Catawba Presbytery met for a called meeting on November 10, 2008 at the Union Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church, Richburg, South Carolina. Moderator David H. Mitchell, Jr. called the meeting to order at 7:00 p. m. and constituted the meeting with prayer.

Guy H. Smith, Stated Clerk, constituted the roll from the enrollment cards. [APPENDIX A] A quorum was present.

The Moderator stated the purpose of the meeting as follows: To hear a report of the Commission on the Minister and His Work relative to a call for a candidate for the Rogers Memorial Church, to examine the candidate and, if the way is clear, to receive him into membership of the Presbytery, to hear the call and approve it and any others matters related to that call.

The report of the Commission on the Minister and His Work was presented as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK

The Commission met with the Rogers Memorial Pulpit Committee and their candidate for Pastor, Rev. James L. Klukow, a minister in good standing in Florida Presbytery. The Commission found the terms of the call to be in order. The Commission examined Mr. Klukow for transfer into Catawba Presbytery. Mr. Klukow takes no exceptions to the ARP Standards. The Rogers Memorial congregation unanimously voted to extend the call to Mr. Klukow at a congregational meeting, Sunday, November 9.

Recommendations:

1. That Mr. Klukow be presented to the Presbytery for a transfer exam.
2. That Mr. Klukow be received as a member of Presbytery upon receipt of his transfer from Florida Presbytery.
3. That the call from Rogers Memorial to Mr. Klukow be read and approved.
4. That an installation service for Mr. Klukow be arranged with the chairman of the Commission.

Recommendation 1 was ADOPTED.

Mr. Lauten examined Mr. Klukow. A motion was made to sustain the examination. The motion was ADOPTED.

Recommendation 2 was ADOPTED. Mr. Klukow was received by letter of transfer from Florida Presbytery effective January 1, 2009. Mr. Klukow will be enrolled effective that date.

Recommendation 3 was ADOPTED.

The call from the Rogers Memorial Church for James L. Klukow was read and APPROVED with the following terms:

1. When a housing allowance is provided, it shall provide Total Compensation of \$60,000 which includes
 - a. Base Salary \$30,000
 - b. Housing allowance \$22,000
 - c. Travel allowance \$ 8,000 (Accountability Plan)
2. Pay your moving expenses.
3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod.
4. Provide 100% of Synod's life, and health, and dental insurance package for the pastor and his family.
5. One week to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings.
6. One week and expenses for continuing education
7. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the congregation **shall provide a cost of living adjustment to the previous year's base salary** based on the amount provided by Synod's Director of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Center.
8. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.
9. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
10. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
 - a. To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
11. In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise:
 - a. To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for a minimum of six months.

The call was presented to Mr. Klukow and accepted by him. Mr. Klukow will begin his ministry at the Rogers Memorial Church on January 1, 2009.

Recommendation 4 was ADOPTED.

Announcements were made. It was announced that Presbytery would meet for a called meeting Sunday, November 16, 2008 at the Ebenezer Church for the purpose of ordaining Juan Carlos Bonilla to the Gospel Ministry.

Kyle E. Sims closed the meeting with prayer and the benediction. The Moderator declared the meeting adjourned.

The Commission on the Minister and His Work reported on the memorial from the Centennial Church referred at the last meeting of the Presbytery as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION OF THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK

Old Business:

The Commission has thoroughly examined issues related to the Centennial Memorial which was referred to the Commission at the October 14, 2008 meeting of Presbytery. The Commission has met with members of the Centennial Session. The Commission has also received input from various Sessions across the Presbytery.

Recognizing a concern with stipulating a mandated rate of the cost of living increase, and a concern that Ministers receive a cost of living increase, the Commission affirms that Ministers should receive an appropriate cost of living increase to be determined by the officers and member of the congregation.

After deliberating the manifold issues related to the mandated cost of living increase, the Commission makes the following recommendations.

