REPORT OF THE STATED CLERK/ADMINISTRATOR

Information:

1. At the instruction of the Chairman of the Commission two transfers were sent:
 - a. Robert E. Patrick, III effective May 1, 2006 to Florida Presbytery. Rob's last day as pastor at Clover was April 30, 2006
 - b. David L. Arthur effective April 22, 2006 to Tennessee Valley Presbytery, PCA.
2. In Memorial Number 1 approved at the March meeting to submit to Synod concerning "a call to a minister working in an occupation elsewhere and still being able to serve a church", the Committee on the Minister and His Work for Synod has requested an editorial change by changing the word "information" to "provisions". At the request of the Moderator, John Basie, Chairman of Church Extension, led in prayer for the various missions of our Presbytery.

The Supplemental report of the Committee on Church Extension was presented as follows:

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION

The Church Extension Committee met on May 11 and decided to return to the Christ Church of Habersham and present the following:

- After considering the progress after two years, the committee does not believe the work will succeed in the Habersham community.
- The group will meet for two more worship services in the current location for adequate closure for the people.
- The group will then meet as a home Bible study group and continue to gather more people.

- Mike Basie will conduct a demographic study of the Beaufort area during the remainder of his internship (five weeks), to determine the potential for continuing the work. This information will be utilized in making a final decision.

The committee feels that the future of the Habersham work is in strong doubt and anticipates the closing of this work. If the demographic study shows the Beaufort area (other than Habersham) has good potential, we would then present a proposal for a new work in that area.

Providence Mission: The Church Extension Committee approved this motion to present to Presbytery for approval:

A motion was made and adopted requesting approval of the Presbytery for Providence Mission to enter into an option agreement with Rev. Richard Brown and Mr. Jay Satterfield to have the opportunity to purchase the property of approximately one acre located at the intersection of US Hwy. 41 and Bennett Charles Road at the original purchase price, plus reimbursement of net out of pocket cost. For this option, Providence Presbyterian Church ARP will pay to the Rev. Richard Brown and Mr. Jay Satterfield the total sum of \$100.00. Elder Wingate stated he will develop the document as outlined above, in a manner to make it legally sufficient.

Recommendations:

1. That Presbytery receive this portion of this report concerning the Habersham work as information and continue to pray for the committee as the future of this work is determined.
2. That the motion approved by the Church Extension Committee concerning the Providence Mission be approved by Presbytery.

Recommendation 1 was ADOPTED.

An amendment was offered to Recommendation 2 that Catawba Presbytery on behalf of the Providence Mission enter into the agreement concerning the land held by Mr. Brown and Mr. Satterfield. The amendment was ADOPTED.

A motion was made and ADOPTED to refer Recommendation 2 as amended back to the Church Extension Committee until such time as the agreement with all the details as to price, etc. is prepared and presented to the Presbytery.

The report of the State of the Church Committee was presented and RECEIVED AS INFORMATION as follows:

REPORT OF THE STATE OF THE CHURCH COMMITTEE

The Committee has met once since the Spring, 2006, meeting of Presbytery. We are still developing a “list of resources for the care of pastors and their families” and hope to have the initial posting available online very soon. The Committee continues to welcome suggestions of other resources (various professionals, web-sites, books, conferences, etc.) for helping pastors and their families dealing with various types of crises.

As the Committee notified Presbytery at the Spring meeting, our review of the Annual Reports for 2005 raised the issue of an apparent widespread and ongoing decline in the active membership of many of the churches of the Presbytery (over the last ten years for example.) Rather than simply summarizing the raw

data, we believe that the Committee should seek to identify the relevant contributing factors in order to highlight those that are most common and most readily addressed.

Members of the Committee continue to seek to reach out in a pastoral manner to a number of our pastors and churches who are in challenging circumstances. Please pray that the Lord would give us wisdom and use us in this ministry.

The Committee has no recommendations at this time.

The report of the Commission on the Minister and His Work and the Supplement Report were presented as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK

The Commission met on May 1, 2006 at First Rock Hill to handle several items of business.

