Catawba Presbytery met for its stated meeting June 10, 2008 at 2:00 p.m. at the Bonclarcken Chapel, Flat Rock, North Carolina. The Moderator, Kyle E. Sims, called the meeting to order and constituted the meeting with prayer.

The paragraph reads: [Article V, Sec. 9, c., page 12]

The Executive Committee shall normally act on matters referred to it by the Presbytery; on matters concerning rescheduling Presbytery meetings; on matters concerning extraordinary expenditure of Presbytery funds other than those previously approved by the Presbytery; and on matters of ~~emergency~~ **urgency** arising between Presbytery meetings. **In urgent matters**, the Executive Committee shall act as a Commission of Presbytery ~~with regard to such matters~~. Before ~~emergency~~ **is taken**, the Executive Committee shall vote unanimously that the matter is a valid, **urgent situation** ~~emergency~~ that cannot be delayed until the following meeting of Presbytery **without creating unnecessary or unreasonable problems.**”

The report of the Ad Hoc Committee appointed by the Moderator presented its report which was ADOPTED as follows:

**REPORT OF THE AD HOC COMMITTEE TO STUDY EXCEPTIONS TO THE STANDARDS**

The ad hoc committee appointed by the Moderator considered the following motion referred to us from the March 11, 2008 Minutes of the Presbytery:

**“To study the issue of ministers and licentiates taking exceptions to our Standards and recommend to the Presbytery at the June meeting whether such candidates who are received into the Presbytery are allowed to teach their exceptions publicly.”**

After consideration, the Committee makes the following recommendations:

- 1. That the Procedure below be adopted as an addition to the Rules of Procedure of Catawba Presbytery, Section F, The Commission on the Minister and His Work:

Exceptions to the Standards, a Procedure of Catawba Presbytery

With regard to exceptions taken to the Standards of the General Synod of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, this procedure shall be followed:

Section 1: Candidates for licensure and ministers seeking membership in the Presbytery will be advised by the Commission on the Minister and His Work before being examined that if they hold an exception to the Standards, they must bring to the examination a written list of any exceptions.

Section 2: If an individual takes an exception to the Standards, the Commission will ask for the Biblical and theological grounds upon which the exception is held and in what circumstances and manner the exception would be taught.

Section 3: The Commission on the Minister and His Work shall inform the Presbytery as part of its written report:

- A] The exception, citing the exact reference in the Standards;
- B] The Biblical and theological grounds on which the exception is held; and
- C] Its recommendation on whether or not the exception may be taught.

Section 4: If the Presbytery sustains the examination, the church court or ministry preparing the call or seeking to employ the individual shall be informed of the exception by the chairman of the Commission on the Minister and His Work.

2. That the Stated Clerk be authorized to insert the above procedure in the Rules of Procedure at the appropriate place.

Martin Taylor, retiring Chairman of Committee and Finance, expressed gratitude and appreciation for the faithful and dedicate service of the Presbytery Treasurer, T. C. S. [Buddy] Lever.

The report of the Committee on Church Extension was presented and discussed as follows:

**REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION**

**Providence Mission**

The Church Extension Committee is pleased to report the Providence Mission in Mt. Pleasant continues on track for organization. Offerings and attendance are good and officers are being trained.

**Indian Land**

Rev. Gary Stiltner has moved on the field in Indian Land and is making contacts. He has a growing list of prospects, especially within the Sun City community. Rev. Stiltner has also made contacts within the local ARP churches. Following the directives of ONA, Rev. Stiltner and his family have been regularly attending Carolina Covenant, and work closely with the pastor, Rev. Steve Reynolds.

Gary has spoken in many Catawba Presbytery churches, but would like to speak in all of them during this residency year. He remains open to speaking engagements.

Gary is developing a detailed plan for the mission, which will be presented at the end of his residency.

### **IBL**

IBL continues to be the subject which has occupied the majority of our time as a committee. Last fall, we appointed a subcommittee to study the needs of IBL. Also last fall, Presbytery tasked the committee to "Present to the Presbytery . . . plans for the future of the Mission including finances and achievable goals with deadlines or a date to dissolve the mission."

This task has been difficult. There was much discussion and debate within the committee as well as prayer. Our subcommittee has met with the people of IBL, the mission developer, and outside parties with expertise on Hispanic missions. Special thanks are given to Rev. George Busch, chairman of the subcommittee and the members of the provisional session.