1. The Commission recommends the following amendment of the Rules of Procedure, Article IX, F, Appendix A, Section 2, h, (7): “Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the congregation shall provide a cost of living adjustment to the previous year’s base salary. ~~The cost of living adjustment provided by the Director of Synod’s Office will be the standard measure. If for any reason the congregation thinks it cannot, or should not, meet this minimum requirement, then the Session will consult with the Commission on the Minister and His Work to determine available alternatives for courses of action to be taken. The Commission shall report its decisions to Presbytery.~~
2. That this language be reflected in all Presbytery calls, and made effective for all annual church budgets beginning in 2010.
3. That this language be reflected in Presbytery call forms.

 - d. At the direction of the Commission Chairman, Candidate Stuart M. Moore was transferred as a candidate to Second Presbytery effective January 10, 2009.

- e. At the direction of the Commission Chairman, Candidate John W. Davidson, Jr. was removed as a candidate effective February 3, 2009.
 - f. James Klukow was installed as pastor of Rogers Memorial by a Commission of the Presbytery on February 22, 2009. [APPENDIX C]

The report of the Committee on Christian Education was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

REPORT OF THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Catawba Presbytery's Christian Education Committee met at 7:00 pm on January 26, 2009 via conference call. Your Committee received and examined various reports from the directors of the Presbytery's existing ministries, except the children's retreat. The following statistical data was received as information and is passed on to you for the same purpose.

- **Fall 2008 High School Super Retreat** – 10 churches in participation from Catawba Presbytery with an attendance numbered at 128 persons. The total attendance from all the presbyteries involved (1st, 2nd, and Catawba) was 402.
- **Fall 2008 Middle School Retreat** – 12 churches from Catawba Presbytery participated with an attendance numbered at 247. It was noted that “several young people made a commitment to Christ.” For this your committee gives thanks and praise to God.

Your Committee also received and approved the following reports from both the Middle and Senior High Retreat and Senior Adult Retreat planning teams and pass them on to the Presbytery for approval.

- **Middle School Retreat** – The spring retreat for Middle School students is scheduled for March 27-29, 2009 at Bonclarken. Charlie Phillips, Director of Youth Ministries at Ebenezer ARP Church will speak on the theme “Sharing Your Faith with Your Friends.” The Erskine College

Barn Ministry Music Team will lead the worship. The retreat will focus on friendship and relational evangelism. The cost is \$70 per student.

- **High School Retreat** – The spring retreat for High School students is scheduled for March 6-8, 2009 at Bonclarken. Like the fall 2008 retreat, this retreat will be a Super Retreat held in conjunction with First and Second Presbyteries. Jake Vance, Youth Director at 1st ARP Gastonia, will speak on the theme of “Hold the Applause.” Jake will focus on the spiritual climate in our culture in which our students seek to live and stand for our Lord Jesus Christ. Dylan McKeeman, Contemporary Music Director at Back Creek ARP Church, will lead in worship. The cost is \$70 per student.
- **Senior Adult Retreat** – The senior adult retreat is scheduled for May 7, 2009 at 1st Presbyterian Church, Columbia, SC from 10 am to 3 pm. Dr. John R. De Witt will deliver the keynote address. Among others, some of the seminars will be: “South Carolina Historic Architecture,” “What is a Care Team?,” and “Church Planting in Scotland.” The cost of the retreat is \$8 per participant.

Recommendations:

1. That the plans for the Middle and High School Spring Retreats be approved.
2. That the plans for the Senior Adult Retreat be approved.
3. That the Presbytery continue to encourage the members to prayerfully support and participate in the Presbytery’s Christian Education programs.

The report of the Committee on Church Extension was presented as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CHURCH EXTENSION

The Church Extension Committee has discussed the following topics.

1. The Providence Mission is still moving towards organization. They estimate organization to occur in the spring of the year.
2. The Indian Land mission project under Gary Stiltner continues to go well. Rev. Stiltner has begun meeting with groups in Indian Land and in the Sun City senior village. He has prepared a church development plan, which has been submitted to the Presbytery committee and to Outreach North America. Rev. Stiltner believes services can be started as early as fall of 2009. The committee feels that it is time to move from an exploratory work status to a mission status in this area, and that Rev. Stiltner be called as mission developer.
3. Several churches have shown interest in another “Turn Out Solution” seminar in the Presbytery. The committee is working with Rev. Priddy to find a time and place for this meeting.
4. The Church Extension Committee has been in discussion with representatives from First Rock Hill, Tirzah, and Ebenezer Churches about starting a new work in the Rock Hill area, possibly as early as next year.

