The call present to Mr. Cotten was approved by the Commission and will be read as information at the October meeting. The terms of the call are as follows:

That you may devote yourself wholly to the Ministry of the Word as you begin your ministry on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of June 2021, we promise and obligate ourselves to:

1. Basic compensation:
  - a. Salary \$ 40,341.05
  - b. Provide you with housing as needed for your family and in accordance with the World Witness housing policies.
2. Pay your travel expenses associated with your ministry abroad in accordance with World Witness Policies.
3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Defined Contribution Plan as prescribed by the General Synod.
4. The Board provides 100 percent of the premiums for mandatory health and dental for World Witness employees (including spouses and dependents).
5. Provide for continuing education according to the World Witness Board's approved annual budget as it relates to the World Witness Manual and Missionary Handbook.
6. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the Board shall be encouraged to consider an increase to the previous year's base compensation.
7. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.
8. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod if you are in the United States at the time of the meeting.
9. Reimburse your monthly expenses as outlined in the World Witness Policy Manual and Missionary Handbook.
10. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
  - a.   X   To continue **for a minimum of three months** the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
11. In the event you should die during the terms of this call, we promise:
  - a.   X   To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for your immediate family **for a minimum of three months.**

The meeting was adjourned with the benediction by Rev. Samuel W. Cotten.

## **SECTION 1 – CONSENT AGENDA REPORTS**

### **APPROVED IN BEHALF OF PRESBYTERY BY THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE ON SEPTEMBER 18, 2021**

#### **REPORT OF THE STATED CLERK/ADMINISTRATOR**

##### **Information:**

- Word was received about the passing on May 28, 2021 of Rev. Jan Senneker, retired minister in our Presbytery. The sympathy of the Presbytery is extended to the Senneker family. R, Boyce Wilson prepared the tribute for the 2022 meeting of General Synod. A copy of the tribute is attached.
- Following the procedure outlined in the Rules of Procedure XI that outlines the closing of a church, an email was received from Eric Smith, Clerk of the Hope Church, Pearland, TX. The Hope Session followed the procedure and held a congregational meeting on July 18, 2021 and voted 7-0 to request that Presbytery dissolve the Hope congregation effective December 31,2021. Moderator John Rogers was informed of this request and following the procedure outline appointed the following Ad Hoc Committee to close the Hope Church: Calvin Draffin, Chairman, Jamey Dagenhart, T. C. S. {Buddy} Lever; William {Buzzy} Elder and Steve Maloney. A report from the Ad Hoc Committee will be made to Presbytery for final action.
- At the direction of the Chairman of the Credentials Commission Ethan McConnell was removed as a student under our care effective August 28, 2021. Ethan is preparing to be licensed by the PCA Church.
- The Moderator and Stated Clerk received a copy of the letter from Mr. Eric Ruschky, Counsel for Mr. Jeffrey Prato, concerning the Complaint vs. First Columbia filed with the Presbytery on March 6, 2019. The inquiry concerns the progress of the Complaint stating that its progress is too slow and that the Complaint needs to be resolved. A copy of the letter also was sent to the Judicial Commission handling the Complaint.

**JAN SENNEKER**  
**February 15, 1937 – May 28, 2021**

Jan Senneker was born February 15, 1937 a son of Durk and Helen Koster Senneker in Friesland, the Netherlands. He grew up in the GKN Church in the Netherlands.

He was a graduate of Reformed Bible College, Grand Rapids, Michigan, after which he served as a missionary to Victoria, Australia (1960-1965). He then graduated from Covenant College and Covenant Theological Seminary. During seminary he supplied the Elsberry ARP Church.

He was ordained to the Gospel ministry by the Reformed Presbyterian Church Evangelical Synod in Baltimore, Maryland, in June 1972 after which he served as pastor of the Evangelical Presbyterian Church in that same city. In 1976 he joined the ARPC when he became pastor of the Community Chapel-By-The-Sea in Melbourne Beach, Florida. In God's providence he served that church twice as pastor (1976-81 and 1990-99). From 1981-90 he was pastor of the Neely's Creek ARP Church, Rock Hill, SC. When he retired from full time ministry in 1999, he and his wife made their home at the Neely's Creek retirement village, which he had been instrumental in founding. In retirement he served as supply and then pastor of Tirzah ARP Church for several years, as well as stated supply of a number of churches in Catawba Presbytery.

He was Vice-Moderator of the ARP Synod in 1983 and he served a term as chair of the Board of World Witness. He was also an active participant in the work of both Florida and Catawba Presbyteries.