IBL did not originally begin as a mission, but as a ministry to Hispanics in the Columbia area. IBL has proven to be effective both in preaching the Word of God and demonstrating the love of Christ. It has been both a model and an inspiration to other groups ministering to Hispanics.

Later, IBL was brought under the authority of the Committee on Church Extension as a mission church. Catawba Presbytery Rules of Procedure defines a mission church as an organization working towards become a particularized, self-governing ARP church. Once this change occurred, IBL was expected to follow the same framework of support as other mission churches—that is, that it should become self-governing and self-sustaining within a certain length of time. This goal proved unrealistic. The experience of others in the field has shown that Hispanic missions require much more time, patience and money. Other denominations (the PCA, for example) have recently moved away from emphasizing particular Spanish-speaking churches in favor of enfolding Hispanics into existing churches through Spanish worship services, interpreters, satellite campuses, mother-daughter church arrangements, and other special ministries to Hispanics.

The people of IBL do not wish to be enfolded into another congregation. They regard the mission as their church and want to continue meeting together. They believe they are capable of being self-led. They have not however indicated that they will in the foreseeable future be able to fully support a pastor. They believe that much of their problems stem from their building which is not in a good area of town for Hispanics. There is a universal desire to sell the property.

Many believe that IBL's current membership includes some men who, with the proper training, could become a self-governing session. But if IBL were to become self-governing, there is no provision in our Rules of Procedure to use Church Extension monies to support a self-governing church. By becoming self-governing, they also lose their support. Without our support, they cannot continue.

The work of IBL is important to us, not only because of its historic effectiveness, but also as a symbol of our concern for Hispanics and other ethnic groups. It is therefore highly desirable to us and to the people of IBL that it continue. But the current classification of IBL as a mission church is not helpful. If it continues as a mission church, it is highly likely that Presbytery may still be wrestling with this problem twenty years from now.

With these considerations in mind, the Committee on Church Extension would like to make the following recommendations:

**1. That IBL be considered an outreach ministry of Catawba Presbytery to the Hispanic community among us. We further recommend that in order to provide IBL with appropriate oversight and long term funding, a separate corporation be organized to continue the ministry into the future. This board would be responsible for guiding future plans for ministry and for raising funds for the ministry. The board of this separate non-profit corporation would be comprised of interested**

**parties of Presbytery churches, and who are approved by Presbytery. We also recommend that Presbytery continue its current funding for the next two years, and transfer the current building on Gregg Street to the corporation in order to be used to purchase or rent a new a building for IBL.**

**2. That this board be chosen and be convened by January 1, 2009.**

**3. That J. J.'s salary is continued at its current level until December 31, 2008.**

This recommendation would return IBL to its original conception as a ministry to Hispanics without a specific designation as a mission church. It provides funding until a board can be organized established who can raise funds from other sources. Furthermore, it provides the ministry property which may be sold and used to continue the work in whatever form deemed best by the board of IBL.

Nothing precludes the people of IBL from meeting regularly. Nothing precludes them from later being recognized as a mission under the regular guidelines for mission churches. But this plan does not require that they do so. Instead, it provides an instrument for interested parties to continue and hopefully expand our work among Hispanics in the future. In closing, we would like to thank all those who have labored diligently in the service of Christ through the IBL mission for their faithful service.

An amendment was offered by Guy H. Smith, seconded and ADOPTED as follows:

1. That IBL become an outreach ministry of Catawba Presbytery.
2. That a Committee on Outreach be established in order to provide oversight for IBL, to raise funds for the ministry and that the Committee on Outreach to be designated to handle other such matters if and when they should occur.
3. That the Committee on Nominations
  - a. Be directed to name 6 members of the Committee on Outreach, one of whom shall be named by the Committee on Nominations as chairman
  - b. That the members of the Committee on Outreach serve terms of 3 years.
  - c. That every attempt be made place on the committee those with special interest in this type of ministry.
4. That the Committee on Outreach present to the Presbytery at the Fall 2008 meeting a list of the Committee responsibilities, plans for financing this ministry at this time and future plans for the IBL ministry including any future financial responsibility that the Committee envisions the Presbytery may have.
5. That Committee on Outreach give prayerful consideration to the current building on Gregg Street and if the Committee determines it is in the best interest of the ministry to sell the building, and if the Presbytery approves, that the Trustees, according to the Rules of Procedure, be authorized to sell the building with the funds to be used toward the ministry of IBL.
6. That the Treasurer of Presbytery handle all funds for the Committee on Outreach.
7. That the salary of J. J. Diaz be continued at its current level until December 31, 2008.