The Committee makes the following recommendations.

1. That Presbytery grant permission to the Committee to begin a new mission work in Indian Land area.
2. That Presbytery approve the development plan for the Indian Land mission.
3. That the following be appoint a provisional session for the Indian Land Mission. John Adams, Ed Mobley and Jerry Knight.

4. That Presbytery grant permission to the Church Extension Committee to work with Rev. Ken Priddy on a date for a “Turn out solution Seminar” in Catawba Presbytery, and that the place and date of said seminar be publicized throughout the presbytery.
5. That Presbytery grant permission for the Committee on Church Extension to promote a Church Extension offering in the Presbytery in the months of April and May.

Recommendation 2 was ADOPTED.

Recommendation 3 was ADOPTED.

A motion was made and ADOPTED that the official name of the Indian Land work be Indian Land Associate Reformed Presbyterian Mission.

Recommendation 4 was ADOPTED.

Recommendation 5 was ADOPTED.

Prayer was offered for the work at Indian Land by Bill Fleming, Chairman of the Committee on Church Extension.

A motion was made and ADOPTED to allow the Committee on Nominations to fill the remaining vacancies and report the information to the Stated Clerk.

The report of the Commission on the Old Brick Church was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMISSION OF THE OLD BRICK CHURCH (OBC)

Since its last report to Presbytery the Commission met on 11 September 2008 and 22 January 2009 in order to discuss several items of business.

Items:

- A. The Commission met with Mr. and Mrs. Jim MacFie who notified the Commission that it would receive a bequest from the estate of Mrs. Katherine MacFie Sturgis, the income from which will be dedicated to the preservation of the church graveyard. The commission decided to create a sub-fund entitled “Old Brick Church MacFie Cemetery Fund” for this purpose
- B. Mr. McNair submitted a draft agreement to create the OBC Endowment Fund. The Commission decided that the document should include additional information and hopes to have a final version in place by early spring 2009.
- C. Mr. Gettys reported that a sub-committee of the Commission had evaluated proposals from 13 architectural firms concerning conducting a needs assessment and preservation study for the OBC and had selected DP3 Architects of Greenville, S.C., for this work. A representative of this firm and two staffers from the State Historic Preservation Office made a site visit on 21 January 2009. This study will provide the Commission with a summary report to include drawings, photographs, and a list of prioritized action items for the long-term preservation of the building. The architectural firm’s draft report will be due on 1 July 2009 and final report completed by 30 September 2009.
- D. The Commission received a summary report and cemetery map, including identification of unmarked graves, prepared by Dr. Michael Trinkley of the Chicora Foundation, Columbia, S.C. of a penetrometer study of the church cemetery completed in November 2008. The Commission intends to use this information to establish burial plots for the future use of the cemetery. The Commission has also collected bylaws and written cemetery procedures from the following A.R.P. churches: Due West, Ebenezer, Hopewell, Neely’s Creek, and White Oak.
- E. The Commission has placed a commemorative plaque in the church interior adjacent to the Union soldier’s message from February 1865.
- F. The Commission continues in negotiations for the demolition and removal of the caretaker’s cottage and the repair of the cemetery wall. The Commission also discussed the possibility of acquiring additional property adjacent to the OBC and charged the Chairman and Mr. Gettys with investigating this option.
- G. The Commission discussed the need to establish rotational terms for its membership.
- H. Other items of discussion included publicity, insurance, and security for the church building.

Recommendations:

- 1. That this report be received as information
- 2. That the Rules of Procedure H, Section 1 be amended by adding the following:
 - 1. That the terms of the appointed Commission be for 3 years with one member rotating off each year.
 - 2. That the Old Brick Church Commission be permitted to suggest to the Moderator possible replacement members for consideration and that these individuals have an interest and/or expertise in the area of historical preservation.
 - 3. That the present Commission members be allowed to develop a process by which the present appointed members may rotate (e.g., beginning July 1, one member will take a 1 year term, one a two year term, and one a three year term).