Jan married Ruth Baas Senneker in September 1959 and they were married for fifty-seven years until her death January 2, 2017. Two of their children preceded them in death: Daniel and Judith. His surviving children are Linda Butler and Valerie Wingo, both of Georgia. Jan and Ruth were a great source of blessing to many

through their years of ministry together. Much spiritual fruit abides from their labors.

Jan Senneker was a faithful preacher of the Word of God and a caring pastor to his flocks. He was well liked by all ages. First and foremost, he was an evangelist with a great concern for everyone he met that they would come to know and love the Lord Jesus Christ as their Savior. Jan Senneker will be missed by all who knew and loved him.

### **REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON COMMITMENT AND FINANCE**

**Presbytery Assessment:** The Presbytery assessment for 2022 will be \$15.00 per communicant member, the same as last year. The \$15.00 will be disbursed as \$10.95 for Church Extension, \$4.05 for Presbytery operations.

**Reminder:** The Presbytery Assessment is based on the figure reported by each session in the annual Statistical Report to Synod as of December 31st and recorded in the current Minutes of Synod 24 under the statistical tables. It is this report of the Church's communicant membership that is used to calculate the Presbytery Assessment.

**Denominational Ministry Fund:** The Committee receives a summary of the annual Statistical Reports and has oversight of the Denominational Ministry Fund in the Presbytery. The summary for the giving to the Denominational Ministry Fund is as follows: 20% Giving 1 Church; Increase

Dollar Giving 16 Churches; Decrease Dollar Giving 9 Churches; Same Dollar Giving 14; Making No Commitment 8 Churches/Missions.

We strongly encourage churches and missions not participating in this important Synod ministry to begin participating. We also encourage all churches in our Presbytery to strive to reach a higher level of giving.

**Treasurer’s’ Book Review:** The Committee encourages Congregational Treasurer’s Books to be reviewed every three years. The Presbytery Rules of Procedure provides helpful guidelines for a review in Appendix Article XIV, E.

**2022 Budget:** Budget requests were received from the various committee of the Presbytery. It is the goal of the Committee to maintain a balanced budget.

**Recommendations:**

1. That the churches of the Presbytery be encouraged to support the Denominational Ministry Fund of Synod.
2. That the 2022 Presbytery Budget be adopted as attached.
3. That the report be received as information and printed in the Minutes of Catawba Presbytery.

## **REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHRISTIAN EDUCATION**

The Catawba Presbytery Christian Education Committee met on Monday, August 23, 2021 at Edgemoor ARP Church, Edgemoor, S.C. The following is a summary of that meeting.

### **Reports of past events:**

- The Middle School Retreat took place on March 26-28, 2021 at Bonclarken with Rev. Josh Hjemvic as the speaker and Dustin Ashenfelder as the musician. 9 churches were represented, and there were 146 attendees.
- The Senior Adult Retreat took place at First Columbia on March 19, 2021 with Dr. Mark Ross and Rev. Mark Miller as speakers. 8 churches were represented, and there were 123 attendees.
- The Senior High Retreat took place on March 5-7, 2021 at Bonclarken with Rev. Dean Franklin as the speaker and Dustin Ashenfelder as the musician. 11 churches were represented with 100 attendees.

### **Reports of planned events:**

- The Senior High Retreat will be September 24-26 at Bonclarken along with First, Second, and Grace Presbyteries. The committee approved the Rev. Mark Miller as the speaker and Dustin Ashenfelder was approved as the musician.
- The Middle School Retreat will be held November 5-7 at Bonclarken. The committee approved the Rev. Matt Kuiken as the speaker and Dustin Ashenfelder as the musician.
- The Senior Adult Day will on March 18, 2022 at First Columbia. Dr. Iain Duguid will be the speaker.
- The Children's Retreat is tentatively scheduled for November 20, 2021 at Tirzah ARP, pending approval of the Tirzah session. The Rev. Jordan Bernard was approved as the speaker and Chris Holder as the musician.

Discussion was held concerning how and where to disperse and redistribute the \$4,819.20 balance from the Children's Account which has been closed. Brad Anderson, Rev. Jordan Bernard, Rev. Ransom Kent, Mr. Josh Valentine, and Rev. Jonathan Williams.

**REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON THE OLD BRICK CHURCH (OBC)**  
**TO CATAWBA PRESBYTERY**  
**ASSOCIATE REFORMED PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH SYNOD**

The Commission on the Old Brick Church (OBC) met via ZOOM on Tuesday, 24 August 2021, the first time it has met since our last in-person meeting on 12 February 2020, prior to the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic and the unexpected death of our late chairman, Mr. Oliver R. Johnson, on 20 March 2020. Because it has been even longer since the Commission last reported to Presbytery, a report of the Commission's activities is long overdue.