Gary Stiltner spoke briefly about his work at the Indian Land.

Richard Brown also spoke about the work at Providence Mission.

Special prayer was offered for the Outreach Ministry of Hispanics.

The report of the Commission on the Old Brick Church was presented and RECEIVED AS INFORMATION as follows:

#### **REPORT OF THE COMMISSION OF THE OLD BRICK CHURCH (OBC)**

Since the last meeting of Presbytery the Commission met on 5 May 2008 in order to discuss several items of business.

**Items:**

- A. Dr. Harmon Patrick and Mr. Bryan McKown reported on the interest by two individuals in the demolition of a dilapidated granite structure on the church property. The Commission charged Mr. McKown with contacting these individuals to obtain written proposals for this work. Dr. Patrick also noted that Mr. John Swearingen of Winnsboro would continue with the upkeep of the church grounds.
- B. Mr. Paul Gettys reported that he had received informal approval for a needs assessment and preservation grant from the State Historic Preservation Office of the South Carolina Department of Archives and History. He, Mr. McNair, and Mr. McKown were charged with overseeing the implementation of this grant upon receiving official notification of its approval.
- C. The Commission devoted considerable time in discussion of establishing a foundation for the on-going financial needs of the OBC property and charged Mr. McNair with reporting on the feasibility of establishing a foundation for the OBC.
- D. The Commission discussed at length the recent communication from Dr. Michael Trinkley of the Chicora Foundation, Columbia, S.C., concerning cemetery mapping and grave identification. By consensus the Commission agreed to the necessity of obtaining a comprehensive plan for the inventory and long-term care and maintenance of the OBC cemetery. In addition, the Commission continued its discussion of the need to establish a cemetery association.
- E. The Commission approved the expenditure of \$400 for a plaque for the church interior adjacent to the Union soldier's message from February 1865, and charged Mr. Pat Patrick with overseeing its installation. The Commission also charged Mr. Gettys with obtaining a plaque for the church exterior from the National Register of Historic Places.
- F. Other items of discussion included publicity, insurance and security for the church building.

**Recommendations**

- 1. That this report be received as information and printed in the Minutes.

The report of the State of the Church Committee was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

**REPORT OF THE STATE OF THE CHURCH COMMITTEE**

The Committee met Tuesday, May 6, 2008. We continue diligently to look for more resources to add to the website. Our main concern was to determine what, if any, changes were needed to be made on the Session Records Check List that might streamline the records, make keeping them more meaningful for future sessions and make the task easier to go through the records on days of Presbytery meetings. We are suggesting a new division in alphabetical order.

With that being said, after having looked at lists from other Presbyteries, we recommend one change to the Rules of Procedure that we believe will help any clerk, new or old, be able to keep a more effective record book.

We also would like to recommend to Church Extension that they buy permanent session record books for mission churches. This would allow them to keep a more complete set of minutes, etc

and keep them organized more effectively. If the mission church fails, the books would be property of Church Extension and could therefore be re-used at some later point by another mission developer.

We suggest as well that each session from time to time go back to the FOG and determine for their particular congregation, what a quorum is. Many churches go by the minimum, which is fine. It still, we feel, is a good idea to set individual parameters so that there is no question as to what determines a quorum for your session.

For clerks, new or old, we would perhaps like to introduce a one morning seminar on how to effectively take minutes and keep a proper session record book. We would like feedback from the Presbytery on this idea.

We have the survey questions for the clerk of each session. We would like to have these back by July 15 if possible. There is an e-mail address which you can send your replies to. We also have a template for the clerks that might help them be able to keep better organized records from meetings. This template will also help cover the session records list better as well.

The Committee continues to study the information contained in the 2007 congregational reports.

We continue to pray for individual pastors, their families, and congregations that are hurting at this time. We encourage each session to do the same. Also please inform us if there individuals or congregations that the SOC should be aware of, in order that we might encourage and pray for them.

Recommendations:

1. That the Rules of Procedure E, Section 3, a), (1) and (2) be changed to read:
  - (1) A-H at the Spring Meeting
  - (2) I- Z at the Fall Meeting
2. That a new 3. be added to the Rules of Procedure E, Appendix A, to read: "A copy of the session records check list be laminated and included on the inside cover of the session record book."
3. That the present Rules of Procedure E, Appendix A be renumbered to include the above recommendation if adopted.
4. That the Committee on Church Extension be asked to provide Session record books for each mission.
5. That the Committee be indulged until the fall meeting to report on recommendations from the 2007 congregational reports.

