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# Catawba Presbytery Stated Meeting <br> Neely's Creek Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church Rock Hill, SC <br> October 10, 2017 <br> 10:00 A.M 

Catawba Presbytery met at the Neely's Creek Church, Rock Hill, SC for its Stated Meeting October 10, 2017 beginning at 10:00 a.m. Moderator L. Charles Hammond called the meeting to order. The opening hymn was "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name". The Moderator then constituted the meeting with prayer.

The Moderator of Synod Lee Shelnutt was introduced. Mr. Shelnutt read from Matthew 16:18-, 21 and spoke briefly on Synod's work and the Synod Good Samaritan Offering.

Mr. Shelnutt made presentation of a gift of \$7,000 from the Good Samaritan Fund offering to Rev. Robert Ferguson, pastor of Faith Fellowship in Houston, TX for repairing damage to his Church and his home as result of the flood in Texas. Mr. Ferguson made an appropriate response thanking everyone for remembering them.

There were no items of unfinished business.
Two special presentations were made.
Chaplain Andrew Arrington spoke briefly on the work of our chaplains in the armed services and how they interact with the service personnel. He encouraged prayer and encouragement for the chaplains.

Wayne Frazier who serves as Outreach North America Church Vitality Coach spoke on his work. He spoke on church health and what it means as well as the resources ONA has to assist local churches

The order of the day prevailed at 11:30 a.m. Kyle E. Sims, a member of the Commission, introduced Luke A Grigsby who preached his Middler sermon. Mr. Grigsby used as his scripture Colossians 2:16-23. The Moderator thanked him for his message

Information:
> At the instruction of the Commission, a transfer was issued to NY State Presbytery, PCA for Daniel F. Wells effective September 1, 2017
> A note of appreciation was received from Bonclarken Conference Center for the gift given to Bonclarken in honor of the retirement of T.C.S. \{Buddy\} Lever, Jr. as Presbytery Treasurer.
> Please note the recommendations from the June meeting of Synod. Especially note the deadlines that are given and those that need session consideration.

- Benefits (Synod 2017 approved) - That presbyteries direct all their churches (except Canadian Presbytery) to offer General Synod medical and dental insurance coverage to all eligible employees in compliance with the Affordable Care Act.
- Bonclarken (Synod 2017 approved) - That General Synod encourage all presbyteries, boards, and churches to encourage and assist their members in attending the various camps/conferences/retreats hosted by Bonclarken during the year.
- Book of Discipline (Synod 2017 approved) - That the draft of the revised Book of Discipline be received as information, and made available to members, churches, and presbyteries for study and comment (AND) That all comments on the Book of Discipline draft revision be submitted to the Committee, in care of Leland Beaudrot in Central Services, in Word format, no later than November 15, 2017. Book of Discipline draft is located on the website (arpchurch.org).
- CEM (Synod 2017 approved) - That Synod encourage presbyteries to take full advantage of CEM's training opportunities and make use of the ARP Bookstore for equipping the saints.
- Erskine (Synod 2017 approved) - That the ARP churches, presbyteries and General Synod pray often and regularly for Erskine College and Seminary's board, faculty, staff and student body as they incorporate the gospel into all of their actions and activities. PCHE Draft Review (Synod 2017 approved) - That delegates be requested to review the First Draft and suggest other revisions of the PCHE to the ad hoc committee by January 1, 2018.) PCHE draft is located on the website (arp365.org)
- ONA (Synod 2017 approved) - That churches and presbyteries set aside time to specifically pray for congregational and personal evangelistic fervor, church planter recruitment and intentional church vitality within the ARPC.
- Worship (Synod 2017 approved) - That the General Synod encourage individuals and sessions to submit nominations of individuals qualified and willing to serve on the Committee on Worship to Synod's Committee on Nominations (and) That the General Synod encourage local sessions to review the Directory of Public Worship annually and consider their own Lord's Day public worship in light of the Directory's teaching

## REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON COMMITMENT AND FINANCE

## Transition:

## Presbytery Assessment:

The Presbytery assessment for 2018 will be $\$ 15.00$ per communicant member. The $\$ 15$ will be disbursed as $\$ 11.00$ for Church Extension, $\$ 3.50$ for Presbytery operations and $\$ .50$ for the Old Brick Church for 4 more years as approved earlier by Presbytery

## Reminder:

The Presbytery Assessment is based on the figure reported by each session in the annual Statistical Report to Synod as of December $31^{\text {st }}$ and recorded in the current Minutes of Synod under the statistical tables. It is this report of the Church's communicant membership that is used to calculate the Presbytery Assessment.

