PROCEEDINGS MISSISSIPPI VALLEY PRESBYTERY French Camp Presbyterian Church French Camp, Mississippi

Spring Stated Meeting March 5-6, 2012

The registration of delegates began at 4 pm. Following an evening meal at 6 p.m., the Spring 2012 Stated Meeting of Mississippi Valley Presbytery began at 7 p.m. with an opening worship service led by Rev. Alex Coblentz, pastor of the French Camp Presbyterian Church. The sermon was preached by Rev. Andy Putnam, the Moderator of General Synod. The worship service also included the celebration of the sacrament of the Lord's Supper, led by Rev. Coblentz, (see **Appendix A**).

Following the worship service and a brief recess, Rev. Andy Coburn, Moderator of Mississippi Valley Presbytery, called the meeting to order and opened with prayer.

Mr. Glen Barlow, an elder at the French Camp Presbyterian Church, welcomed the presbytery to the meeting.

The Principal Clerk confirmed a quorum was present.

Several first-time guests were introduced to the presbytery. After the introduction of guests, Mr. John Cockrell, a ruling elder at French Camp Presbyterian Church, presented the agenda (see **Appendix A**).

The Principal Clerk reported that Rev. Joey Donahue, Rev. Mike Garvey, Rev. Gary Clowers, and Wilmont Green (ruling elder at Wood Avenue) had submitted requests for excused absences from the meeting of presbytery.

The following procedural motions were read to the court by the Clerk and adopted without objection:

- That each minister or ruling elder delegate who has contacted the clerk requesting an excused absence from this meeting of presbytery be granted an excused absence.
- That each minister and ruling elder delegate who must leave this meeting of presbytery before adjournment and who submits a request for an excused absence from the remaining portion of the meeting of presbytery, be granted an excused absence.
- That ministers of other presbyteries of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church or other Christian denominations, who have been registered with the clerk for this

- meeting, may be seated as consultative members of the presbytery, in accordance with the FOG, Chapter XII.C.3.
- That clergy and/or laity who represent institutions or agencies related to the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church who have registered with the clerk for this meeting be invited to sit with the presbytery and be granted the privilege of the floor.

The minutes from the Summer and Fall 2011 meetings of presbytery were adopted.

There was no unfinished business.

Moderator Coburn gave the retiring moderator's address, reading from Ephesians 6:10-13, 19, and he spoke of the struggles of ministering in difficult contexts. He also challenged the presbytery to engage in spiritual warfare for the sake of the gospel.

Elder Larry Littlejohn was then introduced as the Moderator of Mississippi Valley Presbytery.

Moderator Littlejohn appointed a committee to examine the records of sessions: Rev. Bill Everett, Rev. Mike Yarman, Rev. David Storment, and the elders of the Gum Tree, Gospel of Grace, and Salem churches.

Rev. Bill Everett was appointed acting Reading Clerk for the spring meeting in the absence of Rev. Joey Donahue.

There being no further business for the evening, the meeting recessed until the following morning. Moderator Littlejohn closed with prayer.

Tuesday Morning, March 6, 2012

After a delicious breakfast served by the host church, Rev. Alex Coblentz led a morning devotion on Ephesians 3:14ff.

After a short break, Moderator Littlejohn reconvened the meeting and called on Rev. Meredith Cavin to open this portion of the meeting in prayer.

Mr. Lance Ragsdale, Director of French Camp Academy, spoke briefly about the ministry of the academy.

Under new business, a letter from the Covington ARP Church requesting an additional elder (Mr. Richard Moore) be appointed to the Covington session was read (see **Appendix B**). The request was approved by the presbytery.

A memorial from the Midlane Park Presbyterian Church was presented to the presbytery (see **Appendix C**). After several minutes of discussion, a motion was made to call for the question (seconded, passed). A motion to approve the memorial was made (seconded), and the memorial passed without any dissention.

A letter from Heber Springs Presbyterian Church was presented to the presbytery, along with an accompanying letter from Bishop Riola of the Communion of Anglican Churches (see **Appendix D**). After some parliamentary clarification from Moderator of Synod Andy Putnam, a motion was made to release Covenant to the Communion of Anglican Churches (seconded). Rev. T.J. Gentry also gave some background history of the Covenant church. A vote was taken and the motion passed.

The Treasurer's Report was presented to the presbytery and received as information, with grateful appreciation being expressed to the Treasurer for his diligent work (see **Appendix E**).

The Report of the Stewardship Committee was presented to the presbytery (see **Appendix F**). All four recommendations were taken up. The first item was approved without discussion. The second item was considered. A motion was made to appoint the Treasurer of MVP as the official signor. The third item was considered. Clarification was requested for this point and discussion took place, with the Stewardship chair providing explanation. The third recommendation passed. The fourth recommendation was then considered. A motion was made to amend the fourth recommendation to state the following: *That all churches make a better attempt to support the Presbytery financially and complete the required forms for both Presbytery and Synod*. The recommendation passed (as amended). The report was then adopted as a whole by the presbytery.

