Reports of planned events:

- **2016 High School SPRING retreat** (Mar 4-6): Retreat theme will be "Missions." Alex Pettett (executive director, World Witness) will the speaker and Thomas Henderson will lead the music in worship. First and Second Presbyteries will be participating as well.
- **2016 Middle School SPRING retreat** (Mar 11-13): Keynote speaker and theme are yet to be determined. A praise team from 1st Columbia & Erskine will lead the music in worship.
- **2016 Children's Retreat** (November at Neely's Creek ARP): The exact date and details are a work in progress.
- 2016 Spiritual Life Conference: date and details are a work in progress.

Other Actions:

- We discussed how we could better co-ordinate efforts with CEM in planning, promoting, and carrying conferences relating to Christian Education.
- We communicated with RUF ministers from Clemson, USC, Furman, Winthrop, College of Charleston, and Erskine seeking their advice on how congregations may assist their college-aged members to get involved with campus ministries where they attend. We received responses from all ministers with the exception of USC and Clemson. Their responses were reviewed and discussed at the meeting, but no concrete recommendations emerged. The committee decided it would be best to continue

discussions with plans to make recommendations to the presbytery by the October 10th, 2016 meeting.

Recommendations:

- 1. That the report be received as information.
- 2. That the plans for the upcoming presbytery retreats/conferences be approved.
- That the Committee be allowed to continue its study of ministry to college-aged members and report back on the October 10th meeting of presbytery in 2016. Respectfully Submitted,

The report of the Committee on Church Extension was presented and ADOPTED as follows: **REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION**

The Committee on Church Extension met on January 19 at Bethel ARP Church for the purpose of reviewing and praying for the work of Presbytery's work of church extension. During the meeting, the Committee received updated statistical information about Presbytery's mission congregations, heard reports from Presbytery's mission developers, received a report from ONA's Executive Director, Mike Jones, and discussed the development of a strategic plan (location and funding) for planting new churches and encouraging congregational renewal within the bounds of Presbytery.

Statistical Information

The Committee thinks it is important to keep Presbytery up-to-date with the latest statistical information regarding her mission congregations. This information has changed since the Committee's initial report was published. Those changes are reflected in the table below.

Church Planting Developments

Daniel Wells, mission developer for Hill City Mission, presented a request to the Committee on the behalf of the provisional session that Hill City Mission be approved for organization as a local congregation by March 31, 2016. After discussing regarding Hill City's financial sustainability and the qualifications of her elder candidates, the Committee received this recommendation with joy and unanimously voted to recommend the organization of Hill City as a local congregation to the Presbytery.

Church Revitalization

The Committee desires to make Presbytery aware that the committee is available to assist congregations with revitalization and renewal. At present, the committee has contributed \$4000 to Living Waters for revitalization in 2016 and has an additional \$11,000 in its 2016 budget to assist other congregations. The Committee also is willing to work with ONA to get

resources into the hands of sessions and congregations who desire to undergo a revitalization process.

Recommendations:

- 1. That the report be received as information.
- 2. That Presbytery organize Hill City Mission as a local congregation.
- 3. That Presbytery pause for prayer on behalf of the current mission congregations and on behalf of our mission developers and their families.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT AOF THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION

The Committee on Church Extension met on February 29, 2016 at Bethel ARP Church for two primary purposes. The first was to consider Rev. Matt Awtrey as a Church Planting Exploratory Intern for Irmo, SC, and the second was to consider a request from River Crossing Mission for a fourth year of funding in the amount of \$40,700.

Rev. Matt Awtrey and Irmo, SC

The Committee met with Rev. Matt Awtrey about the possibility of planting an ARP Church in Irmo, SC. Matt is an ordained member of Second Presbytery and has a heart for the Irmo area. He and his wife are both from the Irmo area and would love to see a biblical, reformed and evangelistic congregation in that community. For the past 8 months, Matt has been working as a Church Planting Exploratory Intern for Second Presbytery. During this time he and his wife have sought the Lord's direction for their lives and ministry. They believe the Lord has called them to Irmo to plant a church. The Committee agrees.

The Committee recommends that Catawba Presbytery put Matt on the field in Irmo, SC to continue the exploratory work that he has already begun. The Committee further recommends that Presbytery pick up the remaining 4 months of Matt's Church Planting Exploratory Internship from Second Presbytery at a total cost of \$10,000. The committee has the money in its 2016 budget in the "Additional Startup" line. Matt will use the next 3-4 months to prepare his official proposal for a church plant in Irmo, SC.