## Denominational Ministry Fund:

The Committee receives a summary of the annual Statistical Reports and has oversight of the Denominational Ministry Fund in the Presbytery. The summary for the giving to the 2017 Denominational Ministry Fund is as follows:

20\% Giving
10-19\% Giving
1-9 \% Giving
No Commitment
N/A

3 Churches
9 Churches
25 Churches
12 Churches
1 Mission just started

We strongly encourage churches and missions not participating in this important Synod ministry to begin participating. We also encourage all churches in our Presbytery to strive to reach a higher level of giving.

## Non-budgeted Funds:

There are often instances when the Treasurer receives requests for funds that have not been budgeted. In order to assist our new Treasurer, the Committee adopted a procedure as to how these funds can be secured. For future reference the Committee recommends that the Rules of Procedure Article IX, C., be amended by adding a new d) and re-lettering the remaining items in that section to read as follows:
d) Securing Non-Budgeted Funds from the Treasurer

1) The funds designated for specific budgeted purposes belong to the Presbytery and are disbursed on recommendation of the appropriate committees to the Committee on Commitment and Finance.
2) The Treasurer does not disburse funds from a committee's budget at the request of an individual but rather at the request of the appropriate committee.
3) For example: The procedure for a Mission Developer is:

- The Mission Developer submits a request to his Provisional Session which has all the power and authority of a regular session according to the Form of Government.
- If the Provisional Session approves the request, they will submit a recommendation to the Committee on Church Extension which has oversight of the funds in behalf of Presbytery.
- The Church Extension Committee would then recommend, or not recommend, the use of the funds to the Committee on Commitment and Finance who in turn recommends the use of the funds to Presbytery.
- If the Committee on Commitment and Finance sees a problem with the use of funds, they would refer it back to Church Extension with the reason they see a problem.
- The Committee on Church Extension would look at it again and decide whether to recommend going forward with the request.

4) If the Committee on Church Extension decides to extend funding to a mission beyond the 3-year plan, that request must be sent to Presbytery for approval.
5) Similarly, the same procedure would apply to the directors of the various retreats who would make their requests through the Committee on Christian Education who would assess the appropriateness of the request and, if approved, recommend the request to the Committee on Commitment and Finance for payment action.
6) On all matters the Treasurer needs to be provided with proper documentation.

## 2018 Budget:

Budget requests were received from the various committee of the Presbytery. It is the goal of the Committee to maintain a balanced budget.

## Budget Deficit:

There will be a deficit again in this year's budget. After studying the budget, the Committee notes to the Presbytery several factors causing the deficit:
$>$ There is a decrease of 194 communicant members for the 2018 budget purposes without an increase of the \$15.00 Presbytery assessment.
$>$ Presbytery last year designated $\$ .50$ of the Presbytery Assessment to be used at t-he Old Brick Church for tombstone repair for a period of 5 years. This is the second year of that designation and no funds were provided in the budget at the time to replace those funds.
$>$ Presbytery also approved last year a $\$ 2400$ honoraria for the Treasurer with no funds provided to cover the expenditure.
> Presbytery was also given the responsibility by Synod to cover part of the membership fee in the PRCC for the chaplains who are members of our Presbytery. The $\$ 1,500$ was not funded.

In order to cover the deficit and avoid increasing Presbytery's Assessment, the Committee recognized that the Senior High Retreat has a bank account of about \$5500 and Middle School Retreat has a bank account of \$8600. It appears that in 2018 these groups will be involved in Super Retreats that are less expensive and require fewer
funds than hosting a retreat alone. Therefore the Committee reduced the asking for each group from $\$ 8,000$ to $\$ 6,000$ for 2018. The Committee will continue to monitor these accounts to make sure the funding remains adequate. Additionally, the Committee will also ask the Old Brick Church Commission to determine if there will be a need for the $\$ .50$ for the entire 5 year period. With these reductions and using funds that are not used by other committees, it is believed we will come close to a balanced budget.

## Recommendations:

1. That the churches of the Presbytery be encouraged to support the Denominational Ministry Fund of Synod.
2. That the Rules of Procedure be set aside to consider the addition cited above.
3. That the amendment to the Rules of Procedure be adopted as stated above.
4. That the 2018 Presbytery Budget be adopted as attached.
5. That the report be received as information and printed.