The report from the Minister and His Work Committee report was presented (see **Appendix G**). The three recommendations were considered individually. The first recommendation was considered. Mark Jones, a Student of Theology in First Presbytery, was presented to the presbytery. He spoke to the presbytery about his conversion and his sense of call to pastoral ministry. The recommendation was approved, and Mr. Jones was received as a Student of Theology of MVP. Moderator Littlejohn asked the questions from the Form of Government, which Mr. Jones answered in the affirmative. Mr. Littlejohn then led in prayer for Mr. Jones.

The second recommendation, to receive Rev. David Searfoss as a retired minister from the Central Kentucky Presbytery of the PC(USA), was considered. The recommendation was approved unanimously.

The third recommendation was considered. Chairman Charles Todd offered some explanation of the recommendation, and Rev. Dan Hazen also gave some explanation of his views on the law and his differences with the Westminster Standards, which included his rejection of the tripartite [i.e., three-fold] division of the law. At this point, Rev. Tim Phillips expressed concern with the statement in the report that Rev. Hazen's views were "within the bounds of the WCF" on the basis of his comments before the presbytery. There was much discussion. The order of the day was reached and discussion was suspended. Rev. David Storment was called upon to close this portion of the meeting in prayer.

Recess for Committee Meetings (10 a.m.)

The meeting of presbytery reconvened at 11:05 a.m. Rev. Howard Wheeler opened this portion of the meeting with prayer.

Discussion on the report from the Minister and His Work Committee resumed. A motion was made by Rev. Howard Wheeler to amend Recommendation Three of the report as follows: *That presbytery accept the views of Rev. Dan Hazen, noting his exceptions to the Westminster Standards regarding the law.* The amendment was seconded and passed after discussion. The recommendation as amended was then discussed. A vote was taken and the motion passed.

Chairman Todd amended the report to include a request by the Helena Presbyterian Church to approve Rev. Leslie Rhodes to remain as stated supply of the church. This amendment to the report was approved by the presbytery, and the report as a whole was adopted.

The Report of the Committee on Nominations was presented to the presbytery (see **Appendix H**). The recommendations were considered and the report was approved as a whole.

The Outreach North America Committee report was presented to the presbytery (see **Appendix I**). The report was received by the presbytery and adopted as recommended.

The report of the Committee on Sessional Records was presented to the presbytery (see **Appendix J**). It was adopted by the presbytery.

Rev. Andy Coburn addressed the presbytery and asked for clarification concerning the appointment of a provisional session for the Wood Avenue and Hickory Springs churches. Rev. Coburn indicated that he had statistical forms and other information from the Hickory Springs church. A motion was made by Rev. Alex Coblentz: *That the presbytery function as the next court of jurisdiction in acting on this information* (seconded, passed). A report was read and approved by the presbytery.

The Moderator instructed the Principal Clerk to write a letter of encouragement to the Hickory Springs and Wood Avenue churches, and to include the addresses of these churches in the minutes of presbytery so that others can send notes of encouragement to the two churches. The addresses for the churches are:

The Director of Camp of the Rising Son gave a presentation about the camp to the presbytery. Rev. Dan Hazen then presented the Christian Education Committee report to the presbytery (see **Appendix K**). The five recommendations were considered individually. Recommendation one was considered and passed. Recommendation two was then considered. As information, Rev.

John Tucker informed the presbytery that Graceview would not be able to host the leadership training event in the future. The recommendation was then approved by the presbytery. The third, fourth, and fifth recommendations were each considered and all passed. The report as a whole was adopted by the presbytery.

At the order of the day, Charles Covington was called upon by the Moderator to close this session of the meeting in prayer.

Order of the Day (Lunch - noon)

After a season of prayer, business reconvened. Elder Marshall Snodgrass made a motion from the floor: *That the Wood Avenue and Hickory Springs churches be placed under the oversight of the ONA Committee for the purpose of encouragement, revitalization, sessional oversight, and prayer.* The motion was seconded and after brief discussion, the motion passed.

It was noted that the fall 2012 meeting of Presbytery was scheduled to meet at the Brighton Presbyterian Church, with the Graceview Presbyterian Church hosting in the spring of 2013. The New Albany Presbyterian Church offered to host presbytery in the fall of 2013, and this request was approved by the presbytery.

Being no further business, a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes and to adjourn was made (seconded, passed). The meeting of presbytery closed with the singing of "Christian Unity" and a closing prayer and benediction by Rev. John Tucker.

Memorial on the Historicity of Adam

WHEREAS, the theory of evolution is a source of much debate and confusion in society, educational institutions, and churches today,

WHEREAS, the historicity of Adam has come under attack not only from secular groups and liberal churches, but also from professed evangelical individuals and institutions,

WHEREAS, the Old Testament Scriptures plainly teach that Adam and Eve, as the first man and woman, were the special creation of God, being made in His image (Gen. 1:27; 2:7, 22).

