TENNESSEE-ALABAMA PRESBYTERY Spring Stated Meeting Pressly Memorial Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church Loango, Alabama March 16-17, 2012

The Tennessee-Alabama Presbytery of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church convened for its Spring Stated Meeting on March 16, 2012, at the Pressly Memorial Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church near Loango, Covington County, Alabama. Presbyters gathered at 3:00 p.m. and were led in prayer by the Moderator of the Presbytery, Reverend Charles F. Edgar. At 3:15 p.m., the Presbyters began their committee meetings. After the committee meetings, the Presbyters and guests enjoyed a meal prepared by the members of the Pressly Memorial congregation.

At 7:00 p.m., the Presbyters, guests, and members of the Pressly Memorial congregation gathered in the church sanctuary for a worship service. The sermon was delivered by Reverend Andrew Putnam, Moderator of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian General Synod. The sacrament of the Lord's Supper was observed during the worship service.

FRIDAY BUSINESS SESSION

Moderator Edgar called the Presbytery to order at 8:00 p.m. The Presbytery was led in prayer for the family of the late Reverend Charles W. Bradley, pastor of the Hopewell Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church and Stated Clerk of the Presbytery, who passed away suddenly on Thanksgiving Day. Greetings on behalf of the host church to the Presbytery were delivered by Ruling Elder Charles Hartin of the Pressly Memorial congregation.

Visitors included Stuart Fowler, John Lamkin (Bethel), Charles Magnum (Hopewell), Scott Mitchell (Bethel), Andy Putnam (Synod Moderator), Rev. Buddy Roberts (PCUSA), and Rabun Williams (stated supply of Bethel, Camden, and Prosperity-AL).

It was moved and seconded that the reading of the minutes of the Fall Stated Meeting be waived and approved as electronically transmitted. The motion carried.

Old Business

Moderator Edgar reported that the contract on the sale of the Cornerstone (Muscle Shoals) property fell through; however, others are interested in the property. There is a new listing contract for the property.

Moderator Edgar made remarks regarding the conclusion of his term as Moderator of the Presbytery. He then introduced Reverend Dana Crowell as the incoming moderator. Moderator Crowell assumed the chair.

The program was presented by the clerk, and, on motion was approved and filed. (See Appendix 1.)

It was moved and seconded that Reverend Putnam, Moderator of the General Synod, be extended the privilege of the floor. The motion carried.

Mr. Stuart Fowler was introduced to the Presbyters. The Bethel, Camden, and Prosperity (Alabama) churches have extended a call to him. Reverend Buddy Roberts was also introduced to the Presbyters. Reverend Roberts is an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and has been supplying the Hopewell pulpit since the untimely death of Reverend Bradley.

It was moved and seconded that all non-delegates be extended the privilege of the floor. The motion carried.

The clerk read requests to be excused from the meeting of Presbytery from Reverend Roy Hulling (Madison-Monrovia), Reverend Greg Duke (Riverside Mission), and Elder Jerry Gooch (Cleveland Street). It was moved and seconded that the requests to be excused from these gentlemen be accepted. The motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was circulated among the members by Elder Ligon. It was moved and seconded that the report be accepted as information. The motion carried. (See Appendix 2.)

Reverend Illman presented the Presbytery with information regarding Jere Scott Bradshaw, a senior at Westminster Theological Seminary in Philadelphia and a licentiate of the Southeast Alabama Presbytery of the Presbyterian Church in America, and the possibility of Mr. Bradshaw's performing a church planting internship with the Riverside Mission. (See Appendix 3.)

There being no further business, the benediction was pronounced and the Presbytery recessed until Saturday morning.

SATURDAY BUSINESS SESSION

The Presbytery reconvened at 8:00 a.m. in the sanctuary of the Pressly Memorial Church with an invocation. For the morning devotion, Mr. Stuart Fowler preached a sermon in accordance with Chapter X, Section D of the Form of Government.

After Mr. Fowler's sermon, three guests from the Pressly Memorial Church were recognized.

The roll for the Saturday business session was constituted. A quorum was present.

At 8:30 a.m., the Presbytery recessed per order of the day for its committees to complete their business.

The Presbytery reconvened at 9:40 a.m. Moderator Putnam of the General Synod presented an update concerning the General Synod.

It was moved and seconded that Reverends Charles Edgar, Garret Aldridge, Gabe Cotton, and Stephen Jordan be certified for the meeting of Synod. The motion carried.

The committees of the Presbytery presented their reports.