The report of the Committee on Christian Education was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

## REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

The Catawba Presbytery Christian Education Committee met on Monday, August 28 at Union ARP Church, Richburg, SC. The following is a summary of that meeting.

## Reports of past events:

Spring High School Super Retreat - The retreat was held at Bonclarken on March 3-5, 2017. This retreat is a joint effort between Catawba, First and Second Presbyteries. The Retreat theme was Connecting with College Ministries with Rev. Paul Patrick (RUF, Erskine College) as the keynote speaker and Will Milks leading the music.
Spring Middle School Retreat - The retreat was held at Bonclarken on March 24-26, 2017. The retreat theme was Faith as a Gift with Rev. Garison Taylor (Tirzah ARP) being the keynote speaker and Andrew Di lulio leading the music.

## Reports of planned events:

Fall High School Super Retreat - September 22-24, 2017
The retreat will be held at Bonclarken. This retreat is a joint effort between Catawba, First and Second Presbyteries. The theme for the weekend will be Fake or Faithful based on James 1:22. The speaker will be Rev. Andrew Shoger (Coddle Creek ARP). The music will be led by Jeremy Goodwyne.
Children's Retreat - Saturday, October 14, 2017
Hosted by Neely's Creek ARP Church
This retreat is a one day annual offering for grades K-5th. The theme for the retreat is Glow in the Dark based on I John 1:5. All events, activities and games will relate to the theme.

## Fall Middle School Retreat - November 3-5, 2017

The retreat will be held at Bonclarken. The speaker will be TBD (an ordained ARP pastor). The theme is pertaining to Church Planting. The music will be led by the USC-RUF Worship Ensemble.

All of these plans were approved by the Christian Education Committee.

## Other Actions:

We discussed the 2018 budget request.

## REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION

The Committee on Church Extension met on Monday, August 14, 2017 at Bethel ARP Church in Winnsboro, SC. The Committee received updates from our church planters and church-planting intern. The Committee also had a conference call with Rev. Winburne to talk about his ministry at King's Parish and the future viability of it.

Since that meeting, Rev. Winburne has received and accepted a call to pastor the Calhoun ARP church in Calhoun, LA. The Committee believes that Rev. Winburne's departure affects the long-term viability of the mission, therefore, with heavy hearts, the Committee recommends that Presbytery close this work effective September 30, 2017.

The Committee also approved that Ruben Martinez attend the ONA fall assessment meeting. Mr. Martinez is currently located in San Antonio, TX, where he is married and has 3 young daughters. He is a 2016 graduate of Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary, where he had Dr. William VanDoodewaard (ARP minister in the Canadian Presbytery) as a professor. He is bi-lingual (English and Spanish) and has a passion to do confessional, Reformed outreach and ministry to the Hispanic population. He is open to planting in San Antonio or wherever the Lord calls. Mr. Martinez comes recommended to the Committee by Rev. Mike Jones, head of ONA. The Committee would be responsible for paying for the travel costs to and from Bonclarken for the assessment meeting.

The report of the Committee on Outreach was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

## REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON OUTREACH

The Committee on Outreach met on August 29, 2017 at the Arsenal Hill ARP Mission in Columbia, SC

We received a report from Rev. Scott Moore on the IBL ministry:

- Scott stated he was assisting the church to transition from conducting a monthly congregational meeting for church business to where 3 elder candidates would discuss church business and bring information to the provisional session. He is providing training on doctrinal issues to the elder candidates. Scott noted that those under about 20 years of age have English as their first language even though Hispanic while those over 20 had Spanish as their first language.
- Scott stated he began ministry at IBL as the stated supply in October 2016. Since this time several individuals and families who were once part of the church have returned and become active in the church again. Scott will soon begin a Christianity Explored series. Scott spoke of some building needs including a growing lack of space, possibly alleviated by renovation of the upstairs, a larger church sign (a larger temporary sign is now in place), repair of the entrance from the street to the church to remove hazards and other unpleasant appearances.

1. Motion passed unanimously to designate up to $\$ 2,800$ for church entrance improvements. This will come from the Outreach Committee funds designated to IBL ministry.

We received a report from World Witness missionary, Joshua Thomas, who is member of and currently interning at Edwards Memorial ARP Church until next summer. He is assisting with outreach to the Karen people (people group from Myanmar). Josh gave some background on the persecution of the Karen people, a largely Christian people group from Myanmar, who are now in the area as refugees. They want to continue in their Christian faith. Recognizing language difficulties, the church will begin English tutoring classes in September. The church will also continue a youth group on Sunday nights to include the Karen youth and their families. Josh also noted he is assisting some Karen by helping to resolve health issues. Anyone wishing to help with their ESL program please contact Joshua Thomas.

