The committees recessed in order to conduct their business at 3:33 PM.

Friday Business Meeting

The Friday evening session was opened with prayer by the moderator at 8:30 P.M.

Motion: That the reading of the Minutes of the Fall Stated Meeting at Prosperity, TN, September 17-18, 2010, be waived and approved as electronically mailed. Carried.

The report of the stated clerk pertaining to the handling of the financial emergency at Hanmaum was made by R. S. Illman.

Motion: That the loan to the Hanmaum Mission be made a grant of \$1,400. Carried.

The stated clerk read the Memorial Tribute to Tony Conaway as submitted by the Session of the Prosperity, AL Church. The memorial was marked APPENDIX 2 and entered into the record by consent.

An oral report from the Muscle Shoals Property Commission was given by Charles Edgar. He reported that there is an offer on the property which is presently in negotiation.

The report of the Commission to Ordain & Install William Barnwell Heyward, Jr. was read, and on motion, was marked APPENDIX 3 and filed. Motion: That the work of the Commission be approved with thanksgiving and that the commission be dismissed. Carried. The right hand of fellowship was extended to Mr. Heyward by the presbyters.

The report of the Commission to Organize the Connections Mission & to Install R. S. Illman was read. Motion: That the work of the Commission be approved with thanksgiving and that the commission be dismissed. Carried. The report was marked APPENDIX 3 and file.

James Kidd made his remarks as the retiring moderator.

Motion: That all of the churches in the Presbytery encourage their members to read and study the Scriptures every day. Carried.

Charles Edgar was introduced as the incoming moderator and assumed the chair.

The program was presented by the clerk, and, on motion was approved as approved subject to necessary change, marked APPENDIX 5 and filed.

Bernard Sanderson was recognized as an elder from the Prosperity, AL Church and Robert Nelson as an elder from the Connections Church. It was noted that both are attending their first meeting.

Requests to be excused were read by the clerk on behalf of Garet Aldridge, Calvin Todd and Stephen Jordan. Motion: That Messrs. Aldridge, Todd and Jordan be excused from this meeting. Carried.

The Treasurer's Report was circulated among the members, and, on motion received as information, marked APPENDIX 6 and filed.

Fred Hartin reviewed the nominations process for Synod board and committee positions.

The meeting was recessed until the Saturday session with prayer and benediction by Roy Hulling.

Saturday Business Session

The meeting was called to order by Moderator Edgar at 8:35 A.M., with psalm and invocation.

Dr. David Norman, President of Erskine College, brought a devotional from Epistle to the Hebrews, after which he remarked about his work and the state of the college. He concluded with a period of question and answers.

The clerk reviewed the roll and affirmed that a quorum was present.

The report of the Minister and His Work Committee was presented by C.F. Edgar, and, on motion was received as information, marked APPENDIX 7 and filed.

Motion: That Rabun Williams and Roger Browning be approved as stated supplies at the Bethel - Camden - Prosperity AL charge and Cleveland Street respectively. Carried

Motion: That Messrs. Alridge, G. Gayle Cotton, Edgar and Jordan be certified for Synod. Carried.

The recess was called per order of the day at 9:55 A.M.

Recess out at 10:37 A.M.

The Presbytery report to Synod was presented by Charles Bradley, and, on motion was received as information, marked APPENDIX 8 and filed.

The report of the Committee on Stewardship was presented by Bernard Sanderson, and, on motion was received as information, marked APPENDIX 9 and filed.

The report of the Committee on Christian Education was presented by Gregory Duke, and, on motion was received as information, marked APPENDIX 10 and filed. It is noted that the report indicates that the committee has selected Mr. Duke as its chairman. (Further note: By virtue of his chairmanship he becomes the Presbytery's representative to the Synod Board of Christian Education Ministries.)

The report of the Committee on Outreach Tennessee was presented by Steve Webber, and, on motion was received as information, marked APPENDIX 11 and filed. It is noted that the report includes the planned establishment of the Riverside Chapel as a Mission of Presbytery, and the ordination of J. Gregory Duke, and his installation as Associate Pastor of the Connections Church, for the purpose of undertaking the development of the Riverside Mission.

The report of the Nominations Committee was presented by Fred Hartin, and, on motion was received as information, marked APPENDIX 12 and filed.