Items:

A. The Commission discussed a request from Ben Smith, a student of theology, that he be allowed to accept a part time position with the Trinity P.C.A. church in Van Wyck. The Commission approved his request.

B. The Commission discussed a request from Brian Phipps that he be released from ministry in the A.R.P. Church without censure. He plans to begin a Mission Church in the Steele Creek area in North Carolina with an independent church. He does not desire to give up his ordination.

C. The Commission discussed a request from Second Presbytery that Stephane Cobbert be allowed to labor in their presbytery as an intern working towards planting a mission church. Since Stephane already has permission to Labor outside the Bounds of presbytery no additional permission is needed.

D. The Commission discussed the referral from Presbytery concerning setting 80% as a passing grade for student exams. The commission felt that the candidate's responses to the written exam can be more clearly quantified and will work toward an objective evaluation of this section of the exam process. However, the oral part of the process (both before the commission and specially before Presbytery) is almost impossible to grade accurately to a specific numeric grade. The commission also agreed with inputs it has received from Presbytery ministers that while numeric scores can be helpful, the real final decision on recommending a new minister is based on an overall evaluation of whether we feel the man has a heart for the Lord, His church and the congregation; and if he can put this into practice. A numeric score can not make this evaluation. It needs to be a decision by the heart of the commission and members of Presbytery based on all inputs (written exam answers, student sermons, and responses to questions).

E. The Commission also discussed the need for Seminaries to better prepare students in the area of A.R.P. History and Polity. Students need a better understanding of our Standards and how to apply that information to the local church setting.

F. A member of Presbytery has contacted, and met with the Commission, concerning his actions over a long period of time. The member of Presbytery has confessed his actions, is repentant of those actions, is presently in counseling, and seeks forgiveness and reconciliation. There are two different offences involved that will lead to two separate charges against him.

From the Book of Discipline we learn, “The basis of all church discipline is the free love of God in Christ expressed in both mercy and judgment. The purpose of discipline is to bring the reconciliation of man to God and man to man and to engage the people of God in the ministry of reconciliation, and to promote the peace, purity, and edification of the Church.”

The Commission has determined that both offences are of “general nature” and “private.” Few people know of either offence. The Book of Discipline, Chapter 5, A, 7 states, “Before proceeding with any judicial process, the court, or a committee appointed by the court, should seek by private conference with the accused to avoid, if possible, the need for actual judicial process.” Also No. 8 states, “If the offender confesses, the way is clear for the court either to restore him or to impose such censure as the welfare of the offender and / or the Church may require.”

The Commission feels that the proper way of handling both of the charges against the brother is by private means. We believe that it would be best for the Church, Presbytery, and the brother’s family if this is done by the Commission.

G. The Commission met with the Pulpit Search Committee from Hickory Grove and Smyrna to examine their Call to Mr. Jim Mitchell. The Call was found to be in order. The Commission also met with Mr. Mitchell, a Licentiate of First Presbytery, and examined him for transfer. The Commission approved Mr. Mitchell’s examination.

H. The Commission met with the Pulpit Search Committee from Tirzah to examine their Call to Rev. Bob Elliott as Associate Pastor. The Call for Associate Pastor was found to be in order. The Commission also met with Rev. Elliott and examined him for transfer from Second Presbytery. The Commission approved Mr. Elliott’s examination.

I. The Commission met with the Pulpit Search Committee from Living Waters to examine their Call to Mr. Brian Howard, a Licentiate of Catawba Presbytery. The Call was found to be in order.