River Crossing Mission

The Committee also met with David Stover to consider a proposal from River Crossing Mission for a fourth year of funding in the amount of \$40,700. The committee reviewed River Crossing's financial records and found that Presbytery has contributed \$232,149 to River Crossing since August 2012. Presbytery has already contributed \$22,149 more than it originally committed to the Mission. After discussing the proposal with David and reviewing the River Crossing's finances, the Committee voted to deny the request because it was not convinced that granting the request would be the best stewardship of Presbytery's resources.

Recommendations

- 1. That the Church Planting Exploratory Internship for Matt Awtrey be approved.
- 2. That the Presbytery provide \$10,000 to fund the remainder of Matt Awtrey's internship.

The Commitment and Finance Committee reports the following:

The audit of the Treasurer's books has been completed. Under the Clerk/Administrator's report, the official letter from Mr. James R. Robertson may be found.

We also report that the following churches indicated that their treasurer's books had been reviewed by someone outside the church during 2015 or early this year: **Bethel, Blacksburg, Chester, Clover, Columbia First, Crossings Community, IBL, Rogers Memorial, Edgemoor, Living Waters, Neely's Creek, Rock Hill First, Rowan, Union, & York.**

Delegates are reminded that the Revised Form of Government requires that a review by an outside person be conducted no less than every three years. This provision was set in place for the protection of each congregation. This year (2016) marks the third year of this provision and by December 31 all congregational reports should indicate that their treasurer's books have been reviewed. If anyone is not certain of how to go about this review, we suggest that they contact someone from one of the above churches.

The report of the Committee on State of the Church was presented and ADOPTED as follows: **REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON STATE OF THE CHURCH**

The Committee met on Feb. 28 at the Bethel A.R.P. Church. With regard to the referral from the spring 2015 meeting of Catawba Presbytery asking the SOC to address the sessions that habitually do not send representatives to presbytery or synod, the Committee voted to send a letter "to the sessions of churches of Catawba Presbytery that did not have representation at either the stated meetings of Catawba Presbytery nor the meeting of General Synod during the 2015 calendar year. That letter should communicate that they have been absent from the work and fellowship of Catawba Presbytery and ask that they respond to the concerns of Presbytery in this matter." We also had extensive discussion concerning our struggling, small, declining churches and their revitalization and noted that three standing committees of the presbytery have some responsibility in this area as well as the newly appointed Special Committee authorized at the stated meeting of Presbytery last Fall. It was noted that we are required to help churches who report a membership under 51 members. According to the 2015 Minutes of Synod, 14 churches fit this criteria. A motion was approved that Mr. Jordan moved that "A letter be sent to the churches who reported under 51 members, expressing our desire to better know their needs, joys, and struggles that we might pray for them and encourage them." The Committee took no further actions and brings no recommendations to the Presbytery at this time.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON OUTREACH

The Committee on Outreach met on January 28, 2016 at Sherwood Forest ARP in Columbia, SC.

- Mark Herring, who serves as the moderator for the IBL church, gave an update report to the committee on the current status of the IBL Mission
 - 6 young folks have expressed interest for baptism; training is being done
 - Rev. Nilo Rios has filled the pulpit since the summer of 2015
 - The session asked Rev. Nilo Rios to stay on for 3 more months
- Other initiatives
 - Some discussion regarding the present refugee crisis and what the response of the church of Jesus Christ needs to be
- Recommendations to Presbytery
 - That the churches of Catawba Presbytery be encouraged to look at the present refugee/immigration crisis not so much as a threat but as a Gospel opportunity
 - That Catawba Presbytery petition Synod for a special presentation (panel discussion) regarding the refugee/immigration opportunity at the next Synod meeting (June 2016)

The report of the Commission on the Old Brick Church was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION OF OLD BRICK CHURCH (OBC)

The Commission has met on one occasion since its last report to Presbytery: 19 November 2015. The Commission has scheduled its next meeting for 18 February 2016 at Bethel A.R.P. Church in Winnsboro.

Items:

After receiving the approval and support of Presbytery, the Commission at its 19 November 2015 meeting tasked Commissioners Chandler and Johnson to coordinate with a Fairfield County brick mason, Mr. Randy Sims, to have Mr. Sims repair some deteriorated mortar joints on the church building. Mr. Sims began work in December and will complete the repairs by 30 January 2016.