The report of the Committee on Resolutions was approved and will be read during the noon meal.

Motion: That Presbytery commend Jim Kidd for his dedicated service to the Presbytery as moderator. Carried.

Motion: That Presbytery commend Charles Bradley for his dedicated service to the Presbytery as stated clerk. Carried

Motion: By Mr. Hartin, to elect Charles Dana Crowel to serve as vice-moderator of Presbytery

The clerk will reported that a Presbytery directory is being planned as a ready source for contact information.

Motion: That Presbytery receive the invitation to host the Fall 2012 Stated Meeting extended by the Connections Church.

The chair announced the future meetings of Presbytery:

The Adjourned Meeting at Bonclarken, June 8, 2011, after the conclusion of Synod business, Founder's Hall Conference Room.

Report to Tennessee Alabama Presbytery

Consent Proceedings Regarding Financial Emergency at Hanmaum
December 18, 2010

Abstract:

On December 16, 2010 the Presbytery loaned the Hanmaum Mission \$1,500 to cover the cost of chairs incurred because of the bankruptcy of a vendor. The question of the final disposition of the loan to be taken up by the Presbytery at the Spring Stated Meeting

Background:

Bob Illman of the Connections Church circulated a letter explaining the financial predicament to the churches of the Presbytery on December 13, 2010 by electronic mail. (Appendix 1)

Charles Edgar made the proposal the following day that Presbytery loan the Hanmaum Mission \$1,500 until the Spring Stated Meeting 2011, when the disposition of the loan would be considered by the Presbytery. He indicated that he plans to make a motion at the Spring Stated Meeting that Presbytery give the money to the Mission. (Appendix 2)

We agreed to see if this could be done by consensus in order to avoid the costs associated with a calling a meeting. I forwarded his proposal by electronic mail to all of the elders for whom I have addresses, and waited 48 hours for responses.

Ruling Elders responding in favor:

Charles Mangum, Fred Hartin, Eugene Reneger, Steve Weber, Max Baggett Jr., Kevin Doty.

Ministers responding in favor:

Aldrige, Crowell, Edgar, Bradley, Heyward.

Abstentions:

Minister Bob Illman, and Ruling Elder Tom Neve. (The question under consideration materially affects the Connections Church)

There was neither dissent nor opposition from anyone, either to the proceedings or to what was proposed. Had there been any concerns raised, I would have asked the members to request a called meeting by telephone conference, and then forwarded the requests to the Moderator.

Subsequently, I reported consensus to the Treasurer on December 15, and asked him to disperse the funds to the Hanmaum Mission. Mr. Ligon agreed to do this on December 16.

Please be advised that this report will be presented to Presbytery at the Spring Stated Meeting 2011 under Old Business and the disposition of the loan will appear at that time on the docket.

Bob Illman's Communication

December 13, 2010

Dear Sister Churches:

As many of you may remember, we became an organized church on Sunday, December 5th. It was a glorious occasion, and in addition to the commission and their wives, our Moderator attended our celebration.

I am writing you to tell you that while we are well, and enjoying our new facilities, we had a problem come up recently that has us in a financial bind. As you know, we assist Hanmaum ARP in their weekly business affairs. In September, they planned an anniversary celebration for the 19th. In preparation, they ordered new chairs from Church Chair company in Rome, GA. When the chairs didn't come as promised, I stepped in and got Church Chair to agree to return the \$1500 deposit that Hanmaum had given them. In order for the celebration to proceed, we (Connections) ordered chairs for Hanmaum from another company. We put the order on our credit card, expecting to replace \$1500 of the money advanced when the refund came from Church Chairs.

To make a long story short, after Church Chairs lied to us about the check being in the mail, they went into bankruptcy, leaving us to pay the credit card bill without any refund to cover it. While God has been faithful to us in monthly finances and giving, we have no nest egg to cover the \$1500 loss, and neither does Hanmaum.

You all were extremely generous to us during our mission time, and I thank you for that. If this was not such a serious problem, I would not ask for your help, but it is. If your church is able, would you consider a small donation to help us deal with this concern?

The Commission, consisting of Rev. P.J. McClung, Rev. Dana Crowell, Rev. Charles Edgar, Rev. Robert Illman, RE Thomas Neve and RE Matthew Ligon, convened on November 17, 2010, at 7:00 PM, at Connections Presbyterian Church, 897 Capshaw Road, Madison Alabama. After opening with prayer by Mr. Crowell, Mr. Illman was appointed the clerk of the commission.