Minister and his Work

The report of the Minister and his Work Committee was presented by the committee chairman, Reverend Edgar, and on motion was received as information and filed. (See Appendix 4.)

Mr. Stuart Fowler was presented by Reverend Edgar for his examination by the Presbytery for ordination. Mr. Fowler gave his testimony and witness and answered questions of the Court. It was moved and seconded that Mr. Fowler's examination be sustained. The motion carried.

Reverend Edgar read the Mr. Fowler's call from the Bethel, Camden, and Prosperity (Alabama) congregations. Reverend Edgar, on behalf of the Committee, moved that Mr. Fowler be licensed and ordained to the ministry, conditioned on receipt of a letter of standing from the Calvary Presbytery of the Presbyterian Church in America under which Mr. Fowler is under care. The motion carried. The Moderator will constitute a commission to carry out the ordination and installation of Mr. Fowler.

Outreach Tennessee-Alabama

The report of the Minister and his Work Committee was presented by Reverend Illman and on motion was received as information and filed. (See Appendix 3.)

Reverend Illman, on behalf of the Committee, moved that Presbytery approve the internship proposal for Mr. Jere Scott Bradshaw which will be served at the Riverside Presbyterian Mission, subject to the Learning Contract approved by the Outreach Tennessee-Alabama Committee and Mr. Bradshaw sustaining a licensure examination at the adjourned meeting of Presbytery in June. The motion carried.

Reverend Illman gave an update on the work at the Connections Church, the Riverside Mission, and the Hanmaum Mission.

Stewardship

The report of the Stewardship Committee was presented by Reverend McClung and on motion was received as information and filed. (See Appendix 5.)

Reverend McClung, on behalf of the Committee, moved that any church in Tennessee-Alabama Presbytery not currently financially supporting the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Synod's General Fund prayerfully consider reevaluating its position and to begin providing support. The motion carried.

Reverend McClung, on behalf of the Committee, also moved that those churches in Tennessee-Alabama Presbytery now providing financial support to continue to maintain or increase current levels of financial support of the Synod's General Fund. The motion carried.

Sessional Records

The report of the Moderator's Committee charged with the review of sessional records was presented by the committee chairman, Elder Baggett, and on motion was received as information and filed. (See Appendix 6.)

Nominations

The report of the Nominations Committee was presented by the committee chairman, Elder Fred Hartin, and on motion was received as information and filed. (See Appendix 7.)

- Elder F. Hartin, on behalf of the committee, moved that Elder William Kidd be designated as Tennessee-Alabama Presbytery's representative on Synod's William H. Dunlap Board. The motion was seconded and carried.
- Elder F. Hartin, on behalf of the committee, nominated Reverend Kim for service on Presbytery's Christian Education Committee. The nomination was seconded and carried.
- Elder F. Hartin, on behalf of the committee, moved that Reverend Crowell be designated as the Tennessee-Alabama Presbytery's representative on the Executive Board of Synod. The motion was seconded and carried.
- Elder F. Hartin, on behalf of the committee, nominated Reverend Illman to replace Mr. Steve Weber as chairman of the Outreach Tennessee-Alabama Committee. The nomination was seconded and carried.

The floor was open for nominations for Moderator. Elder Patterson nominated Elder William Kidd of the Fayetteville congregation. There being no other nominations, nominations were closed. Elder William Kidd was elected by acclamation.

The floor was open for nominations for Stated Clerk. There being no nominations, the Presbytery recessed for ten minutes. Upon the Presbytery reconvening, Elder Patterson nominated Elder Scott Mitchell of the Bethel congregation. There being no other nominations, nominations were closed. Elder Scott Mitchell was elected as stated clerk by acclamation.

Resolutions

The report of the Resolutions Committee was approved. Its reading was deferred until the noon meal. (See Appendix 8.)

Moderator Crowell announced the fall and spring meetings of Presbytery.

Moderator Crowell appointed the following Presbyters to the Commission to carry out the ordination and installation of Mr. Stuart Fowler: Moderator Crowell, Reverend Edgar, Reverend McClung, Elder Max Baggett, Elder Fred Hartin, Elder Curtis Mitchell, and Elder Bernard Sanderson.


The Presbytery observed a season or prayer for matters of concern, including

- o The son-in-law and daughter of Reverend Roy Hulling
- o Thanksgiving for the call of Mr. Stuart Fowler as pastor of the Bethel, Camden, and Prosperity (Alabama) congregations.

It was moved and seconded that Elder Charles Mangum be commended for his work as the interim stated clerk. The motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that the pulpit of the Hopewell Church be declared empty. The motion carried.