Likewise, with Presbytery support the Commission tasked Commissioner Cathcart to coordinate with Mr. Todd Hutcheson, a local contractor, to repair a fascia problem just under the roof decking along the south elevation of the building. Some decking deterioration just under the roofing had created some spacing, which invites varmint intrusion. Mr. Hutcheson completed the repairs in December 2015.

The Commission continues the gravestone stabilization and repair project it began in 2014 with Matthew Fletcher of Fletcher Monuments in Columbia. This effort has focused upon those stones and monuments which present a hazard or liability. The 2015 work (Phase II) started in December 2015 and is scheduled for completion in early February 2016. In this phase, 17 stones/monuments have been repaired/stabilized with five remaining. **Recommendation**: That this report be received as information.

The Commission on Minister and His Work met at Edgemoor ARPC on Tuesday, January 11, 2016 at 6 p.m. The Commission considered the following items of business: supply agreements, requests for laboring outside the bounds, Vacant Churches, Licentiates, Students of Theology, those involved in Synod and Other Ministries. As part of the Commission's report, there is information listed below on Vacant Churches, Licentiates, Students of Theology, Other Ministries and Synod Ministries. It was noted that the session of Neely's Creek is filling the pulpit with different ministers.

Vacant Churches: At the present time the Presbytery has 14 Vacant Churches, with 6 actively searching for a new Pastor. The Vacant Churches and their Moderators are: Blacksburg ARP Church, Active Search Committee, Jim Klukow, Moderator; Faith Presbyterian Church (Sumter), Non-Active Search Committee, Scott Moore, Moderator; Hardeeville First, Non-Active Search, Marty Taylor, Moderator; Hopewell, Active Search Committee, Dwight Pearson, Moderator; IBL, Non-Active Search Committee, Mark Hering, Moderator; Lemira Presbyterian Church, Non-Active Search Committee, Brian Peake, Moderator; Neely's Creek ARP Church, Active Search Committee, Andy Putnam, Moderator; New Hope, Non-Active Search Committee, Clyde McCants, Moderator; Rogers Memorial , Non-Active Search Committee, Billy Fleming, Moderator; Smyrna and Hickory Grove, Active Search Committee, Boyce Wilson, Moderator; Union ARP Church, Active Search Committee, Neely Gaston, Moderator; Westminster ARP Church, Non-Active Search Committee, Rev. Brian Howard, Moderator; White Oak ARP

Licentiates: Brad Anderson is director of Youth Ministry at First Presbyterian Church of Columbia; David Huffman is open to a call; Justin Brickey is preparing to go to Spain as a missionary with World Witness; and Joseph Crump is open to a call.

Students of Theology: Watson M. Gunderson (Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary – Charlotte); James Eish (CIU); Brandon Auten (Erskine); Andrew J. Dilulio (Erskine); Kevin Vickery (Erskine); Matthew Jordan Bernard (Erskine); Jose Portillo Gamero (RTS Charlotte); Russell L. Thomas (RTS Charlotte); Russell B. Harless (Erskine); Joshua W. Thomas (Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary).

<u>Other Ministries</u>: We presently have Peter Johnson, Michael Kelly and Andrew Nix serving as chaplains in the U. S. Army. Andrew Bashan is serving as a Hospice Chaplain in Sumter.

Synod Ministries: We presently have: Scott Andes serving as a Missionary with World Witness in the Ukraine; Leland Beaudrot with the Administrative Services of the ARP Center; Juan Carlos Bonilla with World Witness serving in Spain; Mark Ross with Erskine Seminary, Paul Robelot with World Witness as a Cooperative Missionary in France; Frank van Dalen with World Witness serving in Lithuania; Mark Witte with World Witness in Spain and Heiko Burklin as Mission Developer with World Witness.

The Commission on the Minister and His Work met at First ARPC, Lancaster, SC on Tuesday, January 26, 2016 at 6 p.m. The Commission met with James C. Robbins of Ebenezer ARPC about his desire to come under the care of Catawba Presbytery as a theological student. The Commission also considered supply agreements, laboring outside the bounds requests from Scott Moore and Andrew Stager. The Commission also considered a possible amendment to the Rules of Procedure of Catawba Presbytery. Neither the present Form of Government nor the Rules of Procedure provide a method for a mission preparing to become a congregation to call a pastor. Also, the mission is not an organized congregation to comply with the Form of Government. The Rules of Procedure would need to be amended in order to provide such a method to allow a mission getting ready to organize to call its first pastor.