Mr. Edgar welcomed those present in the name of the Presbytery, and gave an overview of the prior actions wherein Mr. Heyward was taken under care and licensed, and wherein, at the Fall meeting of the Tennessee-Alabama Presbytery, Mr. Heyward was approved for ordination.

and Ordain and Install Mr. Rob Nelson as Ruling Elder

The Commission convened on December 5, 2010, 10:45 AM, at Connections Presbyterian Church, 897 Capshaw Road, Madison Alabama. Members present were Rev. Charles Bradley, the convenor, Rev. Charles Edgar, RE Kevin Doty, RE Jim Patterson and RE Steven Weber. After opening with prayer by Mr. Bradley, Mr. Patterson was appointed the clerk of the commission. Rev. Soo Kim was absent, and excused until later due to his required attendance at his own worship service. Mr. Edgar was granted permission to leave after the lunch for a prior afternoon engagement. The commission approved the order of the day, to include a morning service of organization, lunch, followed by an afternoon service of Installation and Ordination.

During the worship service, Mr. Edgar welcomed those present in the name of the Presbytery, and gave an overview of the prior actions wherein The Presbytery had found the Petition for Organization submitted by the membership of Connections Mission to be in order.

Mr. Bradley preached a sermon from Acts, chapter 2.

Mr. Edgar proceeded to the Formation of the Roll and then asked the Congregation the Question of Covenant, to which he received an affirmative answer. Mr. Edgar then declared Connections Presbyterian Church to be constituted as a congregation of the Associate Reformed Presbyterian Church.

After the singing of the Doxology, Mr. Bradley pronounced the Benediction, and all proceeded to enjoy a delicious lunch provided by the women of Connections Presbyterian Church. During lunch Mr. Edgar was excused and Rev. Soo Kim arrived to join in the work of the Commission

After lunch the Commission was recalled to order, and Mr. Kim welcomed those in attendance on behalf of the Presbytery. After the opening hymn, Mr. Bradley presided over the installation and ordination of Ruling Elders, informing the congregation of the results of the election for Elder held on Nov. 20th. He called the Elder candidates, Mr. Ligon, Mr. Neve and Mr. Nelson forward.

Mr. Doty asked the seven Constitutional Questions to Mr. Nelson, and questions five through seven to Mr. Ligon and Mr. Neve, who had previously been ordained as Ruling Elders. All answered in the affirmative.



It was M/S/P that the Presbytery establish Riverside Chapel as a Mission of the Presbytery on April 9th of this year, with Greg Duke as the Mission Developer. (He will be ordained on the same date.) . This is a good example of a church planting internship, funded by ONA, which is reaping benefits. This ordination/designation will coincide with Riverside moving into a new, storefront property of over 4500 sq. feet. It is anticipated that a large gathering from our Presbytery will be present for this happy event.

Connections Church was established as a particular church on December 5th 2010. The service establishing the church, and installing the Mission Developer, Bob Illman, as pastor was attended by many in the Presbytery and was a great occasion.

Hanmaum Church continues to develop in Madison. Bob Illman from Connections continues to meet weekly with the Mission Developer, Soo Kim. Since the start of ONA support in January (2011), Mr. Kim has been able to devote more time to outreach and congregational development. Hanmaum suffered the loss of \$1,500 when the Church Chair company went into bankruptcy after taking their deposit and falsely assuring them that they would receive goods or a refund. The Presbytery has assisted in this loss, but is saddened that the only company left in America making chairs decided to end business in such a deceptive fashion.

We are especially grateful for the interest in church planting that has developed within our Presbytery. At present, the Presbytery supports Riverside and Hanmaum at the rate of \$600 each per month. Upon the liquidation of the Muscle Shoals (Cornerstone) assets, it is anticipated that a proposal will be forthcoming to use of some of these assets for church planting in the future.

The potential exists for a new Korean mission in the Montgomery area. Mr. Greg Duke of our Prattville mission, Riverside Church, is contact for potential work.

Mr. Kim, of the Hanmaum church, is also talking with a Korean pastor in Tuscaloosa about the possibility of ARP affiliation.