The Commission also met with members of the Living Waters Congregation as well as Rev. Bill Babson. The Commission felt that it was in the best interest of the Congregation to go ahead with their Call for an Associate Pastor even though Rev. Babson has tendered his resignation. Rev. Babson has asked that the Pastoral relationship between him and the Living Waters Church be dissolved effective July 1, and that he be removed from the Roll of Presbytery without censure.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That this report be received as information.
2. That Brian Phipps name be removed from the Roll of Presbytery without censure effective June 6, 2006.
3. That the written exam be quantified so that it reflects an objective score.
4. That Erskine and Reformed Seminaries be requested to offer a thorough course on A.R.P. History and polity for our students.
5. That the Commission on the Minister and His Work be elected as a Judicial Commission, to act on behalf of Presbytery in a Judicial Case against a member of Presbytery, in order for it to be handled privately.
6. That the Call from Hickory Grove and Smyrna for Mr. Jim Mitchell be read and approved.
7. That Mr. Jim Mitchell be examined for transfer from First Presbytery, that Presbytery recess after the meeting of the General Synod to be reconvened at the Hickory Grove Church on June 11, 2006 at 6:00 p.m. for the Ordination and Installation of Mr. Mitchell, that the Call from the Hickory Grove and Smyrna Churches be presented to him at that time, and that his name be entered on the Roll of Presbytery.

8. That the Call for Associate Pastor from Tirzah for Rev. Bob Elliott be read and approved.
9. That Rev. Bob Elliott be examined for transfer from Second Presbytery, that his name be entered on the Roll of Presbytery upon receipt of his transfer, that the Call as Associate Pastor from Tirzah be presented to him and that a service of installation be conducted with the approval of the Commission Chairman.
10. That the Call from Living Waters to Mr. Brian Howard as Associate Pastor be read and approved, and that a Presbytery Meeting be called at 4:00 p.m. on June 25 at the Living Waters meeting at Bethel Elementary School, Clover, SC in order to Ordain and Install Mr. Howard, and that the Call be presented to him at that time, and his name be entered on the Roll of Presbytery.
11. That Bill Babson's name be removed from the Roll of Presbytery without censure effective July 1, 2006.
12. That Mr. Andrew Stager be received as a student of theology under care of Catawba Presbytery and that a Service of Recognition be conducted by the Moderator.

Recommendation 1 was ADOPTED.

Recommendation 2 was presented.

Discussion followed on Recommendation 2 concerning the need for the Commission in behalf of the Presbytery to show pastoral care toward Mr. Phipps and Mr. Babson. There was also discussion as to whether or not Mr. Phipps and Mr. Babson understood that being removed from the roll without censure meant also being divested of their ordination since there was no corresponding body to whom they could be transferred. A motion was made in light of the discussion that Recommendations 2 and 11 be referred back to the Commission. The motion was ADOPTED with the understanding that the Commission could remove them from the roll if they understood about the ordination or, if necessary, the Commission could request a called meeting of the Presbytery.

Recommendation 3 was ADOPTED.

Recommendation 4 was ADOPTED

Recommendation 5 was ADOPTED.

Recommendation 6 was ADOPTED.

The Calls from the Smyrna and Hickory Grove Churches for Mr. Mitchell was read and APPROVED with the following terms:

1. When a manse is provided:
 - a. Base Salary \$31,000
 - b. Manse provided with utilities
 - c. Travel allowance \$ 3,000
2. Pay your moving expenses.
3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod.
4. Provide 100% of Synod's life, and health, and dental insurance package for the pastor and his family.
5. One week to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings.
6. One week and expenses for continuing education.
7. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the congregation shall provide cost of living adjustments based on the amount provided by Synod's Director of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Center.
8. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.

9. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
10. Professional expenses \$1,200
11. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
 - a. To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
 - b. If you are residing in the manse, and during the month following the terms outlined in "a" above, to assist you in relocating and to contribute a minimum of up to one month's base salary toward your relocation expenses.
12. In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise:
 - a. To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for a minimum of three months.
 - b. If you are residing in the manse, and during the month following the terms outlined in "a" above to assist your family in relocating and/or contribute a minimum of one month's base salary toward these relocation expenses.

Recommendation 7 was ADOPTED.

The Commission examined Mr. Mitchell. The examination was sustained. Mr. Mitchell was received by transfer from First Presbytery effective June 6, 2006. Mr. Mitchell will be ordained and installed at a recessed meeting of the Presbytery on Sunday, June 11, at 7:00 p.m. The call will be presented to him at the recessed meeting.