WHEREAS, the New Testament Scriptures confirm that Adam and Eve were real, historical human beings (e.g., Matt. 19:4-5; Luke 3:38; Rom. 5:12-14; 1 Cor. 15:45; 1 Tim. 2:13-14),

WHEREAS, the confessional standards of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church also affirm these truths about Adam and Eve (e.g., WCF 4:2, 7:2; WLC Q. 17; WSC Q. 10),

THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Session of Midlane Park Presbyterian Church request that Mississippi Valley Presbytery hereby memorialize the General Synod of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church to adopt the following affirmations and denials:

- We affirm that Adam and Eve were special, unique, direct creations of God, created in His image, with Adam being formed from the dust of the ground and Eve being made from his side; as such, they were real human beings and the first man and woman;
- We affirm that the account of creation as found in Genesis 1 and 2 is history;
- We deny any teaching that claims that the account of creation as found in Genesis 1 and 2 is mythology;
- 4) We deny any theory that teaches that Adam and Eve descended from other biological life forms and that such a theory can be reasonably reconciled with either the Standards of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church or Holy Scripture.

Treasurer's Report – Mississippi Valley Presbytery

March 5-6, 2012

Our total fund balances decreased by \$ 1,394 during the year ended December 31, 2011 from \$613,845 to \$612,451. Of this total the general funds increased by \$5,720 while Parkway Place Funds decreased by \$7,114. Interest of \$12,953 were earned during the year 2011 compared to \$17,056 for the year ended December 31, 2010.

Receipts for the general fund from nineteen (19) of our twenty six (26) member churches were \$11,331 in 2011 compared with receipts of \$12,449 for the year 2010. A listing of receipts by church is shown on the enclosed budget report.

During 2011 the Havana Mission was provided \$31,412 of financial support - \$12,000 from Synod, \$18,615 from Presbytery and \$797 from Ross Explorations – Oil and Gas receipts.

All Presbytery funds are deposited in three local banks – Renasant Bank, BNA Bank and Bancorpsouth, with ninety Six (96%) percent of the funds placed in interest bearing accounts - \$590,091 at year end 2011. The effective interest rate for the year was 2.38%; however, we will see a decrease in interest in 2012 since all CD's are to be renewed in 2012.

Thanks for giving me the opportunity to continue to serve as your treasurer.

MISSISSIPPI VALLEY PRESBYTERY STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE REPORT FOR THE MARCH 5-6, 2012 MEETING AT THE FRENCH CAMP ARP CHURCH

At the fall stated meeting, October 3-4, 2011, held at the Providence Reformed Presbyterian Church, the Stewardship Committee was instructed to draft an application form to be used by any church or group wishing to apply for a loan from the Parkway Place Memorial Funds – Part B. A copy of the Revolving Loan Fund Application used by Synod's Outreach North America was obtained. Using it an application form for Mississippi Valley Presbytery has been developed and is attached to this report for approval. Upon approval, it will be available from the Presbytery Clerk for any group wishing to make application. As approved at the October 2011 meeting the group is to submit the application to the Presbytery ONA Committee for their recommendation to the Stewardship Committee who will in turn present it to the Presbytery for consideration at their next regular spring or fall meeting.

Each church in the Presbytery is expected to participate in the work and ministry of the Presbytery. The rules of the Presbytery state that each church shall pay to the Presbytery the current fee for ordinary expenses of the Presbytery, based on the active membership reported in the minutes of Synod for the preceding year. That fee is currently \$10.00 per member. This past year seven (7) churches did not follow the rules of Presbytery. Receipts were down over a thousand dollars. It's easy to forget so we encourage ministers and elder delegates to go back and ask your treasurer has the fee been paid. If no then please send it — if not for the previous year then send the 2012 amount due. It takes all churches paying their share to operate the Presbytery.

Funding for the Havana Mission work will end with the July 2012 payment from Presbytery. Expenditures for this work will have exceeded \$175,000.00 with over \$83,000.00 coming from the Parkway Place Memorial Funds.

Because of some problems that occurred in another Presbytery, at the 2011 Synod meeting the Stewardship Committee made several suggestions concerning church finance including: (1) Make sure deacons (or a receiving treasurer) count the offerings and make deposits. (2) Make sure receipts are given for all cash payment. (Note: Cash payments should be strongly discouraged, always pay by check.) (3) Have more than one person review bank statements. Have the bank statement mailed directly to a member of the congregation who has no authorization on the account....and this person should make sure that the bank statement balance agrees with internal reports that are generated for the congregation. (The list of recommendations is found on page 160 of the Minutes of Synod for 2011.) A written report of receipts and expenditures should be given to the congregation monthly. No treasurer wants to be put in a position of someone suggesting that funds are missing and it's the responsibility of the session to protect them from this happening.

For your consideration the following recommendations are made:

- 1. That the Parkway Place Memorial Funds Part B Loan Application Form be approved.
- 2. That Presbytery designate the Presbytery officer who will sign the official Notice of Approval of a Parkway Place Memorial Funds Part B loan. (ex. Moderator, treasurer)
- 3. That any church or committee wishing to apply to the Presbytery for funds to help with a project or for assistance send their request to the Stewardship Chairperson by August 15th.
- 4. That all churches try to support the Presbytery financially and complete the required reports for both Presbytery and Synod.