Recommendations:

- 1. That the following supply agreements be approved:

- 3. That the following be granted permission to labor outside the bounds of Presbytery beginning April, 2016: Andrew Basham, Billy O. Fleming, Neely Gaston, James L. Klukow, J. Michael Lashley, Scott Moore, Jonatan Simmons, and Andrew Stager.
- 4. That James C. Robbins be received as a student of theology and if the way be clear that a Service of Recognition be officiated by the Moderator and his name be added to the roll of the Students of Theology.
- 5. That the name of Martin Cramer be removed from the roll of students of theology effective March 9, 2016.
- 6. That the Rules of Procedure of Catawba Presbytery be amended as follows:

1. Amend IX, Section F, Appendix A by adding a new Section 3 as follows:

Section 3: Securing a Pastor for a Mission Preparing to Organize as a Church

- a) The Leadership Committee of the Mission shall select from the Mission group a representative number of members to serve as a Pulpit Nominating Committee.
- b) Once the Pulpit Nominating Committee has been selected and the chairman designated, the names shall be submitted to the Provisional Session for approval.
- c) The Chairman of the Pulpit Nominating Committee shall immediately contact the Chairman of the Commission on the Minister and His Work for instructions of proceed.
- c) When the Pulpit Nominating Committee has completed its search and the Committee on Church Extension has recommended the Mission to the Presbytery for organization as a church, a date for organization shall be established by the Moderator and Stated Clerk/Administrator. The Moderator shall appoint the Organizing Commission that will function in accord with the guidelines establish in the Rules of Procedure Article IX, G, IV.
- d) On the day of organization the following action shall occur:
 - 1. The Congregation shall be organized by a Commission appointed by the Moderator of Presbytery.
 - 2. A congregational meeting shall be convened by the Moderator of Presbytery or his designee. Once the Congregational Chairman is elected, he will lead the congregational meeting.
 - 3. The Pulpit Nominating Committee shall present the name of the prospective pastor to the congregation for approval along with the terms of the Call for the Pastor.
 - 4. If the vote for approval is given and if the way is clear, the newly-elected pastor may be installed by the Presbytery.
- 2. Re-number the remaining items of Appendix A accordingly.
- 3. Add a reference to the above change in IX, G, IV, Organizing a Mission as a Particular Congregation

7. That the Rules of Procedure be set aside in order to approve the change so that missions may start using it.

The Commission met with Licentiate Jeremiah Thomas for a transfer exam from Tennessee-Alabama Presbytery to Catawba Presbytery. He is a candidate for associate pastor at Grace ARP Church. The Commission also met with the pulpit committee from Grace ARP Church and went over the terms of call with both the candidate and the pulpit committee. The Commission met with Chaplain Drew Arrington (Major, U.S. Army) for a transfer exam from the Southern Baptist denomination to Catawba Presbytery.

The Commission also conducted salary reviews. It also considered the retirement of Denny Hieber and supply agreements.

The Commission on Minister and His Work also met on Wednesday, March 2, 2016 at 8 p.m. at First ARPC Rock Hill, S.C.

The Commission met with and interviewed the Hill City pulpit committee and their candidate Daniel Wells and went over the terms of call as pastor.

It should be noted that the following churches have not reported as filing the 1094-C and 1095-C as required by law under the Affordable Care Act: Ebenezer, Edgemoor, Hope (TX), River Crossings and Tirzah.

Recommendations:

- 1. That Jeremiah Thomas be examined for as a licentiate from Tennessee-Alabama Presbytery to Catawba Presbytery and if the way be clear that he be extended a call from Grace ARP Church as an associate pastor.

Mr. Robbins and Mr. Phillips gave a brief synopsis of their faith journey. The Moderator conducted the Service of Recognition for Students of Theology for them and instructed that their names be added as Students of Theology. Prayer was offered for the students by Benjamin Carver.

Recommendation 1 was ADOPTED. Mr. Thomas was examined for transfer as a licentiate from Tennessee Alabama Presbytery. The examination was SUSTAINED.

Recommendation 2 was ADOPTED. The call from the Grace Church for Mr. Thomas as an Associate was read with the following terms:

CALL FOR JEREMIAH A. THOMAS

The Call from Grace Church for Jeremiah A. Thomas was approved follows with the terms to begin May 1, 2016 as follows

- 1. When a housing allowance is provided it may be divided to the best interest of the minister and shall provide:
 - 1) Basic Compensation: \$42,500
 - a. Base Salary \$25,300
 - b. Housing Allowance \$17,000
 - c. Travel Allowance \$ 0
- 2. Pay your moving expenses
- 3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod.
- 4. Provide 100% of Synod's life, and health, and dental insurance package for the pastor and his family.
- 5. The Church provides the cost of Life, Long Term Disability and Accidental Death Coverage as provided by and required by the General Synod.
- 6. Two weeks to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings.
- 7. One week and expenses for continuing education
- 8. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the Church shall be encouraged to consider an increase to the previous year's base compensation.
- 9. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.
- 10. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
- 11. Other: Community/Hospitality Allowance \$2,000 Cell Phone Allowance \$1,000 Book & Resource Allowance \$250
- 12. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
 - a. To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
- 13 In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise:
 - a. To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for a minimum of three months.