Ali Mitchell gave a report on Muslim outreach at Arsenal Hill. Ali stated the ESL ministry continues and a new semester of lessons is set to begin on September 10th. Mostly Muslim people are receiving instruction and both members and volunteers are assisting in the ministry.

He stated that relationships are forming with church members. Anyone wishing to help with this ESL program may contact Ali.

Word was received that IBL provisional elder Joe Wilson is no longer a member of an ARP church (his membership has been transferred to a local PCA church).

## 1. Motion passed unanimously to recommend removal of Joe Wilson from the provisional

 session of IBL since he is no longer a member of an ARP church.

The report of the Committee on State of the Church was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

## REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE CHURCH

The SOC Committee met at the Union ARP Ch. on August 24. In light of our responsibilities under the Rules of Procedure, we reviewed "the representation and participation" by elder delegates from our congregations "in the higher courts of the church" (E.1.b.) over the last four years. The following motion was adopted: "That since we recognize elder participation to be a vital component of a healthy church and presbytery, we plan on contacting Sessions whose elders have consistently not been able to attend the stated meetings of Presbytery and Synod recently, in order to better understand the challenges they face and at the same time encourage them to make every effort to be more involved." [Note: This action is noted for information, NOT as a recommendation.]

We also discussed the desire to update our awareness of prayer concerns for our smaller and declining congregations after having done a survey in early 2016, and we so we will take steps to do so. To highlight this ongoing need for prayer, the following motion was adopted: "We recommend to Presbytery that we set aside time to pray for our smaller and declining congregations during the Fall meeting of Catawba Presbytery."

Gregory Slater offered prayer for small churches and the challenges they face.
The report of the Commission on the Old Brick Church was presented and RECEIVED AS INFORMATION as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION OF OLD BRICK CHURCH (OBC)
The Commission met on two occasions, 11 May and 10 August 2017, since its last report to Presbytery. The Commission has scheduled its next meeting for 9 November 2017 at Bethel A.R.P. Church in Winnsboro, South Carolina.

Items:
The gravestone preservation work has continued. The approved plan for 2017 has been completed by Fletcher Monuments of West Columbia, South Carolina. It consisted of the repair
of five significantly damaged gravestones of varying types and materials. The Commission has requested from Fletcher Monuments a proposal for work in 2018 through 2020, which the Commission can consider at its next meeting on 9 November 2017. The project should be completed in 2020.

The 11 May 2017 meeting convened at the OBC in western Fairfield County. The Commission conducted some grounds maintenance and clean-up after its business session. This began the task of spraying the stumps and trees in proximity to the graveyard wall to kill the growth, stumps, and its associated roots. Additional applications are planned. This should relieve some pressure and promote the stability of the graveyard wall. Additionally, we had a skid-steer operator work the perimeter of the property with his plow-blade to remove stumps, move some granite blocks, and smooth some areas to facilitate the bush-hogging of this area which accommodates our parking.

In late June '17 the Commission received a request from a prospective groom seeking information about marriage at the OBC. The Commission mailed a copy of the "Marriage Policy for the OBC" to the gentlemen. He has requested a 19 May 2018 wedding date. The prospective groom has no "lineal" ties to the A.R.P. Church, but does have an "historical" tie. His parents own an historic estate in close proximity to the OBC, whose original owner was James Kincaid. James Kincaid was prominent in the founding and leadership of the OBC prior to the birth of the Associate Reformed Synod of the Carolinas at the OBC in 1803. Kincaid died in 1801. The Commission currently has this request under consideration and seeks to make an expeditious decision.

Ronald Beard offered prayer for former Moderator Michael Evans whose cancer has returned and he is preparing to undergo treatments.

The Moderator offered prayer of George Busch and Gentry McColm, two of our ministers also battling cancer.

The Presbytery recessed for lunch provided by the Neely's Creek Church at 12:20 p.m. The blessing for the meal was given by Robert B. Elliott, III.

Presbytery convened again at 1:20 p.m.
Judi Hodges, Training Coordinator for Christian Education Ministry, spoke about her work. She cited statistics on sexual abuse and encouraged churches to be aware and to get training. She encouraged churches to have a policy on sexual misconduct and prevention.