The report of the Committee on Outreach was presented and ADOPTED as follows:

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON OUTREACH

This Committee is acutely aware of the expectations of Catawba Presbytery. We are also aware of the importance of the work that has been assigned to us. Therefore, we are seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit to direct our every move. We know that in His own good time, the Lord will open the right doors and detour us around the closed ones.

We have already experienced His guidance in an unexpected way. We scheduled our December meeting early in the month. Shortly after our November meeting, we (and our families) were invited to the Christmas celebration with IBL. We were aiming to meet with IBL in January. What we saw and experienced was an exciting, eye opening time with the folk at IBL. We enjoyed worship, testimony, fellowship and food. (At least Peter Rambo told us that it was a good service in Spanish!) We understood the food and fellowship. The meeting room was filled to capacity. The smaller children were in another room. There were at least 65 Hispanics at the service plus our committee and several other invited guests. I learned from J.J. several days later that a number of their people were away. Having seen first hand the vitality of this group, we have been uplifted and motivated to move on ahead.

We are keenly aware of our assignment from Presbytery, specifically item four, page 10, Catawba Presbytery Minutes 2007-2008, volume 3:

“That the Committee on Outreach present to the Presbytery at the Fall 2008 meeting a list of the Committee responsibilities, plans for financing this ministry at this time and future plans for the IBL ministry including any future financial responsibility that the Committee envision the Presbytery may have”.

We will meet those goals. Just be reminded that in planning a “journey” you must know two essential facts: 1) Where you are, and 2) Where you are going. We are still seeking to determine where we are. To date our chairman has met with Rev. Diaz and his wife to explain to them the new status of IBL. He has also met with Rev. Diaz. and selected leaders in this group to explain their new status.

There is (and always has been) evidence that IBL is doing a good job of ministering to the Hispanics in the Columbia area. However, the committee is very much aware that there is a great need to build a closer relationship between IBL and other ARP churches, especially in the metropolitan area. Our role is to find ways we can be supportive without taking charge of the good work that is being done. That will be pursued.

There is a need to bring the children into a closer relationship with other children in the ARP Church. We have begun pursuing the possibility of finding churches or individuals willing to help send some of the children to Camp Bonclarken. (That will be one of the major items for discussion at our committee meeting with IBL on February 10. Perhaps we will have something to report at the meeting in March.)

This Committee sees the need for an approved account for the future funding of Outreach Committee ministry. At the moment our focus is on IBL for sometime in the future.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. That the directive to the Committee, item 4, page 10, Catawba Presbytery Minutes 2007-2008, volume 3, continue to be held before us, but not as a mandate on a given date.
2. That Catawba Presbytery give its blessings to the Committee to work toward a closer supporting relationship between our churches and IBL.
3. That the Committee pursue joint support (from IBL and other churches) to send several children (number yet to be determined) to Camp Bonclarken.
4. That Presbytery designate a financial account (i.e. “Outreach Ministry Fund”) for future funding of Committee On Outreach ministry.

Since the Fall 2008 meeting of Catawba Presbytery, Rev. Buzzy Elder, Chairman of the Committee on State of the Church, accepted a call to Frostproof ARP Church, and subsequently resigned from membership on the Committee. Rev. Steve Reynolds was appointed interim chairman. The Committee has not met since the Fall meeting of Presbytery

The following items are provided for information:

- A. Three churches were not represented at General Synod or any stated meeting of Catawba Presbytery in 2008: Crossings Community, Faith and Hope {LA}. [FOG XI.B.2.]
- B. The Session of the Lemira Church does not keep a record of baptisms or deaths as required by the FOG [XI.B3.b.2 and XI.B,3.b.3.]