DESCRIPTION OF OFFICIAL SEAL

The seal of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church expresses through symbolism the basic convictions of the denomination.

The SHIELD, the basic form of the seal, is an emblem signifying complete faith, or trust, in God as Paul suggests in Ephesians 6:16.

The CROSS forms the central emphasis of the seal, and represents the Person and the sacrificial redemptive work of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the Living Word. The Celtic cross is suggestive of our roots in Scottish Christian history.

The CIRCLE (or nimbus) is emblematic of eternity, and was used in Medieval symbolism to represent God the Father. Here the nimbus additionally signifies the eternal benefit of the redemption secured on the cross by the death of Jesus Christ.

The descending DOVE represents the presence of the Holy Spirit (Matthew 3:16) as He witnesses to the Church and through the Church to the world.

Through these three symbols (the Nimbus, the Cross, the Dove) witness is given to the living presence of the Trinity - the Father, the Son, the Holy Spirit - in the Church.

The BOOK at the bottom of the shield represents the Bible - the written word of God. The BURNING BUSH (Exodus 3:2) on the left or Old Testament page suggests the indestructibility of God's word; the monograms, ALPHA and OMEGA, on the right or New Testament page, symbolize the final authority of Jesus Christ who has declared Himself to be "the beginning and the ending" (Revelation 1:8), revealed through the written word.

The SCROLL beneath the shield bears the motto, "In Thy Light Shall We See Light:" (Psalms 36:9).

The colors are chosen for their meaning as well. BLUE, traditionally expressive of fidelity, appropriately colors the "shield of faith" and the unconsumed bush. The GOLD suggests royalty and wealth - on the cross, it particularly suggests the royalty and wealth of Jesus Christ. RED is the color of sacrifice and the blood of Christ - precisely the costly sacrifice of Christ by which man's redemption is secured. WHITE suggests purity - the sinless purity of Him whom God "hath made to be sin for us who knew no sin" (II Corinthians 5:21).

Riverside Church Planting Internship Proposal

Description

Riverside Church (Prattville, AL) would like to begin a Church Planting Internship for Jere Scott Bradshaw. Jere Scott will complete his seminary training (MDIC WTS Philadelphia) this spring and has expressed interest in church planting within the bounds of our Presbytery. He was assessed by the Presbyterian Church in America's Assessment Center summer 2011. It was recommended that Jere Scott do a church planting internship for a year to strengthen areas of weakness in preaching and evangelism. If approved, Riverside Mission would serve as the sponsoring church and provide oversight and training as Jere Scott continues developing a plan for a new ARP Church in our Presbytery.

Training, Preparation, and Mentoring

Pastor Greg Duke of Riverside Church will mentor Jere Scott and coach him through the process of developing vision, goals and objectives. During the internship, Jere Scott would be given the opportunity to lead worship at Riverside, assist with community group development/outreach events and other pastoral work as we work with Tenn/AL Presbytery to determine the best location for a new work.

Learning Contract (see attached)

Financial Support

Total resources needed to support the internship/residency are \$45,000.

CALL TO STUART FRANKLIN FOWLER AS PASTOR OF BETHEL, CAMDEN, AND PROSPERITY ASSOCIATE REFORMED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCHES

We, the officers and members of the Bethel, Camden, and Prosperity Associate Reformed Presbyterian Churches of Oak Hill, Camden, and Marion Junction, Alabama, being well satisfied with your ministerial qualifications, and confident that we have been led to you by the Holy Spirit as one whose ministry will be profitable to our spiritual interest, do earnestly call you, Stuart Franklin Fowler, to undertake the office of pastor of these congregations. 4. Educational expenses for two children at Wilcox Academy, covering a one-time Foundation fee, registration fee for each child, and tuition.

5. Reimbursement of \$100 per month for pastoral hospitality.

- 6. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod. 7. Directly pay the premiums for a health and dental insurance package for the pastor and his family.
- 8. The Churches provide the cost of Life, Long Term Disability and Accidental Death Coverage as provided by and required by the General Synod.

9. Review with pastor annually the adequacy of this compensation as a part of the yearly performance review.

- 10. Grant the pastor an annual vacation of four weeks, to be approved by the Sessions, not to exceed four Sundays. This includes attendance at the General Synod meeting.
- 11. Reimburse expenses for General Synod and Tennessee-Alabama Presbytery meetings. 12. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise: To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.

13. In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise:

To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for a minimum of three months.