The Memorial from the Good Shepherd Session was considered as follows:
Memorial to Catawba from the Good Shepherd Church Session re: DMF
Thoughts on Churches Giving to our Denominational Ministry Fund
Years ago R.C. Sproul spoke about the difference between morals and ethics. Morals, he said, comes from the root of our word "mores" which describes what the standard is today. No doubt,
we as Christians believe that we are people of high moral standard. But, as Sproul points out, morals are on an ever-descending scale. It is time for us to ask, "Are our high Christian morals of the 21st Century really higher than our non-Christian grandparents of the 1930's?" Our point here is that Christians must not form opinions about their own behavior based upon what the rest of our downwardly spiraling society is doing!
Being a person of higher standards and being a genuine Christian has always meant that the walk must be consistent with the talk. We are not then dealing with morals but rather 'ethics'! Hence we ask the different question, "What ought we to be doing?" The word ethics carries with it the sense of "oughtness," and that is what we are attempting to simply address here.

We, as a Session of an ARP church have observed that there are churches and ministers here who have been erring by negligently avoiding contributing even at the $10 \%$ level to the ARP Denominational Ministry Fund! And we would further assert that in their heart of hearts, that they all already know that. As human beings, we are created uniquely with rational souls and as such we have the ability to rationalize! Here is our appeal to you elders and pastors - go home and make this right immediately - and God will honor that effort. You may not have connected all the dots, but you are probably injuring the ethical fabric of our denomination, and you probably know that already also!

At the 2016 General Synod, we heard the DMF explained as a voluntary commitment. Gentlemen, we would hold that such an explanation is oxymoronic! Connectional churches cannot be committed and voluntary! They can be committed and invested but there is no such entity as committed and voluntary.

We are requesting that the Denominational Ministry Fund be readjusted to a Biblically defensible $10 \%$ and broadcast denomination-wide as a commitment. We also believe that our Presbyteries should be requesting more monetarily. Some of you ask why we have not grown larger as a denomination. Perhaps we are not invested adequately! For example, our present "dues" in Catawba are one-seventh of the amount required when we were in a PCA Presbytery!

A wonderful first step toward productive Christian growth is to jettison hypocrisy, corporately and personally! Men, this is precisely what we need to do regarding the DMF! That is. The way to begin to tithe is to begin to tithe. We disagree strongly with the recommendation that churches should be allowed to incrementally increase by $2 \%$ annually. Men, the harvest is already in the barn! Our appeal is that each of our churches will man-up and do the hard thing here. Please consider that your neglect is most likely damaging the already weakened ethical fiber within our denomination.

We therefore propose that churches which are presently not meeting the $10 \%$ DMF level be granted two years to achieve that end. After this period, churches not achieving the 10\% level shall be recorded as suspended guests and not be granted the privilege of voice or vote at General Synod or at Presbytery. We would additionally propose that the $10 \%$ level be from this year's General Fund giving and not the prior year.

Men, we all know that too much conversation occurs in our churches and presbyteries and yes, even on the floor of Synod. This may well be by people whose churches are not financially committed. It has been our experience that when people are financially invested, then they are willing to become part of the solution and not just a part of the problem. It is our opinion that we may well be wasting time listening to opinions from church representatives that are neither committed nor invested. The toleration of hypocrisy must not find a home in our churches or denomination.

Resolution Requesting Uniform Giving to the Denominational Ministry Fund by all Churches of All Sizes

Whereas ministers and churches of the ARPC must maintain exemplary ethics and Whereas ministers and churches of the ARPC are Presbyterian and connectional by definition and
Whereas many of our churches are not giving to the Denominational Ministry Fund at the 10\% level and
Whereas the omission of an obligation should not be overlooked by godly leaders and Whereas it is the obligation of the ARPC leadership not to overlook non-performance of a commitment

Be it resolved that within two years this problem must be addressed and have a corrective procedure in place.
Be it further resolved that all churches wishing to hold the name ARP be giving at the $10 \%$ level within two years or cease from using the ARP name.
Be it further resolved that those church will be recorded as "Suspended" Should the church not achieve the $10 \%$ level after an additional two years that church will be dropped from our roles. Be it further resolved that all ministers and elders serving in a church not giving at the $10 \%$ level be prohibited from speaking or casting a vote on the floor of General Synod and Presbytery until the giving level of their church to the DMF has been raised to meet the $10 \%$ minimum.
Be it further resolved that no minister or elder may serve on committees on the denominational level until the church that he represents achieves the minimum giving level of $10 \%$.

This resolution is submitted with the understanding that these are appropriate, necessary and yet long overdue measures.