Recommendations:

1. That the session of the Lemira Church be instructed to maintain records of deaths and baptisms in accord with the Form of Government XI.B3.b.2 and XI.B,3.b.3.
2. That all sessions be encouraged to fulfill their responsibility to provide representation at the stated meetings of Catawba Presbytery and the annual meeting of the General Synod.
3. The Committee met and examined session records received. We recommend:
 - a. Arsenal Hill, Carolina Covenant, Centennial, Edwards Memorial, Good Shepherd and Hardeeville First be approved without exception.
 - b. Bethany, Bethel, Blacksburg, Calhoun, Chester, Clover, Columbia First, Crossings Community, Ebenezer, Edgemoor, Effingham, Faith Fellowship, Hickory Grove, Hope {TX}, Hopewell, Rogers Memorial and Shiloh be approved with minor exceptions.
 - c. Faith [Sumter] and Hope [LA] did not submit records. These records are to be brought to the Fall meeting.

The Presbytery Clerk was instructed to send the transfer effective February 9, 2009.

The Commission received a request to transfer Seminary Student Stuart Michael Moore to Second Presbytery in whose bounds he is currently residing. The Presbytery Clerk was instructed to send the transfer effective January 10, 2009.

The Commission received a request from Seminary Student John Davidson, Jr. to withdraw his name as a student under care of the Presbytery as his educational plans have changed. The Presbytery Clerk was instructed to remove John Davidson's name from the student roll of Presbytery effective February 3, 2009.

6. That the Stated Supply arrangement with First Hardeeville ARP Session and the Rev. Marion Canfield be approved for one year beginning April 1, 2009.
7. That the Stated supply Arrangement with Sharon ARP Session and the Rev. Jim McLurkin be approved for one year beginning April 1, 2009.
8. That the Stated Supply arrangement with Sherwood Forest ARP Session and the Rev. Glenn Welsford be approved for one year beginning April 1, 2009.

SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON THE MINISTER AND HIS WORK

The Commission met with the Pulpit Search Committee and Candidate for the Neely's Creek ARP Church. The call was reviewed and found to be in order. The Congregation voted to extend a call to the Rev. Heiko Burklin. The Neely's Creek congregation voted unanimously to extend a call to Rev. Mr. Burklin. Rev. Burklin has express an exception to the ARP Standards in the area of a Continental view of the Lord's Day. Attached is his statement of explanation.

The Commission is also recommending a change in the Rules of Procedure with respect to adding to Appendix G information in the preparation of a Bi-Vocational Call. The Form of Government Chapter X, Section E, paragraph 11 (p. 216) states "At its discretion, presbytery may approve a call for a minister to serve as pastor without the provision for group insurance when a congregation is unable to support a minister on a full-time basis provided: a. the Presbytery has determined that the congregation presenting the call is unable to support a minister on a full-time basis and includes such provision in the printed call" The Commission recommends amending Appendix G of the Presbytery Rules of Procedure to be the procedure of determining whether a congregation is unable to support a minister on a full-time basis.

Recommendations:

10. That the Middler Sermon of Mr. Mark Witte be received as a specimen of progress.
11. That Rev. Denny Hieber be granted permission to labor out of bounds for one year.
12. That the Session of Faith ARP Church be granted occasional supply status for one year.
13. That Rev. Heiko Burklin be presented to Presbytery for a transfer exam, and if approved that his transfer from Florida Presbytery be effective today.
14. That the call from the Neely's Creek ARP Church to Rev. Heiko Burklin be read and approved, and if approved be presented to Rev. Burklin.
15. That the installation service for Rev. Burklin be arranged with the chairman of the Commission on the Minister and His Work.
16. That the Rules of Procedure be amended to include the following underlined changes:
17. That Mr. Jamey Dagenhart be presented to the Presbytery as a student of theology.
18. That Mr. Dagenhart be approved as a student of theology and added to the roll of the Presbytery candidates.

APPENDIX G: PREPARATION FOR THE CALL OF AN EVANGELIST AND A BI-VOCATIONAL CALL

The Presbytery believes that every church should strive diligently to have a full time pastor. If a church is unable to call a full time pastor because it cannot meet the Presbytery minimums as set forth in the Rules of Procedure, the Session must provide **The Commission on The Minister and His Work** of Catawba Presbytery the reasons why the Church cannot afford to meet the Presbytery conditions to call a full time minister.