While we have not met in person or via ZOOM until 24 August 2021, the necessary work of the Commission has been carried out in person, by email, or through telephone communication. This work has included lawn maintenance and minor repair on the building. The Commission has not scheduled its next meeting, but it will most likely be via ZOOM given the current rapid and significant rise in Delta Variant COVID-19 cases in South Carolina and beyond.

**Commission Membership Updates:**

Rev. Elliott was appointed as convener and elected as Chairman of the Commission.

History

The Commission was provided materials received by the Stated Clerk of Presbytery. Since that time the Commission has received additional materials from other sources.

At the time the Commission began its work, Rev. Brycko's status was suspended pending investigation.

The Commission convened its first meeting on January 12, 2021 and has met 10 additional times since then to investigate these matters.

On May 12, 2021, the Commission became aware that Rev. Brycko had become a member of the Lithuanian Evangelical Reformed Church as a lay member.

Upon review of the Book of Discipline of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, and in particular Chapter VIII, A.1, the Commission has assured itself that Rev. Brycko "has united himself with another denomination without a letter of transfer."

It is the opinion of this Commission that in so doing, Rev. Brycko has withdrawn and satisfied the conditions of this section of the Book of Discipline.

Decision

THEREFORE, it is the unanimous decision of this Commission that Rev. Brycko's name be removed from the roll of Catawba Presbytery and that his ministerial standing be listed as demitted under investigation effective January 16, 2021 and no longer ordained in the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church.

The Report of the Credentials Commission was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

**REPORT OF THE CREDENTIALS COMMISSION ON THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK**

The Credentials Commission of the Catawba Presbytery has several items of information that can be found below. **Please note that several of these informational items may require a supplemental report with request for action.**

- 1) Recently, our students under care have been in transition. We have received several students and seen off several students, too. In one sense, this student "overturn" is to be expected. In another sense, the Commission is currently praying that God will allow us (and the presbytery) to see more men come into our fellowship.
- 2) The Commission is recommending four men to come under care of presbytery. These men are as follows: Nate Cesky (First Pres Cola), Troy Cash (First Pres Cola), Ryan Gladden (Tirzah), and Andrew George (Faith Fellowship)
- 3) There are no students under care ready to be examined on the floor of Presbytery.
- 4) There have been no requests of the Commission to examine ministers for transfer.
- 5) The Commission continues its work on the licentiate exam. The theology portion is completed and in use while the other portions are now under active construction. The goal remains the same: comprehensive coverage of that which we confess while not drowning any student in complexity. The examination process is starting to coalesce in a way that allows the Commission to better assess (discern) where men seeking ordained ministry are weakest and strongest regarding our confessional standards as well as pure biblical and practical knowledge.

- 6) The Commission is desirous to care for the students of the presbytery in many ways. One such way being considered and moved on is a book stipend. Take note of this as an emphasis when reviewing the budget request of the Credentials Commission.
- 7) The Credentials Commission continues to seek to undertake a more hands-on approach of pastoral care with the students in the presbytery. As fellow under shepherds of the sheep, y'all know this is never as simple as it sounds. Continue to pray for these endeavors.

- 1) That if the way be clear, the Presbytery receive Nate Cesky, Troy Cash, Ryan Gladden, and Andrew George as students under care of Catawba Presbytery.

The Moderator then conducted the Service of Recognition, requested Jeremiah Thomas to pray for the students and directed that their names be added to the roll of Presbytery as students.

The report of the Committee on Church Extension was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

**REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION**

The report of the Credentials Commission on the Minister and His Work was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

The Committee on Church Extension met twice since General Synod, on July 27, 2021 and on September 2, 2021. Both times at 6:30pm at 1<sup>st</sup> ARP Church of Rock Hill, South Carolina.

Our first meeting was opened with prayer by the new chairman of Catawba Church Extension, Rev. Benjamin Glaser.

We received a report on the ongoing situation with Rev. Leon Brown and his work as an evangelist in Los Angeles. He continues to do the work he is called to do. Prayer was held for Rev. Brown. Introductions were then made for all new members of the committee.

A request received from Arsenal Hill Mission to ask ONA for a Personnel Grant of \$6,000 was discussed. It was moved by Rev. Matt Awtrey and seconded by Bill Jackman to approve the request. It passed.