Chaplain Andrew K. Arrington was introduced the Presbytery and examined by Mr. Rogers for reception from the Southern Baptist Convention. The examination was SUSTAINED with the understanding that it also carried with it the endorsement to the PRCC.

Recommendation 4 was ADOPTED. A letter will be sent to Mr. Hieber in behalf of the Presbytery

- 8. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the Church shall be encouraged to consider an increase to the previous year's base compensation.
- 9. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.
- 10. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
- 11. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
 - a. To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
- 12 In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise:
 - a. To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for a minimum of three months.

Recommendation 8 was APPROVED.

APPENDIX C

Dr. Charles MacDonald Coffey November 16, 1927 - November 11, 2015

Dr. C. Don Coffey of Davidson, NC died Wednesday, November 11, 2015. He was born November 16, 1927 in North Wilkesboro, NC, son of Charles MacDonald Coffey Jr. and Martha Lura Finley Coffey. Don attended McCallie School and received a BS in Business from Davidson College in 1949, where he was Phi Beta Kappa and received the Algernon Sydney Sullivan Award. He was a Second Lieutenant in the US Army Reserve from 1949 to 1954 and was in business with his father. He married Ruth King Wood Coffey on December 21, 1951 in Low Moor, VA. In 2011, Don was preceded in death by his beloved wife of 60 years, Ruth. He is survived by his children, Elizabeth Ann 'Betsy' Coffey Massey and husband, Richard; Stephen MacDonald Coffey and wife, Beth; Charles Welton Coffey and wife, Susan; Carol Blanton Coffey-Howard and husband, Stephen; as well as nine grandchildren and one great grandchild.

Don earned his Master of Divinity and later his Master and Doctor of Theology degrees at Union Theological Seminary in Richmond, VA. He served as pastor at Ridgecrest and Oakboro Presbyterian Churches in Stanley County, NC. Don was called to serve at Erskine Theological Seminary in Due West, SC in 1959 where he was Professor of Biblical Theology and Christian Education.

In 1980, Ruth and Don retired to Davidson, NC and were very active at Davidson College Presbyterian Church and in the community. They moved to the Pines Retirement Community in 2005. Throughout his retirement, Don continued to work as an Investment Manager with the Christian Social Justice Fund he created. At his memorial service at the Davidson College Presbyterian Church Mary Margaret Porter said: "Imagine my...surprise when I read in a recent Presbyterians Today article that Don would continue investing until his assets rose to 1 Million dollars whereupon he began to dole them out to organizations that were near to his heart and start over again. This type of real, open-handed generosity flowed from Don's firm conviction that the things that he, and we, own—our money, home, computers,—all of these things really aren't ours after all. Don recognized that all that we have is a gift from God and that we simply hold them in this life as stewards in trust to be used for neighbors in need near and far." Part of Don's legacy was that he enjoyed teaching his friends and family about his philanthropic philosophy so that they might continue his work.

Don became an ARP when he was received as a member of Catawba Presbytery October 22, 1964 after he had received his Doctor of Theology degree. In addition to his philanthropy, as a professor he touched many lives, ARPs and those in other denominations as well. Upon hearing of his death many wrote telling how Don influenced their ministries. Here are a few excerpts from some comments: ("In all of my theological education, I should say in all of my education, no one had more influence on me than Don Coffey.")--("I know that once I put down my resistance to Don, I learned so much from him.")--("Many times over the years, I have heard Coffey whisper in my ear. I remember mostly the gentle nudge to look further and deeper.")--("I had hanging on my office wall...a statement that read, 'Respect for the pupil is the secret of education.' It appears to me that Don Coffey epitomized that.")--("It seems that it takes the death of someone like Don to get around to saying how much they meant to us. I fear the seminary will never see a man like Don on the faculty again.")

In these and many quiet ways Don Coffey fulfilled his call of our Lord to witness to His Grace by word and deed!