FORMAT TO BE FOLLOWED IN PREPARATION FOR THE CALL OF AN EVANGELIST OR A BI-VOCATIONAL CALL

Section 1: **Justification of the Request (Answer each question in narrative form):**

- a. Why and how did the Session determine the church could not afford a full time minister?
- b. How did the Session involve the membership in reaching this decision?
- c. To what degree is the congregation supportive of this request to call an evangelist, or a Bi-Vocational Minister? (Actual vote or statistical results of a survey.)

Section 2: **Documentation of the Church's Financial Position:**

The Session must present to the Commission on the Minister and His Work financial statements for each of the five years preceding the request to call an evangelist. This is to include all giving to:

- ◆ General fund
- ◆ Building fund(s) (If more than one, prepare and submit individually)
- ◆ Cemetery fund
- ◆ All other funds (listed individually – i.e. Van Fund, etc.)
- ◆ Special offerings for Synod/Presbytery (List with amounts.)
- ◆ Other income:
 - Interest from Savings Account
 - Interest from Endowments
 - Interest from all other special accounts (List)
 - From Certificates of Deposit
 - From rental property
 - Give balance at the end of each year.
 - List Market Value at the end of the 5th year.
- ◆ Except for the general operating fund, **documentation** of specific restrictions, purpose, etc., must also be provided for each fund.
(NOTE: The Commission will exclude from consideration any funds that are specifically exempted by our **Form Of Government**.)
- ◆ List all outstanding indebtedness and indicate amount of debt.

Section 3: **Church Membership**

- ◆ What was the average attendance for Sunday morning Worship for the past six months? (Actual count if available.)
- ◆ What was the average giving each week for the past six months?
- ◆ Does the membership see this need for an evangelist or Bi-Vocational Minister as a temporary measure or as a permanent arrangement? Why? (Explain.)

- ◆ Provide a history of active membership and inactive membership for the past five years (from annual reports.)
- ◆ What has the congregation done in an effort to revive the inactive? (Explain.)
- ◆ What is your plan for growth? (Explain.)

Section 4: Job Description

- a. The Session will prepare an official job description for the Evangelist or Bi-Vocational Minister. (What you expect of him.) Expected hours per week are not to exceed 29 hours. **All terms of the call must be adopted by the congregation.** (Keep in mind that sermon preparation, visitation, meetings, etc. are very time consuming. Your evangelist or Bi-Vocational Minister will no doubt have family responsibilities and must work at another job to sustain his family.)
- b. Compensation
The Bible teaches us that a “laborer deserves his wages.” (I Timothy 1:18b.)

Section 5: The Role of the Presbytery and/or The Commission on the Minister and His Work

- a. The call of an Evangelist or Bi-Vocational Call must be approved by the Presbytery.
- b. The Commission will reevaluate annually:
 - 1) The position of evangelist or Bi-Vocational Call in a given church.
 - 2) The individual filling the position of evangelist or Bi-Vocational Minister.

Section 6: The Congregation Responsibility

The congregation will be responsible for making a report to the Presbytery to be given to the Commission every two years on a revised plan for growth and how well they are adhering to the original plan for growth.

David Lauten, Chairman of the Commission conducted the examination of Mr. Burklin. Following questions from the floor the examination was sustained. Mr. Burklin was received effective today by transfer from Florida Presbytery.

The call from the Neely’s Creek Church for Heiko E. Burklin was read and APPROVED to begin April 1, 2009 with the following terms:

- 1. When a housing allowance is provided, it shall provide Total Compensation of \$70,365 which includes
 - a. Base Salary \$47,565
 - d. Housing allowance \$19,200
 - e. Travel allowance \$ 3,600
- 2. Pay your moving expenses.

3. Pay into the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Retirement Plan as prescribed by the Synod.
4. Provide 100% of Synod's life, and health, and dental insurance package for the pastor and his family.
5. One week to be away for evangelistic or other church related meetings.
6. One week and expenses for continuing education
7. Review with you annually the adequacy of this compensation. As part of the review the congregation **shall provide a cost of living adjustment to the previous year's base salary** based on the amount provided by Synod's Director of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Center.
8. Grant you an annual vacation of 4 weeks.
9. Expenses for the meeting of General Synod.
10. In the event of total disability, as defined in the Synod's insurance program, we promise:
 - a. To continue for a minimum of three months the provisions of this call awaiting commencement of benefits from Synod's insurance program.
11. In the event of death during the terms of this call, we promise:
 - a. To continue the provisions of this call dealing with annual salary, housing, and group insurance for a minimum of six months.