The Committee then received an informational report from Rev. Ben Carver concerning an idea for a church planting internship program at Shem Creek ARP Church. The idea would be for Shem Creek to look for and hire a man interested in learning on the job the requirements and duties of church planting for a year with the idea that this person would be being evaluated and groomed to plant an ARP church in Catawba Presbytery in the future. Finances would be broken down: \$20,000 from Shem Creek, \$20,000 from Catawba Presbytery, and the individual would be required to raise \$20,000 for a total package of \$60,000/year. It was moved by Rev. Matt Awtrey and seconded by Henry Jarman to approve Shem Creek to continue to do research and the leg work to put it into place. It was passed.

The Committee then met with Rev. Howard Cole, a man interested in planting a church in Indian Land, South Carolina. After introductions we heard of Rev. Cole's background, interest in planting, and more about his plan. It was decided to meet again with Rev. Cole and his planting partner, the Rev. Darol Timberlake. Rev.'s Cole and Timberlake are currently PCA ministers, Rev. Cole is without call and Rev. Timberlake is Associate Pastor of Church of the Redeemer PCA in Indian Trail, North Carolina. Both men are currently bi-vocational (Rev. Cole is a Nurse Manager at Atrium Health and Rev. Timberlake is a Systems Administrator for Microsoft) and both would be seeking to plant bi-vocationally.

Having no other business to perform, it was moved by Rev. Awtrey to adjourn, seconded by Greg Delleney. Henry Jarman closed us in prayer.

Our second meeting began with prayer by Rev. Glaser.

We met with Rev. Howard Cole and Rev. Darol Timberlake for a second time (first time for Rev. Timberlake), who are interested in planting a church in Indian Land, South Carolina. Questions were asked about why they feel called to plant an ARP church, why that location, and their experience in personal evangelism and church planting. No business is currently on the floor concerning this matter. The committee will continue to meet with Rev's. Cole and Timberlake and explore the work further.

We then met with Rev. Justin Brickey and received an update on the situation at IBL. After hearing of good attendance and an interest in one-day soon becoming established we paused for prayer, led by Bill Jackman, for IBL.

We then received a request from King's Church for continued support of their intern, Josh Smith. They would ask that the Presbytery give \$50,000 over three years in one-lump sum to fund



operations. Josh Smith has already raised \$180,000 in gifts and pledges for the three years of his internship. As part of this request Catawba Presbytery would seek an additional \$50,000 from Outreach North America as a matching grant for King's Creek. Rev. Matt Awtrey and Josh Smith were excused from the meeting for discussion. It was moved by Greg Delleney and seconded by Glen McFadden to approve the request. It was passed.

Having no other business, it was moved by Rev. Matt Awtrey and seconded by Henry Jarman to adjourn. It passed. The meeting was closed with prayer by Glen McFadden.

**Recommendations:**

1. That Presbytery approve the request of Arsenal Hill Mission to ask ONA for a Personnel Grant of \$6,000.
2. That Presbytery approve the request of King's Church for a \$50,000 one-time payment for continued operations.

The Ad Hoc Committee appointed by the Moderator according to the Rules of Procedure to act on the request of the Hope, TX session presented its report that was ADOPTED as follows:

**AD HOC COMMITTEE TO CLOSE THE HOPE CHURCH, PEARLAND, TX**

The Committee met on Tuesday, August 17<sup>th</sup> at First ARP Church in Rock Hill, SC. Committee members Buzzy Elder, Steve Maloney, Buddy Lever, Jamey Dagenhart and Calvin Draffin as Chairman. All were present for the meeting.

The Committee met at 7:30 PM. We had received communication from the Stated Clerk that the Hope Church held a congregational meeting on July 18, 2021, and voted to dissolve the church on December 31, 2021. The Committee discussed the procedure for dissolving a congregation and at 8:00 PM we had a Zoom meeting with representatives from the Hope Church. Members from Hope Church included Pastor Marty Taylor, Mark Smith and Eric Smith.

After discussion the Committee determined that the Hope Congregation had:

1. Made efforts to determine if alternatives to closing had been explored but they were not able to see a viable alternative.
2. Decided to close due to declining membership.
3. Made plans to deal with property that needs to be sold. When sold they will pay ONA what is owed and with the remaining funds, they want to make contributions to missionaries they have been supporting and perhaps others who have aided them.  
Note: Lisa Renfro, Treasurer at Good Shepherd Church, is also handling the finances for Hope Church.
4. Determined that they have sufficient funds to continue paying salaries and other expenses until the end of the year.

It is the opinion of the Ad Hoc Committee that the Pastor and officers of Hope Church have made good plans toward properly closing the church. We commend them for the manner in which they are preparing for this closing and for the spiritual care that they are providing for the remaining membership.