## Three Final Points of Clarification

Point of Clarification \#1: The 10\% level should be given directly to the DMF. Should a church wish to control their funds and give specifically to denominational interests and agencies rather than giving to the DMF, we would accept that (even though we would not consider this "mature giving" in our own churches) so long as their giving to the denomination represents $10 \%$ of their general fund receipts.

Point of Clarification \#2: Question: You say that this is an obligation but many choose to perceive the DMF as a flexible commitment. What do you say to this?
Answer: A flexible commitment is no commitment at all! The DMF is the instrument through which participants in the denomination choose to fund many of the agencies contained therein. The ARPC is a denomination and as such may be perceived as a business with required dues. The DMF is the simple price of admission. Should a church choose to align with the ARP, then the required dues amount is $10 \%$ of the general fund receipts. We would ascribe to the motto The greater the investment of money, the greater the investment of energy. In our own local churches, we have seen this truism in action - those who complain the most are often those that are invested the least.

Point of Clarification \#3: Question: Is this a tithe of a tithe as in the Old Testament? Answer: While the tithe approach could be argued from Scripture, we believe plain common sense would also show the necessity of 10 percent giving to the DMF. There is a sense in which the denomination with its boards and agencies is also a business. We would prefer to see the $10 \%$
as a business obligation. As with any business and even with voluntary businesses (e.g. Rotary International) there are dues required to become a member in good standing. When you cease to pay the required dues, you cease to be a member in good standing. The voluntary aspect comes into effect at joining. Full membership requires the committed investment. We are attempting to clarify that the cost of doing business as an ARP church will be 10\% of the local church's General Fund giving. It is a privilege to be in the ARP and this is the cost of that privilege. It should be understood as a commitment and an investment.

The Memorial was discussed. A motion was offered to postpone the Memorial until the March meeting. The motion FAILED and discussion continued.

A motion was made and ADOPTED to refer the Memorial back to Good Shepherd to reconsider and revise the Memorial to present again at the March meeting.

The report of the Committee on State of the Church on Session Records was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE STATE OF THE CHURCH

4. That the following churches who did not bring session records to this meeting be reminded to bring the records to the __ Spring ___meeting: First Lancaster, Living Waters, Sherwood Forest, Shiloh, Westminster, Blacksburg, Hill City, \& Hope - TX.
5. Other actions:

The Committee would like to highlight two matters from our review to the court. One is that we continue to have a large number of Sessional Records being submitted to the committee in 3 -ring binders, which as we reported in the Spring we do not consider as meeting the standard for a "secure binding" as stated in our Presbytery's Manual of Procedure. (Our Stated Clerk / Administrator has information available on more permanent binders.) Also, a number of Sessions do not indicate in their minutes that they are reviewing the records of the Diaconate at least quarterly as required by our F.O.G. - 6.8.I. and Presbytery's Manual of Procedure.

Also, the "closed" Facebook page for our ministers and elders we proposed to the Spring meeting of Presbytery is now up and running with about 50 members. To join go to "Catawba Presbyters."

Delegates are reminded to pick up your Sessional Records in the room where you left them (\& Faith!!).

The report and supplemental report of the Commission on the Minister and His Work was presented as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK
The Minister \& His Work Commission met on June 22 at the Clover ARP Church and August 31, 2017 at First Presbyterian Church of Columbia.

Matters that were consider included the dissolution of the call of Daniel Wells as pastor of Hill City ARPC effective August 31, 2017 and his transfer to New York State Presbytery (PCA) effective September 1, 2017. The Commission authorized the Clerk of Presbytery to send the transfer to New York State Presbytery (PCA). The Commission dealt with two retirements. The call for Craig Wilkes as Associate Pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Columbia was dissolved by vote of the congregation effective July 31, 2017. Neal Matthias has requested that his call as Associate Pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Columbia be dissolved effective December 31, 2017.

The Commission met with the Pulpit Committee of Clover ARPC and their candidate. A transfer exam was conducted. The terms of call were reviewed and found to be in order. The Commission met with the Pulpit Committee of Calhoun ARPC and their candidate. The candidate and terms of call were examined. The Commission met with Sam Cotten who is desirous to come under care as a student of theology. The Commission also considered a change to the Rules of Procedure dealing with the review of salaries for mission developers. Salary reviews and recommendations for an increase in salary for mission developers are not specifically designated as the responsibility and duty of the provisional session. The Commission appointed Philip Bunch as the interim moderator of Hill City ARP Church.