The report of the Commission on the Minister and His Work was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

**REPORT OF THE COMMISSION OF THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK**

The Commission met with the Pulpit Search Committee from the Effingham ARP Church, Effingham, SC in order to examine their Call to Rev. Brian Howard as Pastor. The Commission found the Call to be in order prior to discussing the Call with Rev. Howard.

At a called Congregational Meeting of the Living Waters ARP Church, the congregation voted to concur with Rev. Howard's request that the pastoral relationship between he and the church be dissolved, effective April 30, 2008.

The Commission approved the call to Rev. Howard and gave permission for him to move to the field to begin his ministry at Effingham ARP Church on May 1, 2008.

The Commission also met with the Rev. Denny Hieber who submitted his resignation as Pastor of the Neely's Creek Session. At a called Congregation Meeting of the Neely's Creek ARP Church, the congregation voted to concur with Rev. Hieber's request that the pastoral relationship between he and the church be dissolved, effective, March 18, 2008 with the terms of the call in effect through June 30, 2008. Mr. Hieber will be without charge effective July 1, 2008.

Recommendations:

1. That the Call from the Effingham ARP Church to the Rev. Brian Howard be read for information, presented to Rev. Howard, and that the service of Installation of the Rev. Brian Howard be arranged with the Chairman of the Commission.

The call for Mr. Howard was read for information with the following terms:

1. Total compensation of \$43,000 that includes:

a.	Base Salary	\$22,000
b.	Housing allowance	\$17,400
c.	Travel allowance	\$ 1,100
d.	Other allowance	\$ 2,500
2. Pay your moving expenses.
3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod.
4. Pay 100% of Synod's life, and health, and dental insurance package for the pastor and his family.
5. One week to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings.
6. One week and expenses for continuing education.
7. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the congregation shall provide cost of living adjustments to the previous year's bases salary based on the amount provided by Synod's Director of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Center.
8. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.
9. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
10. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
  - a. To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.

11. In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise
  - a. To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for your immediate family for a minimum of three months.

The Moderator presented the call to Mr. Howard and he accepted the call.

### **SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT OF THE COMMISSION**

The Commission met with the Pulpit Search Committee for an Associate Pastor of the First ARP of Rock Hill, SC in order to examine a Student Supply Arrangement and call to Mr. Andrew Stager, a licentiate of the Presbytery. The Commission found the student supply arrangement which begins September 1 to be in order. The Commission also found the call which will become effective upon Mr. Stager's graduation from seminary to be in order and that his called be presented to him at the time of his ordination and installation.

The Commission appointed Rev. Alan Morrow to serve as Moderator of the Neely's Creek Session.

The Commission examined and approved a student supply arrangement with the Arsenal Hill Church and Mr. Christopher Parnell, a student under care of the Presbytery.

3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod.
4. Pay 100% of Synod's life, and health, and dental insurance package for the pastor and his family.
5. Two weeks to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings.
6. One week and expenses for continuing education.

7. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the congregation shall provide cost of living adjustments to the previous year's bases salary based on the amount provided by Synod's Director of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Center.
8. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.
9. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
10. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
  - a. To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
11. In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise
  - a. To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for your immediate family for a minimum of three months.

Clint Davis, Chairman of Christian Education, commended John Locke, Assistant Director of the Senior Adult Retreat, for the excellent retreat held in May.

Robert Patrick spoke briefly concerning the progress made by the Commission on the Old Brick Church.

The Stated Clerk, Guy H. Smith, announced the fall meeting for October 14, 2008 at the Unity Church, Lancaster, SC beginning at 10:00 a.m.

The Moderator introduced the new Moderator, Elder David Mitchell from the Hickory Grove Church.

Mr. Sims then introduced the new Vice Moderator, David Setzer. Mr. Setzer will become moderator on July 1, 2009.

The Moderator expressed appreciation for his term and experience as Moderator.

There was no additional new business.

Announcements were made.

The Presbytery recessed to adjourn with the meeting of General Synod. Following the singing of Bible Songs 280 "Christian Unity", the Moderator, Kyle E. Sims, closed the meeting with prayer and the benediction. The Presbytery officially adjourned with the meeting of Synod on Thursday, June 12, 2008.