The Moderator presented the call to Mr. Burklin and he accepted it.

Prayer was offered by Mark Ross for Mr. Burklin and the Neely's Creek Church.

Recommendations 17-18 were ADOPTED.

Jamey Dagenhart was presented to the Presbytery and spoke briefly of his faith journey.

The Moderator conducted the Service of Recognition for Mr. Dagenhart and instructed that his name be added to the roll of the Presbytery.

Special prayer for Mr. Dagenhart was offered by his father, J. Barry Dagenhart.

The Moderator requested that all candidates under care of the Presbytery stand and be recognized. The Chairman of the Commission reminded the Presbytery of the responsibility the Presbytery has toward its candidates.

There were no other matters of new business.

Guy H. Smith, Stated Clerk, announced the summer meeting to be held in the Bonclarken Chapel, Flat Rock, NC on Tuesday, June 9, 2009.

The Moderator called for announcements.

Following the singing of Bible Songs 280, "Christian Unity" Presbytery adjourned with the closing prayer and benediction given by James E. Mitchell.

It is also supported by Outreach North America, the Home Missions Agency of the ARP.

Mission Developer: Rev. Gary Harold Stiltner, Jr.

Gary is married to Elisabeth and they have four children: Anna Grace (5), Noah (2), Benjamin (1) and at Westminster PCA in Rock Hill. He received a BS in Molecular Biology in 2001 from Louisiana Tech University, and his Masters in Divinity from RTS Charlotte in 2005.



Target Group:

The residents of Indian Land, SC who are not presently attending any evangelical church comprise our *general* target group. Initially though young, middle-class families will be our primary target group.

What are they like? According to our demographic studies and personal experience there are many young families seeking to escape suburban sprawl, most have decent-paying jobs in white-collar and service industries, these dual-income couples have fashioned comfortable, child-centered lifestyles, their driveways filled with campers and powerboats, their family rooms with PlayStations and Game Boys. 
Why Indian Land, South Carolina?

According to US Census data there are about 32,000 residents in Indian Land. This number grew at a rate of ~ 60% from 1990 - 2000. There are currently more than 12 newly developed and developing residential communities, with many more on the way. It is one of the fastest growing areas in South Carolina, experiencing tremendous rates of residential and economic development.

Where is Indian Land, South Carolina?

"Indian Land" is the term used for the northernmost part of Lancaster County, SC. It is a narrow strip of land that is bordered to the North by Ballantyne (an upscale

community of Charlotte, NC), to the west by the state line of North Carolina and to the east by York County, SC. The area is about 3.7 miles wide at its widest, and approximately eighteen miles long. (Represented by the area circled on the map below)



Timeline:

A. Where are we at currently?

- * We have a growing prayer support base with about 200 subscribers to our email newsletter prayer updates.
- * We have a developing core group of about 12 people. Gary is leading two separate weekly Bible Studies in Indian Land. One is a small group that meets in his home, the other is in Sun City, where he serves on the Sun City Carolina Lakes Bible Club Leadership Team as its Life Coach. It is a community Bible Club with ~600 members. In addition, he meets regularly with a growing list of men in the community.
- * Our ministry teams are underway. We are excited that God has provided two key outreach leaders for us already - We have an experienced sports ministry team leader

Derek Durst, who is planning to launch an extensive children's & youth sports outreach ministry next year. We have an experienced mercy & care ministry team leader, Rick Mortenson, who is currently involved in prison ministry, and is praying for and planning out our mercy ministry for next year.

Establish a presence (church office) in Indian Land, strategic planning, support raising, and continued development of the core group that will help launch the new church; community outreach & evangelism; develop a common sense of our purpose and vision among the group and leaders and develop ministry teams.

September 13, 2009

Launch worship service, launch additional neighborhood based small groups, and ministry teams outreach events. Continue developing leadership team.