Recommendation 8 was ADOPTED.

The Call from the Tirzah Church for Mr. Elliott as Associate Pastor was read and APPROVED with the following terms:

1. When a housing allowance is provided, it shall provide Total Compensation of \$54,000 which includes

a. Base Salary	\$34,000
b. Housing allowance	\$17,000
c. Travel allowance	\$ 3,000
2. Pay your moving expenses.
3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod.
4. Provide 100% of Synod's life, and health, and dental insurance package for the pastor and his family.
5. One week to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings.
6. One week and expenses for continuing education ---a total of \$1,500
7. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the congregation shall provide cost of living adjustments based on the amount provided by Synod's Director of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Center.
8. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.
9. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
10. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
 - a. To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
11. In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise:
 - a. To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for a minimum of three months.

Recommendation 9 was ADOPTED.

The Commission examined Mr. Elliott. The examination was sustained. Mr. Elliott was received by transfer from Second Presbytery effective June 6, 2006. Mr. Elliott will be installed at a later date at the direction of the Chairman of the Commission.

Recommendation 10 was ADOPTED.

The Call from the Living Waters Church for Mr. Howard as Associate Pastor was read and APPROVED with the following terms:

1. When a housing allowance is provided, it shall provide
Total Compensation of \$37,800 which includes
 - a. Base Salary \$14,267
 - b. Housing allowance \$20,033
 - c. Travel allowance \$ 3,000
2. Pay your moving expenses.
3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod.
4. Pastor waives medical and dental coverage under Synod's group policy for himself and his dependents who are covered under the spouse's group policy and the church reimburses the pastor for the costs
5. One week to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings.
6. One week and expenses for continuing education ---a total of \$1,500
7. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the congregation shall provide cost of living adjustments based on the amount provided by Synod's Director of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Center.
8. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.
9. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
10. Ministerial Expense Allowance - \$500
11. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
 - a. To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
12. In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise:
 - a. To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for a minimum of three months.

Mr. Howard was previously examined and approved by the Presbytery. The Presbytery will meet for a Service of Ordination and Installation at a later date. The call will be presented to Mr. Howard at the time of his ordination and installation.

Recommendation 11 earlier was referred back to the Commission.

Recommendation 12 was ADOPTED.

Mr. Andrew Stager, a member of First Columbia, was presented to the Presbytery. He gave a brief synopsis of his faith journey. The Moderator conducted the Service of Recognition for him. Sinclair B. Ferguson, his pastor, offered prayer for Mr. Stager.

New business was considered.

Kyle E. Sims moved the following: "that Catawba Presbytery pause and lift up in prayer for Erskine College and Seminary; and especially the Presidential Search Committee as they continue their search for

Erskine's next President and that it be communicated by the Stated Clerk to the Committee that we have prayed and will continue to pray for them as they search for a candidate to continue the reformed Evangelical Christian Education at Erskine College and Seminary." The motion was ADOPTED.

William H. Elder, Director of the recent Presbytery Christian Education Workshops, spoke on the small attendance and encouraged the Presbytery to be more responsive to these opportunities.

The Moderator announced that R. B. Wilson has been appointed to replace Brian Phipps on the Special Committee on Worship.

The Moderator introduced Mr. Robert E. Patrick, Jr. as the new Moderator to begin serving July 1, 2006. Mr. Patrick made brief remarks to the Presbytery.

The new Vice Moderator, Kyle E. Sims, was also introduced. He will serve as Moderator beginning July 1, 2007.

The Stated Clerk announced plans for the Fall meeting to be held October 10, 2006 at the Shiloh Church, Lancaster, SC.

Announcements were made. Special prayer was offered for those members of Presbytery and others who are ill and undergoing various treatments.

Following the singing of Bible Songs 280, the Moderator closed the meeting with prayer and the benediction by David Lauten. The Presbytery recessed to meeting Sunday, June 11, 2006 at the Smyrna Church at 5:00 p.m.
