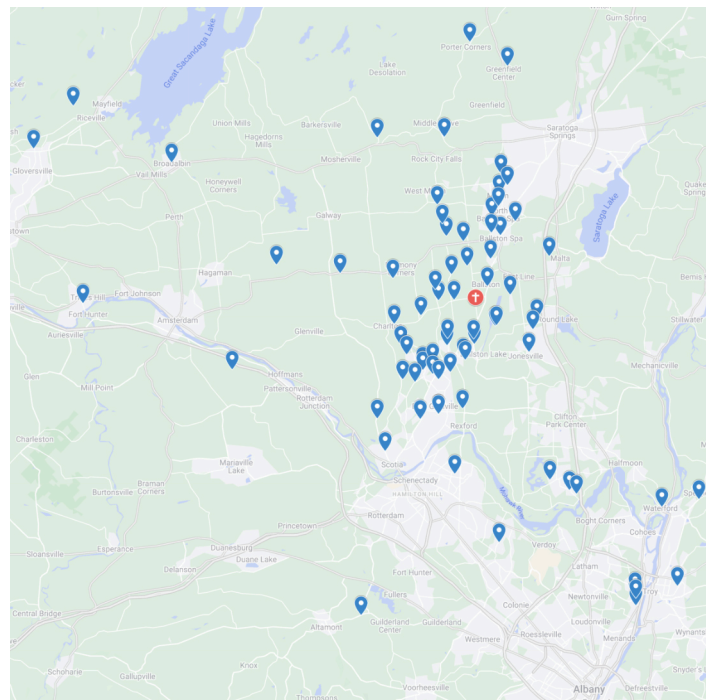

Our church is located in a rural setting with nearby suburban communities. For the purpose of the joyful worship of God in Christian fellowship, Reverend Eliphalet Ball and a small group of settlers founded Ballston Center Church in 1775. In 1974, the congregation changed its affiliation from the United Presbyterian Church to the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church to more closely adhere to biblical truth as understood in our reformed and presbyterian heritage. We have welcomed a congregation of members and visitors for almost 250 years, and today we have 130 active members with 10 regular visitors.

Candidate Requirements

- + Ordained (or able/willing to be ordained) in the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church
- + Demonstrated history of elder qualifications as outlined in 1 Timothy 3:1-7, Titus 1:6-9
- + Called to learn, understand, and minister to the needs of our congregation at this particular time and place
- + Pursues the Lord in prayer, study, and daily spiritual disciplines

Responsibilities and Priorities

- + Proclaim the Gospel effectively, exposit the Bible clearly, and preach the whole counsel of God
- + Cast a vision of corporate worship and ministry to strengthen and unify our covenant family members
- + Guide the Session in ministry decisions through a theological framework
- + Work with the Session to refine the vision, mission, and core values of Ballston Center Church, and embody them in daily life
- + Cultivate family ministry (parental equipping, marriage encouragement, household worship)
- + Teach how to biblically, theologically, evangelistically, and apologetically engage with secular mores and heresies prevalent today
- + Work to build meaningful relationships with all members of the congregation

Desired Experience and Strengths

- + 3+ years of pastoral leadership or seminary graduate with 10+ years of marketplace work experience or equivalent
- + Anchored in the Bible, reformed theology and doctrine, creeds, confessions, Puritans, and church fathers
- + Have overseen, guided, or participated in musical elements of a worship service or the development of such ministry
- + Biblical counseling, conflict resolution, reconciliation, and healing
